BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear vour confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Art of Holy Nagging

"Suppose there were fifty innocent people..." (Genesis 18:24)
Abraham negotiates with God like he's haggling at a street market. Fifty righteous? What about forty-five? Thirty? Ten? You almost expect him to throw in a complimentary goat if God agrees to go lower.

But God doesn't get annoyed. In fact, He welcomes the persistence. Not because He needs convincing, but because He delights in the boldness of love. Abraham intercedes—not with perfect arguments, but with a pleading heart.

Jesus echoes that same idea in the Gospel: Ask. Seek. Knock. It's not about wearing God down—it's about growing closer as we wrestle, hope, and trust that He hears.

Praver

Patient Father, thank You for letting me come to You again and again—sometimes with eloquence, sometimes with a mess. Teach me that prayer isn't a performance, but a conversation You welcome. Amen.

Monday, July 28, 2025

When the Calf Comes Out

"I threw it into the fire, and this calf came out." (Exodus 32:24)
Let's be honest—Aaron's explanation is a little ridiculous. "The people gave me gold. I tossed it in the fire. Boom. Calf." As if golden idols just assemble themselves while you're making a sandwich.

But we've all made excuses like that. When caught, we scramble for stories that sound less sinful and more... spontaneous. Yet God doesn't want a cleaned-up narrative. He wants honest hearts.

Grace begins when we stop blaming the fire and start owning the gold.

Prayer

Lord, I confess the ways I've melted truth to avoid responsibility. Give me the courage to be honest—with You, with others, and with myself. Amen. Readings: Exodus 32:15–24, 30–34; Psalm 106; Matthew 13:31–35

Tuesday, July 29, 2025

Martha, Mary, and the Missing Fork

"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried..." (Luke 10:41)
Jesus loved Martha—and her casseroles. But He also loved her enough
to challenge her. Service is good. But when it turns sour with resentment,
something's off.

Mary wasn't being lazy. She was listening. And Martha, in her frustration, needed the reminder that presence matters more than performance. Many of us are Martha by nature—planning, prepping, cleaning, worrying about where the dessert forks went. But Jesus invites us to pause. Not because the work doesn't matter—but because He does.

Prayer

Jesus, calm my anxious heart. When I get stuck in doing, help me remember that You're not a task to complete, but a friend to be with. Amen. Readings: Exodus 33:7–11; 34:5b–9, 28; Psalm 103; John 11:19–27 or Luke 10:38–42

Wednesday, July 30, 2025

The Glow That Won't Quit

"They were afraid to come near him." (Exodus 34:30)

Moses came down the mountain looking like he had just used heavenly moisturizer. His face was glowing from being with God—and it freaked everyone out.

Sometimes real holiness startles people. It's not flashy, but it is radiant. Not from effort, but from encounter.

You don't need a mountaintop to glow. Just time with God. The more you

abide, the more you'll shine—maybe not visibly, but in love, patience, and peace that make people wonder, "What happened to them?"

Prave

Lord, let my time with You leave a mark—not on my skin, but in my spirit. May I reflect Your light into the lives around me. Amen. Readings: Exodus 34:29–35; Psalm 99; Matthew 13:44–46

Thursday, July 31, 2025

Follow the Cloud

"The glory of the LORD filled the Dwelling." (Exodus 40:34) It's hard to travel when the directions are... a cloud. No GPS. No detailed schedule. Just: If the cloud moves, you move. If it stays, you stay. This is life with God. Unpredictable. Dependent. Daily.

Saint Ignatius of Loyola called it "finding God in all things." Whether the cloud hovers or lifts, the point isn't control—it's trust. He leads. We follow. And in the uncertainty, He stays close.

Pravei

Lord, I'm not great at waiting—or wandering. But I trust that if I stay close to You, I'll always be where I need to be. Amen. Readings: Exodus 40:16–21, 34–38; Psalm 84; Matthew 13:47–53

Friday, August 1, 2025

Familiar Faces, Unfamiliar Faith

"Where did this man get all this?" (Matthew 13:56)

Jesus returns home—and the welcome committee is less than enthusiastic.
"Isn't this the carpenter's kid?" Translation: "Who does He think He is?"
Familiarity can blind us to grace. We think we know someone so well that we stop believing God could speak through them—or to them.
Saint Alphonsus Liguori faced opposition too. But he kept preaching, writing, and loving. Because truth doesn't need a fan club—it just needs a voice.

Prayer

Jesus, forgive me for the times I've doubted You—especially when You come disguised as someone familiar. Help me listen with wonder again. Amen.

