BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear vour confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Sunday, August 24-Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time The Narrow Gate

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate" (Luke 13:24)

Jesus does not promise wide, well-paved highways into heaven. Instead, He talks about a narrow gate that requires effort, humility, and trust. It is not a ticket line where we can wave our church attendance card and slide right in. It is a relationship, one where He must know us.

We like shortcuts. GPS routes, quick recipes, even "five easy steps" to happiness. But discipleship is not a shortcut. It is a daily choice to walk with Jesus, even when the road feels uphill. Isaiah assures us that God gathers people from every nation. Hebrews reminds us discipline bears fruit. And Jesus tells us the Kingdom is worth every effort, even when the door seems narrow.

The good news is the gate is not narrow to keep people out but to teach us to lay aside what will not fit through: pride, selfishness, grudges, baggage we thought we needed. Travel light, He says, and you will make it home.

Prayer: Lord, help me not to be discouraged by the narrowness of the gate. Teach me to travel light, with faith, love, and hope as my only baggage. Amen. Isaiah 66:18–21; Psalm 117; Hebrews 12:5–7, 11–13; Luke 13:22–30

Monday, August 25

When Faith Gets Practical

"Our Gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power" (1 Thessalonians 1:5)

The Thessalonians impressed Paul not by their slogans but by their transformed lives. Faith had seeped into their choices, their endurance, their way of loving each other. It was not theory. It was testimony on legs.

Jesus, on the other hand, calls out the Pharisees for turning religion into a performance. They locked the Kingdom door with rules while ignoring the very people those rules were meant to serve. Hypocrisy is always easier to spot in others than in ourselves, which is why it stings when we recognize it in the mirror.

Faith, when lived, is practical. It looks like patience with difficult people, kindness in traffic, honesty when no one is watching. It does not just sound holy; it quietly shines.

Prayer: Lord, save me from a faith that is all words and no power. Make my life itself a reflection of the Gospel. Amen.

1 Thessalonians 1:1–5, 8b–10; Psalm 149; Matthew 23:13–22

Tuesday, August 26

Cleaning the Inside First

"Cleanse first the inside of the cup" (Matthew 23:26)

Jesus' image is striking. The Pharisees scrubbed the outside of the cup until it gleamed, but the inside remained a mess. We might chuckle, but we know the feeling. How many times do we look put-together on the outside while anxiety, bitterness, or pride brews inside?

Paul reminds the Thessalonians that he did not use flattery or greed but shared the Gospel with sincerity, like a nursing mother caring for her children. His inside matched his outside. That kind of integrity is rare and refreshing.

When God calls us to "cleanse the inside," it is not about shame. It is about freedom. He is not interested in spotless dishes stacked on a shelf; He wants vessels ready to carry His love into the world.

Prayer: Jesus, shine Your light inside me. Cleanse what is hidden so my heart and my actions speak the same truth. Amen.

1 Thessalonians 2:1–8; Psalm 139; Matthew 23:23–26

Wednesday, August 27

Hidden Bones

"You are like whitewashed tombs" (Matthew 23:27)

It is one of Jesus' sharpest images. The Pharisees looked spotless outside but carried decay inside. Before we shake our heads at them, we might admit that we too know how to put on a "holy face" even when our hearts are elsewhere.

Paul, however, recalls working day and night so he would not burden anyone. His integrity was not painted on; it was lived. And today we honor Saint Monica, who prayed for her wayward son Augustine for decades. She did not rely on appearances. She went straight to God with her tears, and those prayers shaped one of the greatest saints in history.

The lesson is simple: honesty before God matters more than polish before people. Better to bring our mess to the Lord than to bury it beneath a painted surface.

Prayer: Lord, keep me from polishing the outside while neglecting the inside. Teach me the humility of Saint Monica, who trusted You to do what she could not. Amen. 1 Thessalonians 2:9–13; Psalm 139; Matthew 23:27–32

Thursday, August 28

Stay Awake

"Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come" (Matthew 24:42)

We all know the groggy feeling of staying up too late and then trying to function the next day. Jesus warns us not to sleepwalk through faith. Complacency is as dangerous to the soul as drowsiness is on the highway. Paul prays that the Thessalonians abound in love so their hearts may be strong and blameless. That is how to "stay awake." It is not about paranoia but about readiness. Augustine, whose feast we celebrate today, once prayed, "Lord, make me chaste—but not yet." He eventually learned that holiness delayed is often holiness denied.

The point is not to live in fear of the Lord's arrival but to live so in love with Him that His coming is not an interruption but the fulfillment of our deepest hope.

Prayer: Lord, wake me up where I have grown drowsy in faith. Keep me ready, not by fear, but by love. Amen. 1 Thessalonians 3:7–13; Psalm 90; Matthew 24:42–51

Friday, August 29

A Costly Yes

"Herod feared John, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man" (Mark 6:20)

John the Baptist had a way of saying things no one wanted to hear. He told Herod the truth about his marriage, and it cost him his head. Sometimes the price of faithfulness is high.

Paul reminds us that God calls us to holiness, not impurity. Holiness may sound lofty, but at its core it is about belonging wholly to God. John belonged so wholly to God that no fear or flattery could sway him.

