BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

CONFIRMATION

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith.

Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

EUCARIST

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the Sacristan.

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear your confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Daily Reflections

by Father Jack

Sunday, January 18 - Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

CALLED FOR MORE THAN WE EXPECTED

"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."
(John 1:29)

John the Baptist does something remarkably difficult. He points away from himself and toward Jesus without hesitation or regret. He does not try to hold attention, explain his role, or protect his influence. His joy comes from helping others recognize who is standing right in front of them.

Isaiah reminds us that God rarely calls us to something small or self contained. What begins as a personal mission almost always widens beyond what we planned or preferred. God says it is not enough to stay comfortable or familiar. Love, once awakened, insists on reaching farther. Most of us underestimate what God can do through ordinary faithfulness. We assume our lives are too simple, our gifts too modest, our influence too limited. Yet God delights in using quiet obedience to bring light well beyond what we imagined. The invitation is not to impress, but to say yes.

Prayer: *Lord, help me trust that my small yes can serve a greater purpose than I can see. Amen. Isaiah 49:3, 5-6; Psalm 40; 1 Corinthians 1:1-3; John 1:29-34*

Monday, January 19 - THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DOING AND LISTENING

"Obedience is better than sacrifice." (1 Samuel 15:22)

Saul truly believes he has done enough. He followed most of the instructions and kept the best parts for what sounded like a holy reason. But partial obedience wrapped in religious language still misses the heart of God. The Lord is not impressed by effort that avoids surrender. Jesus echoes this tension when questioned about fasting. Practices and traditions matter, but only when they remain flexible enough to serve relationship. When rules replace listening, they crack under pressure like old wineskins. Faith was never meant to be brittle. Many of us stay busy for God while quietly resisting what God is actually asking. We substitute activity for attentiveness and assume good intentions are enough. Yet the Lord keeps inviting us back to something simpler and more demanding. Listen first, then act.

Prayer: *Lord, quiet my heart so I may hear you before I rush to do things for you. Amen. 1 Samuel 15:16-23; Psalm 50; Mark 2:18-22*

Tuesday, January 20 - WHEN GOD LOOKS PAST THE RESUME

"The LORD looks into the heart." (1 Samuel 16:7)

Samuel nearly gets it wrong because he assumes the obvious choice must be the right one. Height, strength, and confidence look convincing from the outside. God gently corrects him and reminds him that appearances rarely tell the full story. The heart matters more than the résumé. David is still in the field, doing an unnoticed task, unaware that history is about to interrupt his ordinary day. He is not preparing for greatness, yet God finds him faithful where he is. The anointing comes before David understands what it will cost. Grace often arrives ahead of clarity. Jesus later insists that the Sabbath exists to serve life, not control it. God's priorities always bend toward mercy and human need. That should comfort anyone who feels overlooked, underestimated, or out of step. God sees more than the surface.

Prayer: *Lord, help me trust that you see what others overlook, including in me. Amen. 1 Samuel 16:1-13; Psalm 89; Mark 2:23-28*

Wednesday, January 21 - Memorial of Saint Agnes

COURAGE THAT DOES NOT LOOK IMPRESSIVE

"The battle is the LORD's." (1 Samuel 17:47)

David shows up without armor, without credentials, and without the tools everyone expects. He brings what he has rather than waiting for what he lacks. That quiet confidence unsettles those who believe strength must look a certain way. God, however, has never depended on appearances. In the Gospel, Jesus heals a man while others watch closely for mistakes.

Compassion makes them uncomfortable because it disrupts their control.

Mercy often does that. Love refuses to wait for perfect timing.

Saint Agnes reminds us that faithfulness does not require size, age, or social approval. Courage rooted in trust is enough. God has never been limited by our resources, only by our fear of stepping forward.

Prayer: *Lord, give me courage to act in love even when it feels risky or unpopular. Amen. 1 Samuel 17:32-51; Psalm 144; Mark 3:1-6*

Thursday, January 22 - Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

WHEN JEALOUSY GETS LOUD

"In God I trust; I shall not fear." (Psalm 56:5)

Saul hears one song and loses his peace. Comparison quickly turns gratitude into resentment and joy into suspicion. Jealousy whispers that someone else's success threatens our worth. It rarely tells the truth.

Jesus continues to move toward those in need even as crowds press in around him. He does not perform for approval or retreat from discomfort. His focus remains on healing, not recognition. Love has its own rhythm. Trust steadies us when fear grows loud. God's care is not a limited resource that must be defended or hoarded. There is enough dignity, mercy, and purpose for every life. Fear fades when trust takes root.

