BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

CONFIRMATION

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

EUCARIST

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the Sacristan.

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear your confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Daily Reflections

Sunday, January 11 - The Baptism of the Lord

ENTERING THE WATER WITHOUT EXCUSES

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:17)

Jesus steps into the Jordan with no sins to confess and no reputation to protect. He does not stand on the shore explaining himself. He enters the water with everyone else. That alone tells us something essential about God. Holiness is not allergic to humility. Love does not hover above real life.

John the Baptist is understandably confused. He wants Jesus to skip the line. Most of us would too. We like spiritual shortcuts, especially when we think we have earned them. But Jesus insists. God meets us not by avoiding our human condition, but by entering it fully.

When Jesus rises from the water, the heavens open and the Father speaks delight, not disappointment. Notice the order. The affirmation comes before any public ministry, before miracles, before sermons. God's pleasure is not performance based. It is rooted in relationship. That is good news for anyone who woke up today already tired.

Prayer: Father, help me remember that I am your beloved before I am productive. Teach me to live from that truth. Amen.

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Psalm 29; Acts 10:34-38; Matthew 3:13-17

Monday, January 12 - LISTENING WHILE LIFE IS LOUD

"The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel." (Mark 1:15)

Hannah's pain is public and private at the same time. Everyone sees her tears, but no one quite understands them. Even her loving husband offers comfort that misses the point. His question is sincere but misguided. Sometimes love speaks too quickly when silence would be kinder.

Jesus walks along the sea and calls fishermen in the middle of their workday. No long explanations. No detailed plan. Just an invitation that interrupts routine. The Kingdom often arrives like that, not when life is settled, but when nets are still wet and schedules still full.

Repentance here is not about guilt. It is about attention. Turn your face. Adjust your direction. Believe that something new is possible even if yesterday was heavy. God does not wait for perfect conditions. He speaks into ordinary noise and expects us to listen.

Prayer: Lord, slow my heart enough to hear your call today. Help me trust your timing even when my questions remain unanswered. Amen.

1 Samuel 1:1-8; Psalm 116; Mark 1:14-20

Tuesday, January 13 - WHEN PRAYER LOOKS MISUNDERSTOOD

"My heart exults in the Lord, my Savior." (1 Samuel 2:1)

Hannah prays so honestly that it looks suspicious. Her lips move. Her voice does not. Even the priest mistakes her grief for something shameful. Anyone who has ever felt misjudged while doing their best will recognize this moment. Vulnerability is often misread by those uncomfortable with it.

Jesus teaches with authority that does not shout. His words unsettle what is unclean and false, and the reaction is dramatic. Healing is rarely quiet for the thing being healed. Freedom can feel disruptive before it feels peaceful, especially when truth is finally spoken aloud.

God listens beyond appearances. He hears prayers that sound clumsy and sermons that sound bold. The difference is not volume but truth. When we bring our real selves before God, something shifts, even if others do not notice right away.

Prayer: God who listens deeply, help me pray honestly without fear of misunderstanding. Heal what needs to be freed in me. Amen.

1 Samuel 1:9-20; 1 Samuel 2; Mark 1:21-28

Wednesday, January 14 - LEARNING TO SAY HERE I AM

"Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." (1 Samuel 3:10)

Samuel hears God calling and assumes it must be someone else. That instinct has not changed much. We often think God's voice belongs to people with better schedules, clearer lives, or fewer doubts. It rarely occurs to us that God might be calling us now.

Jesus heals, teaches, serves, and then disappears to pray. The disciples panic slightly. Everyone is looking for you, they say, which sounds flattering but is also a trap. Popularity is not the same as purpose. Even Jesus refuses to let urgency replace prayer.

Listening takes practice. It often takes repetition. God is patient enough to keep calling until we learn the difference between noise and invitation. The first faithful response is rarely impressive. It is simply honest.

Prayer: Lord, teach me to listen without rushing ahead. Help me answer you with a willing heart, even when I am unsure. Amen.