Our culture may not put prophets in prison, but it still pressures us to silence our convictions.

The witness of John reminds us that truth may be costly, but compromise is costlier. Better to lose your head than to lose your soul.

Prayer: Lord, give me the courage to speak Your truth with love, even when it costs me. May I live so fully for You that no compromise feels worth the trade. Amen. 1 Thessalonians 4:1–8; Psalm 97; Mark 6:17–29

Saturday, August 30

Bury or Multiply

"Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more" (Matthew 25:20)

The parable of the talents makes us squirm a little. We might sympathize with the servant who buried his coin—at least he did not lose it! But the master calls him lazy, not cautious. God did not give us gifts to bury them but to invest them in love.

Paul urges the Thessalonians to live tranquil lives, to work with their hands, and to love one another. Sometimes we overcomplicate "using our talents." It does not always mean grand achievements. It can be as simple as putting love into ordinary work, turning daily labor into prayer.

The tragedy is not starting small. The tragedy is never starting. God is not asking for perfection, only faithfulness. Even a little courage can double the gift.

Prayer: Lord, help me resist the urge to bury what You have given. Teach me to risk love and trust You with the return. Amen.

1 Thessalonians 4:9–11; Psalm 98; Matthew 25:14–30

Travel Light. Enter Freely By Father Jack

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 66:18–21 | Psalm 117 | Hebrews 12:5–7, 11–13 | Luke 13:22–30

Airline baggage fees have taught us all one thing: it is expensive to carry too much. Stand by the check in counter at any airport and you will see the drama unfold: people unzipping overstuffed suitcases, shifting shoes into backpacks, wearing three jackets at once to avoid the extra charge. The message is clear: travel light if you want to move forward.

Jesus must have known this when He described the Kingdom of God as a "narrow door." It is not wide enough for everything we insist on dragging with us. Pride does not fit. Resentment does not fit. The oversized carry on of self importance does not fit. God's invitation, as Isaiah tells us, is global and generous: *all nations* are summoned to the banquet. But when it comes to actually entering, the doorway is not accommodating of our baggage. Heaven does not charge fees; it simply requires us to let go.

When the Door Feels Too Narrow

At first, this teaching feels discouraging. Why would God make the way so tight, so difficult? Shouldn't heaven be a wide open gate? But think of it this way: the door is narrow not because God enjoys watching us squirm, but because heaven is about communion, and communion requires transformation.

Imagine a family reunion where everyone brings their grudges, their old arguments, their "I never liked Aunt Martha anyway" attitudes. That would not be a feast of joy, it would be a battlefield with potato salad. God does not allow that into His banquet. He insists on a doorway that forces us to leave behind what poisons community.

Hebrews and the Spiritual Fitness Plan

Hebrews 12 gives us the training program for this journey. God's discipline, it says, is painful in the moment but fruitful in the long run, producing "the peaceful fruit of righteousness." In other words, the Father loves us enough to make us strong travelers.

It is like spiritual weight loss training. None of us enjoy the workout, pruning habits, enduring setbacks, facing our flaws, but every rep sheds another ounce of pride, another pound of selfishness. Slowly, the soul slims down, not for vanity's sake, but to fit through the narrow door. God is not the customs officer searching our bags for contraband. He is the coach urging us to travel light, so when we reach the threshold, we can walk in free.

Surprises at the Door

Jesus adds a twist: some who assumed they had front row tickets will find themselves outside, while others from east and west, north and south, will stream in. That is a warning to those who think mere proximity, hearing sermons, attending services, belonging to the right group, is enough. Faith is not about standing in the right line. It is about living in relationship with Christ, allowing Him to trim, shape, and lighten us for the journey.

And here is the delightful part: heaven's banquet will surprise us. The guest list will be more diverse than we imagined. That quiet neighbor, the stranger we overlooked, the person who seemed last in line may be reclining at the table before us. God's welcome is wide, but the doorway reminds us not to swagger in, stuffed with self assurance.

Practicing Luggage Checks Now

So what can we do while we are still on this side of the journey? Practice daily "luggage checks." Ask:

1. Am I carrying resentment that does not belong?

2. Am I dragging self pity or arrogance that slows me down?

3. Am I trying to squeeze in luxuries of comfort and distraction that keep me from real prayer?


Unpack them now. Travel lighter today than you did yesterday. It is far less stressful to sort baggage in the quiet of prayer than in the commotion of eternity's check in line.

The Great Surprise of Traveling Light

Isaiah envisions people of every nation gathered in joy. The psalm echoes: "Praise the Lord, all you nations!" The welcome is expansive, the table endless. Yet Luke's Gospel reminds us the doorway into that celebration is narrow. We cannot muscle our way in, nor can we bring along the heavy bags of pride and sin.

The great surprise is that the lighter we travel, the freer and happier we become. The very things we thought we could not live without turn out to be the weights that exhausted us. The narrow door is not punishment; it is mercy. It ensures that only what is good, true, and loving passes through.

So yes, heaven's door may be narrow, but if we let God help us unpack along the way, we will discover the joy of walking through unburdened, our arms free to embrace the feast that awaits. And this time, no one will charge us extra for excess baggage, because there simply will not be any left to carry.