Prayer: *Lord, free my heart from comparison and teach me to trust your care for all. Amen. 1 Samuel 18:6-9; 19:1-7; Psalm 56; Mark 3:7-12*

Friday, January 23 - MERCY THAT HOLDS BACK

"Have mercy on me, God, have mercy." (Psalm 57:2)

David has the perfect opportunity to end his suffering. No witnesses, no resistance, no consequences. Yet he stops himself and chooses restraint over revenge. True strength sometimes looks like walking away.

Jesus calls the Twelve not because they are exceptional, but because he wants them close. Before sending them out, he invites them to be with him. Relationship comes before mission. Authority grows from intimacy. We often think strength means acting quickly and decisively. Scripture suggests it can also mean knowing when not to act. Mercy held back becomes a powerful witness.

Prayer: *Lord, teach me restraint that flows from trust rather than fear. Amen. 1 Samuel 24:3-21; Psalm 57; Mark 3:13-19*

Saturday, January 24 - Memorial of Saint Francis de Sales

WHEN LOVE LOOKS LIKE GRIEF

"They said, 'He is out of his mind.'" (Mark 3:21)

David mourns Saul and Jonathan with honesty and tenderness. Even complicated relationships deserve reverence in grief. Love does not deny pain, but it refuses to let bitterness speak last. Mourning can be an act of faith.

Jesus' own family worries about him. Faithfulness sometimes looks unreasonable to those who cannot yet see what God is doing. Saint Francis de Sales understood this well and preached patience over pressure. Gentleness, he taught, is strength under control.

God meets us not by demanding clarity, but by staying close through confusion. He honors love that endures misunderstanding. Grace remains present even when certainty is not.

Prayer: *Lord, help me love with patience when answers do not come quickly. Amen. 2 Samuel 1:1-27; Psalm 80; Mark 3:20-21*

BEFORE WE LOOK IMPRESSIVE - GOD'S PATTERN OF CHOOSING THE UNSEEN

A SCRIPTURAL MESSAGE FOR THIS WEEK BY FATHER JAREK

There is a quiet assumption many of us carry without noticing. We tend to believe that life truly begins once things are settled, once we feel ready, confident, and put together. Until then, we wait. We rehearse. We try to look the part. Scripture, however, has little patience for this way of thinking.

This week's readings reveal a God who consistently acts before anything looks finished or impressive. David is anointed while still tending sheep, not managing a kingdom. He faces Goliath without armor, restrains himself when revenge would be justified, and later mourns the very man who tried to destroy him. John the Baptist steps aside without hesitation. Jesus heals when others say it is the wrong time, eats when others insist it is the wrong day, and chooses companions who will often misunderstand him. God does not wait for things to look convincing. God moves first.

GOD LOOKS INTO THE HEART, NOT THE RÉSUMÉ

This unsettles modern instincts. We trust credentials, polish, and visible results. Even in faith, we assume responsibility should follow readiness. Scripture quietly reverses that logic. When Samuel arrives to anoint a king, he assumes the strongest son must be the obvious choice. God corrects him gently. Human beings look at appearances. God looks into the heart. The chosen one is still in the field, doing unnoticed work, unaware that his life is about to change. Grace arrives before clarity. Calling comes before understanding.

WHEN MERCY REFUSES TO WAIT

Jesus reinforces this truth in the Gospel. A man with a withered hand stands before him while others watch closely, hoping to enforce rules rather than celebrate healing. Jesus refuses to delay love for the sake of appearances. He reminds them that the Sabbath exists to serve life. Rules matter, but they never outrank human dignity. Mercy does not wait for consensus. It responds to need. Scripture consistently trains us to recognize life and dignity precisely where others are tempted to delay, overlook, or look away.

SEEING LIFE BEFORE IT IS CONVENIENT

This biblical pattern shapes the Church's concern for unborn life. It is not rooted in ideology, but in Scripture's insistence that life matters before it looks strong, independent, or convenient. The unborn belong among those Scripture repeatedly trains us to notice: the overlooked shepherd, the vulnerable disciple, the person whose suffering others would rather postpone. Human worth is not earned or negotiated. It is received as gift.

CONVICTION WITHOUT CRUELTY

At the same time, these *same* readings guard us against hardness of heart. David refuses to kill Saul even when it would solve everything. He restrains his power and calls it faithfulness. Jesus heals with compassion, knowing it will provoke anger. In Scripture, moral strength does not look like domination or certainty. It looks like restraint exercised for the sake of life. Faithful witness holds two truths together: unborn life matters, and so does the dignity of women and families facing fear and pressure.

GOD'S BAFFLING FAITH IN FRAGILE PEOPLE

God's choices remain humbling. He anoints teenagers, builds a Church on fishermen, and entrusts the future to disciples who will fail him. If God waited for perfect conditions, none of us would be here. God does not choose because we are ready. God chooses because love always moves first.