1 Samuel 3:1-10, 19-20; Psalm 40; Mark 1:29-39

Thursday, January 15 - WHEN FAITH BECOMES A LUCKY CHARM

"Redeem us, Lord, because of your mercy." (Psalm 44)

Israel brings the ark into battle like a guaranteed solution. The noise is loud. The confidence is high. The outcome is devastating. Faith treated as a tool instead of a relationship eventually disappoints. God refuses to be managed or manipulated.

A leper approaches Jesus with nothing but honesty. No bargaining. No entitlement. Just trust. Jesus touches him, crossing boundaries others carefully avoid. Compassion always looks reckless to those who prefer control and safe distances.

The difference is simple and difficult. God is not an object we carry into our plans. He is a presence who asks us to carry mercy into the world. Faith matures when it stops demanding results and starts offering trust.

Prayer: Lord, free me from using faith to feel secure. Teach me to trust you enough to let you lead. Amen.

1 Samuel 4:1-11; Psalm 44; Mark 1:40-45

Friday, January 16 - THE KING WE THINK WE WANT

"For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord." (Psalm 89)

Israel asks for a king because everyone else has one. Samuel listens, warns, and explains the cost in careful detail. Power will take more than it gives. Authority will slowly become ownership. The people listen politely and then move on. The desire to fit in, to look strong, to feel protected by something visible has a long biblical history and a very modern feel.

Jesus responds to the paralytic in a way no one expects. Before healing his body, he forgives his sins. This unsettles the experts because it rearranges priorities. We prefer visible fixes and measurable results. God prefers freedom that reaches deeper than appearances. Carrying a mat is impressive. Being forgiven changes how a person walks through the world.

Every day we choose what kind of authority we trust. The loud promise of control that demands loyalty, or the quiet authority of grace that restores dignity. One keeps taking. The other heals and then lets us go. The choice is rarely dramatic, but it is always decisive.

Prayer: Lord, guard my heart from mistaking power for wisdom. Teach me to trust your goodness even when it looks different than I expected. Amen.

1 Samuel 8:4-7, 10-22a; Psalm 89; Mark 2:1-12

Saturday, January 17 - Memorial of Saint Anthony, Abbot

CALLED WHILE LOOKING FOR SOMETHING ELSE

"I did not come to call the righteous but sinners." (Mark 2:17)

Saul sets out on a simple errand, searching for lost animals, assuming the day will end the way it began. Instead, he stumbles into a calling he did not seek and was not prepared for. God often works through detours. We go looking for solutions and discover that we are the ones being summoned.

Levi is sitting at his post, doing what he always does, when Jesus passes by and says two words that change everything. Follow me. No explanation. No delay. Levi stands up and leaves behind what once defined him. Grace rarely waits for us to feel ready. It calls us while we are still seated in our habits.

Saint Anthony hears the Gospel and refuses to keep it theoretical. He does not admire it or postpone it. He obeys it. Holiness often begins with the uncomfortable realization that the Word of God is not meant for someone else. It is meant for me.

Prayer: Lord, meet me in my ordinary searching. Give me the courage to follow when you call, even if I was not looking for you. Amen.

Before You Prove Anything

The Baptism of the Lord

Isaiah 42:1–4, 6–7; Psalm 29; Acts 10:34–38; Matthew 3:13–17

There is a quiet but radical detail in the story of the Baptism of the Lord that we often miss because it sounds so familiar.

Jesus steps into the Jordan, the heavens open, the Spirit descends, and a voice speaks:

“This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” It sounds like a conclusion, but it is actually a beginning.

What makes this moment so unsettling is not what God says, but when He says it. Jesus has not yet preached, healed, gathered followers, or performed a single miracle. There is no résumé, no public success, no proof.

And yet the Father names Him beloved and expresses delight. Love comes first. Proof comes later.

