BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear vour confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Sunday, August 17, 2025 - Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time The Fire Jesus Brings

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing" (Luke 12:49)

This is not the gentle glow of a campfire. Jesus speaks of a flame that purifies, reveals, and transforms and yes, sometimes divides. His words unsettle us because they remind us that following Him is not about keeping everyone comfortable.

Jeremiah discovered that truth telling can land you in a muddy cistern. Hebrews urges us to keep running with our eyes fixed on Jesus, even when the crowd is against us. Sometimes love demands speaking a truth others would rather avoid.

Jesus' fire is not for destruction but for refining. It burns away what keeps us from Him. And if you have ever cleaned out a closet, you know letting go of what is useless can be messy. His fire makes us more alive, not less, but it requires the courage to stand in its heat.

Prayer: Lord, light a fire in me that warms the cold, illumines the lost, and burns away whatever keeps me from loving You fully. Amen.

Monday, August 18, 2025

When God Asks for Everything

"If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor" (Matthew 19:21)

The rich young man longed for eternal life until he heard the cost. We understand. It is hard to release control over what makes us feel secure. We prefer discipleship that fits neatly into our comfort zones.

Yet Jesus was not trying to impoverish him. He was inviting him into treasure no thief can steal and no moth can destroy. The tragedy is not that he possessed much, but that his possessions possessed him. He could keep the commandments, but could he keep his hands open.

Sometimes Jesus asks us to release what grips us too tightly, possessions, resentments, habits, or the need to be right. In return, He offers Himself, the one treasure that never loses its worth.

Prayer: Jesus, when You point out what I am holding too tightly, give me the courage to loosen my grip. Replace my "what if I lose this" with "what will I gain in You" Amen. Judges 2:11–19; Psalm 106; Matthew 19:16–22

Tuesday, August 19, 2025 God's "You Have Got This"

"Go with the strength you have. It is I who send you" (Judges 6:14) Gideon was not lining up for "Hero of Israel." He was hiding from enemies, certain his résumé screamed "least likely to succeed." Yet God called him "champion" before he did a single thing. God's confidence in him exceeded his confidence in himself.

God does the same with us. He sees what we can become with His strength long before we believe it. His call does not hinge on our skill set but on His presence. Where the world sees weakness, He sees the perfect canvas for His power.

So when God nudges you toward something daunting, whether leading, forgiving, or starting again, remember His call is not for flawless courage but for trust. Feeling underqualified only means there is more space for His strength to shine.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for calling me not because I am ready, but because You are with me. Help me step out in Your strength, not my self confidence. Amen. Judges 6:11–24a; Psalm 85; Matthew 19:23–30

Wednesday, August 20, 2025

When Generosity Messes with Your Math

"Are you envious because I am generous" (Matthew 20:15)

The vineyard workers who sweated all day grumbled when the latecomers earned the same pay. We might have too, until we remember the landowner is God and we are all latecomers in one way or another.

Saint Bernard taught that love seeks no payment, only the joy of the beloved. In God's Kingdom, grace is not earned. It is given. Another's blessing is never our loss,

and our labor was never about competing for His attention. His generosity is not sliced thinner as it spreads, it multiplies.

The miracle is that His mercy never runs dry, His love never thins, and His welcome is equally warm for those who arrived at dawn and those who stumbled in just before sunset.

Prayer: Generous Lord, when I am tempted to compare my blessings to others, remind me that grace is not a paycheck. Teach me to celebrate Your kindness wherever it lands. Amen.

Thursday, August 21, 2025 **God's Invitation List**

"Everything is ready. Come to the feast" (Matthew 22:4)

The king in Jesus' parable invited guests to a wedding banquet, but many were too busy or too indifferent to come. So he opened the doors to anyone willing to show up. Some came with joy. One came without the wedding garment, and the king noticed. God's invitation is free, but it is never casual.

Saint Pius X widened the Church's welcome by encouraging frequent Communion and bringing children early to the feast. The goal is not merely to be invited, but to arrive clothed in humility, gratitude, and love.

God's table is still set. The tragedy is not lacking a seat but refusing it, and sadder still is sitting at His table as if it were ordinary, forgetting that every Mass is a royal banquet where the King Himself serves the Bread of Life.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for inviting me to Your table. Help me come with a ready heart and the humility to rejoice that You have welcomed others too. Amen. Judges 11:29-39a; Psalm 40; Matthew 22:1-14

Friday, August 22, 2025

Loyalty That Stays

"Wherever you go, I will go. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God" (Ruth 1:16)

Ruth had every reason to leave. Her husband was gone, her future unclear, and her mother in law's prospects bleak. Yet love held her fast. She chose relationship over comfort, faithfulness over convenience, and the living God over familiar idols.

This kind of loyalty is rare. It is not about convenience but covenant. God notices such love and weaves it into His designs in ways unseen. Ruth's choice placed her in the very line of Christ, though she could not have known it then.