STAYING OPEN TO WHERE GOD IS LOOKING

This week's Scriptures invite us to notice where God's attention rests. Not on who appears impressive or correct, but on who remains open and attentive. Faithfulness is not about standing out. It is about staying open long enough for God to do more than we expected.

A PRAYER FOR OPEN HEARTS

Loving God, you see us long before we see ourselves.

You call us while we are still tending ordinary tasks, still uncertain, still unfinished.

*Teach us to look where you look, to value life before it is impressive,
to protect what is fragile, and to respond with mercy where fear would harden us.*

*Hold close all who feel unseen, especially those carrying heavy decisions, quiet grief, or hidden hope.
Give us hearts that listen, courage that restrains itself in love, and faith that stays open to your surprising work.*

We place ourselves, our parish, and our world in your care, trusting that your love always moves first.

Amen.

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

Scripture consistently draws our attention to life where it is easiest to overlook. God chooses the small, the hidden, and the dependent, not because they are useful, but because they are beloved. The psalms speak of God knitting life together in the womb, and the prophets remind us that God knows us before we can speak or act or prove anything at all. From the beginning, Scripture resists the idea that human worth must be earned. The Church echoes this conviction by affirming that every human life possesses inherent dignity from conception to natural death, not as a political position, but as a moral truth rooted in who God is and how God loves. To pray for the legal protection of unborn children is to affirm that life matters before it is visible, strong, or convenient.

At the same time, the Church also calls us to hold this conviction with humility and compassion. Moral clarity is never meant to harden the heart. Jesus consistently defended life while drawing close to those burdened by fear, pressure, and painful choices. Catholic teaching insists that the dignity of unborn children and the dignity of women and families are never in competition. Both must be protected. Both deserve care. On this day of prayer, the Church invites us not only to advocate for laws that safeguard life, but also to foster a culture of accompaniment, mercy, and concrete support.

True respect for life is shown not only in what we defend, but in how we love, listen, and walk with those who carry heavy and often unseen burdens.

A PRAYER FOR LIFE AND COMPASSION

God of all life,
you see each person before the world takes notice
and love each life before it can speak for itself.
Open our hearts to recognize the dignity you have placed
within every human being, especially the unborn.

Give us wisdom to uphold life with courage,
and tenderness to accompany those who feel afraid, overwhelmed, or alone.
Free us from harsh judgment and shallow certainty.

Teach us to speak truth with love,
to protect life with humility,
and to reflect your mercy in every choice we make.

May our prayer become action,
our convictions become compassion,
and our love become a sign of your care for all.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.





MEMORIAL BRICKS FOR THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS GARDEN



As part of the renovation of the St. Leo Stations of the Cross Garden, the St. Leo Ladies' Guild will be handling the ongoing ordering, installing and maintaining of brick memorials to be placed within the garden. Placing a brick in this sacred space, whether in memory of a loved one, to mark a special event, or celebrate an anniversary is a timeless way to remember what matters most in our lives.

Memorial bricks may be ordered in two sizes – 4" x 8" (\$125) or 12" x 12" (\$300). Brochures with order forms are available in the parish office. The next cutoff date for brick orders will be January 31st and installation of bricks placed with this order is expected in March. Upcoming order deadlines will be in May and October.



“Leo From Chicago” Tuesday, February 3rd 9-11am in the St. Leo Auditorium and led by Deacon Charlie

We have all witnessed Bishops who were unexpectedly elected to become Pope. John Paul II, the first Pope elected from Poland, Pope Francis, the first Pope elected from South America and now Pope Leo, the first Pope from the United States. What is it about each of these men that defined their journey from childhood to priest, bishop, cardinal, and ultimately Pope? We have had the opportunity to learn about the first two individuals through their stories, their challenges and the special skills and abilities that propelled them forward during their pontificate.

Join us as we explore what influenced that process with Pope Leo XIV. We will provide a one hour video that will give us a sense of what it was like for him to be raised in a 1960's Chicago Catholic family, what influenced him, and what talents and skills came to epitomize a process that unfolded for him a course he least expected.

After the video our conversation will focus on Pope Leo's recent conversation with young people where he entertained their questions and provided great guidance to parents and grandparents on how to speak with adolescents about difficult current topics.

Hearing Loops are installed around the pews adjacent to the north and south entrances of the church and in the new auditorium. Hearing Loops transmit sound directly into a hearing aid or cochlear implant. To receive the Loop signal, manually activate the T-coil or telephone setting on your device. Consult your audiologist or hearing aid professional with problems.



EUCARISTIC ADORATION