That order matters more than we realize. We live in a world where most of us feel as if we are always on probation. New job, new doctor, new parish, even long standing relationships can feel like they come with unspoken performance reviews. Am I useful enough, faithful enough, productive enough. We absorb the message early that love must be earned, rest must be justified, and worth must be demonstrated. Even God, we quietly assume, must be waiting for something.

John the Baptist senses the tension. He tries to stop Jesus, offering Him the spiritual fast pass. Surely Jesus does not belong in line with everyone else. Surely holiness should not have to wait its turn. But Jesus insists. He steps into the water with everyone else, shoulder to shoulder with people carrying regret, doubt, and unfinished stories. Then God speaks. Notice what God does not say. He does not say, “This is my Son, who is about to do great things.” He does not say, “This is my Son, provided He remains faithful.” He does not say, “This is my Son, assuming He succeeds.”

The Father names identity without prerequisites and delight without conditions.

The psalm helps us hear that voice correctly. The voice of the Lord is powerful, but it is not cruel. It shakes and stirs not to intimidate, but to give life, and it ends with blessing and peace. This is not the voice of a supervisor waiting for results. It is the voice of a Father who knows His child.

Isaiah deepens the picture. God’s chosen servant does not shout or crush. A bruised reed He does not break.

A smoldering wick He does not extinguish. God does not deal with human weakness by humiliating it. He protects what is fragile and works patiently with what is unfinished. That is not how most of us speak to ourselves.

If we are honest, many of us carry an inner voice that keeps score and catalogs failure. It speaks disappointment more easily than delight. If God spoke to us the way we speak to ourselves, most of us would never get out of bed.

The Acts of the Apostles offers a crucial correction. Peter reminds us that God shows no partiality. The Spirit is not reserved for the impressive. Jesus goes about doing good, not building a brand. His authority flows not from performance, but from being rooted in the Father’s love. What begins at the Jordan sustains Him all the way to the cross.

This matters for how we live our own baptism. Many Christians spend their lives trying to earn what was already given. We serve, pray, and sacrifice as if belovedness were the prize at the end of the race rather than the ground beneath our feet. Faith becomes exhausting not because it asks too much, but because we start from the wrong place. The Baptism of the Lord quietly corrects that mistake. God names Jesus beloved before Jesus proves anything so that we might finally stop living as if everything depends on our performance. When love comes first, obedience becomes response rather than anxiety. Service becomes gratitude rather than self justification. Holiness becomes relationship rather than pressure.

Before you prove anything. Before you fix everything.

Before you impress anyone. You are beloved.

Prayer

*Loving Father,
quiet the voices that tell me
I am only as good as what
I accomplish.
Help me rest in the truth that
I am your beloved, not because
I have proven myself,
but because you have chosen me.
When I feel tired, unfinished,
or uncertain, remind me that
your delight comes before my effort.
Teach me to live from that
love and not for it,
today and always.
Amen.*



We have all witnessed Bishops who were unexpectedly elected to become Pope. John Paul II, the first Pope elected from Poland, Pope Francis, the first Pope elected from South America and now Pope Leo, the first Pope from the United States. What is it about each of these men that defined their journey from childhood to priest, bishop, cardinal, and ultimately Pope? We have had the opportunity to learn about the first two individuals through their stories, their challenges and the special skills and abilities that propelled them forward during their pontificate.



AN UPDATE ON THE RENOVATION OF THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

~ A PROJECT OF THE ST. LEO LADIES' GUILD

Work on the project started at the end of October and is nearly completed. After a few glitches, we are happy to report that the majority of the renovation will be completed this week. The white marble pedestals and benches are all put in place, the bronze sculptures and plates are mounted and the new landscaping has been planted. The brick pathway has been re-leveled, and installation of new sand and sealing was completed last week. In the weeks ahead spotlights on the crosses and a water feature on the rocks will appear. The *Patrons of the Calvary Garden* bronze plaque and granite base will be put in place as soon as the base arrives, which we are hoping will be in time for Lent.

Now that everything else is looking so beautiful, the lawn is noticeably in need of new sod, so it seems that the Ladies' Guild fund raising is not quite over yet!