In a world quick to walk away, Ruth's witness tells us the richest blessings often grow in the soil of steadfast love. Staying may not make headlines, but heaven records it as faithfulness that changes history.

Prayer: Faithful God, help me be the kind of friend, family member, and disciple who stays not out of obligation, but out of love. Amen.

Faith that Feeds the Future

"Blessed is the Lord who has not failed to provide you today with an heir" (Ruth

Ruth's steadfastness and Boaz's kindness brought the birth of Obed, grandfather of King David. A love story became a redemption story, and a redemption story became part of salvation's unfolding. An ordinary act of compassion took its place in the genealogy of Christ.

Our small daily acts, protecting the vulnerable, honoring God in our work, showing kindness, often nourish a future we will never see. Naomi believed her life was closing in bitterness, yet God was quietly opening a chapter of joy.

That is the beauty of His timing. We may not see the harvest in this life, but eternity will show how far a single seed of love can travel, and how it can ripple through generations to shape His story.

Prayer: Lord, help me trust that even my small acts of faith can plant seeds for generations to come. Amen.

How to Stay Sane When the World Feels Divided

Jeremiah 38:4–6, 8–10 | Psalm 40 | Hebrews 12:1–4 | Luke 12:49–53

There is a strange comfort in discovering that division is not a new problem. In Jeremiah's time, it was bad enough that speaking the truth could get you literally thrown into a muddy cistern; no Yelp review, no appeal process, just a quick drop into the darkness because people did not like your message. In the Gospel, Jesus openly says, "Do you think I came to bring peace? No, I tell you, but division." Suddenly you realize that the tension we feel in today's world has a long history.

It is no secret that our current cultural climate can feel like a twenty four seven group chat in which no one agrees on anything. Family gatherings can resemble miniature parliaments with the same amount of shouting but none of the decorum. Social media only turns up the heat: you cannot post a picture of a sandwich without it becoming a political manifesto. Within minutes someone will be debating food ethics, environmental impact, the cultural appropriation of rye bread, and whether your lettuce was farmed by people with the correct worldview.

So how do we, as followers of Christ, keep our heads clear and our hearts steady in a world so quick to divide? The readings for this Sunday offer a three step survival guide.

1. Keep the Right Focus

Hebrews tells us to "persevere in running the race... keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus." The problem is that we live in a distraction economy. Everyone is trying to get our attention and convince us to agree with them: advertisers, politicians, influencers, and that one person who insists on forwarding chain emails from 2008.

If you focus on every headline, every outrage, every opinion, you will be mentally and spiritually exhausted by lunch. But if you focus on Christ, you will start to see the noise for what it is: noise. That does not mean ignoring injustice or pretending division does not exist. It means remembering that your hope does not rise and fall with the news cycle.

2. Expect Pushback

Jeremiah spoke truth and ended up waist deep in mud. Jesus spoke truth and ended up on a cross. If you follow Christ with sincerity and are equally grieved by abortion and by children starving in Gaza, by the protection of religious liberty and by the mistreatment of migrants, you will quickly discover that someone will not like it (and yes, I have the emails to prove it). In every age, truth that refuses to be divided along political lines often makes enemies on both sides.

This is important to remember in our age of "likes" and "shares." Faithfulness is not a popularity contest. Sometimes the people closest to you will be the most uncomfortable with your convictions. That does not mean you should be obnoxious about your beliefs, but it does mean you should not be surprised when choosing God's way causes tension.

As Jesus reminds us, the fire He came to bring is not the warm glow of a scented candle. It is the fire of the Holy Spirit, which purifies, transforms, and sometimes disrupts.

3. Let Love Shape the Fight

The Psalmist says, "I waited, I waited for the Lord... He put a new song in my mouth." In a polarized world, the easiest path is to match anger with anger, sarcasm with sarcasm. But that only deepens the division.

Love does not mean weakness. Love is what allows you to disagree without dehumanizing. It is what keeps you from falling into the very same bitterness you see in others. Think of it like seasoning: without love, the truth becomes so sharp and acidic that no one can swallow it. With love, the same truth can actually nourish.

Staying Grounded in a Divided World

The call of the Christian is not to eliminate every difference of opinion but to remain faithful, steady, and charitable no matter the climate. It means listening carefully, speaking wisely, and not losing sight of the fact that every single person, yes, even the one arguing with you on Facebook, is made in the image of God.

We cannot control every voice in the public square, but we can control our own tone, our own witness, our own decision to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus rather than on the chaos of the moment.

Because in the end, the goal is not to "win" every argument. The goal is to finish the race with love still intact, to arrive at the finish line having run not with clenched fists, but with an open heart.

That is how you stay sane when the world feels divided.








Are You Considering Joining the Catholic Church?

You are still the Master of land and sea.


We live in the shadow of a danger over which we have no control; the Gulf, like a provoked