Saturday, August 2, 2025

The Sound of Freedom

"You shall proclaim liberty in the land." (Leviticus 25:10)
The Year of Jubilee was like a divine reset button. Debts forgiven. Land restored. Slaves set free. Can you imagine the sound of that trumpet echoing across the hills?

It's a reminder that God builds freedom into His rhythms. Not just for the rich or the holy—but for everyone. Even us.

And while we may not live under ancient jubilee laws, we are called to be people of second chances. Forgivers. Welcomers. Trumpet-blasters of hope.

Prayer

God of Jubilee, free me from what enslaves me—resentment, fear, perfectionism. And help me extend that freedom to others, one kind act at a time. Amen.

THE COURAGE TO BARGAIN WITH GOD

Why Real Faith Is Not Afraid to Argue

Some prayers sound like poetry. Others sound like someone haggling over a Medicare bill or trying to talk their way out of a parking ticket.

Take Abraham in Genesis 18. He doesn't quietly nod while God announces judgment on Sodom and Gomorrah. He steps forward. He negotiates. He pleads. "Suppose there are fifty righteous... Forty-five? Forty? Thirty? Twenty? Ten?" You can almost picture him watching God's face after each offer—like a man hoping to get a good deal at the farmer's market without pushing his luck. But it's not disrespect. It's love in action.

And God listens.

It's easy to assume that faith means quiet acceptance. But the Bible tells a different story. Real faith wrestles. It dares to question. It walks right up to the Lord of the universe and says, "Wait—are You sure?" Not out of arrogance, but out of love. Abraham wasn't challenging God's justice—he was counting on it.

Many of us grew up with a deep reverence for God—and that's a beautiful thing. But sometimes that reverence came wrapped in silence. We didn't ask too many questions. We didn't admit confusion or anger. We certainly didn't argue with God. That felt irreverent—maybe even dangerous.

But Scripture suggests otherwise. From Abraham to Job, from Moses to Mary, the most faithful people weren't always the quietest. They prayed with their whole hearts—including their doubts, fears, and frustrations. They spoke up. And God welcomed it.

Jesus invites this kind of persistent relationship. In Luke 11, He tells a story about a man banging on his friend's door at midnight asking for bread. It's awkward. It's inconvenient. But it works. The door opens—not necessarily out of friendship, but because of persistence.



That's the God we pray to. Not a bureaucrat handing out blessings to the most compliant applicants, but a Father who invites us to come near—even when we're desperate, messy, or afraid. "Ask," Jesus says. "Seek. Knock." And when the door doesn't open right away—knock again.

In fact, you could say that knocking again is one of the most faithful things we can do.

This kind of prayer isn't childish. It's childlike. It trusts that God is big enough to handle the real us—not the polished, pious version, but the one who's worried about a diagnosis, heartbroken over a child, or weary from carrying the same burden for too long.

So if you find yourself bargaining with God—over a loved one, a tragedy, or a disappointment—don't assume you're doing it wrong. You're in good company. Abraham's bold prayer changed God's response. Your prayers might not change the outcome, but they will change you.

Faith isn't always tidy. Sometimes it's full of questions. But maybe the deepest act of trust isn't having all the answers—it's daring to bring the questions to the One who does.

Reflection Questions

- 1. When was the last time you spoke honestly with God about something that upset or confused you?
- 2. Are there prayers you've given up on out of fatigue or disappointment? What might it look like to knock again?
- 3. Who in your life needs you to be like Abraham—interceding on their behalf with bold compassion?


Prayer

St. Leos Ladies Guild Cafe of Life Meal Service Commission

The main goal of the Café of Life "is to provide basic human needs to the very poor and hungry people of the Bonita Springs area in a manner that preserves the dignity of the client in a respectful environment..."

In working toward this goal, Patty Swanson and Sharon Kennedy directed 26 volunteers for 407 hours in providing delicious, healthy meals to those in need at the Café of Life once every month. They were responsible for the sourcing of ingredients, the preparation of food, and service of meals at the agency.

Together this Ladies' Guild Commission served 1133 meals this past year. The meal items bought, cooked, and delivered included:

292 pounds of protein: chicken, beef, ham, and tuna

390 pounds of vegetables: corn, green beans, tomatoes, potatoes, and onions 90 pounds of rice and beans

320 pounds of fruit: peaches, apples, oranges, and bananas and

154 pounds of garden salads.

Providing meals to those in need throughout the year is a vital part of our community and is one of the many services of the Café of Life as they work to enrich lives and provide empowerment to those in poverty.






