BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

CONFIRMATION

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

EUCCHARIST

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the Sacristan.

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 1:30pm-3:00pm on Saturday in English during season and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear your confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Re-establishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Daily Reflections

SUNDAY, MAY 10 - MOTHER'S DAY

LOVE THAT STAYS

"I will not leave you orphans." (John 14:18)

There is something about being cared for that we never quite outgrow. Even as adults, part of us still longs for a presence that reassures, steadies, and remains. That is why a day like today carries more than simple celebration. For some it is filled with gratitude and warmth, and for others it holds a quieter ache, a memory, a longing, or a love that feels distant or incomplete.

Into that deeply human place, Jesus speaks with remarkable tenderness. He does not offer a passing comfort but a promise that reaches into our deepest fear.

"I will not leave you orphans." His presence is not occasional or distant. It is steady, personal, and closer than we often notice, especially when life feels uncertain or unfinished.

The love that shapes us at its best reflects that same truth. It stays, it returns, it remains even when it cannot fix everything. And in that steady presence something within us becomes stronger and more at peace. Much of what heals us in life is not dramatic change, but faithful presence.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for the love that has carried me in ways seen and unseen.

Help me recognize Your presence in those who have cared for me, and teach me to reflect that same steady love to others. Amen. Acts 8:5-8, 14-17;

Psalm 66; 1 Peter 3:15-18; John 14:15-21

MONDAY, MAY 11 - AN OPEN HEART

"The Lord opened her heart." (Acts 16:14)

Some of the most important moments in life arrive quietly. A conversation at the end of a long day, a passing remark that lingers, or a simple realization that gently shifts the way we see things. Lydia does something very simple. She listens. There is no dramatic sign or sudden certainty, just a willingness to remain present.

In that quiet attentiveness, something begins to open. Faith often begins this way, not with clarity, but with attention. We tend to think growth requires effort and intensity, yet more often it begins with the decision not to rush past what might matter. God rarely forces His way into our lives. He waits for the small opening we are willing to give.

Sometimes the difference between remaining unchanged and being transformed is simply this. We stayed a little longer than we usually do. In that extra moment of openness, something deeper takes root, and a new way of seeing begins to unfold.

Prayer: Lord, open my heart in the quiet moments of this day. Help me listen more deeply, and give me the patience to remain where You are gently at work. Amen.

Acts 16:11-15; Psalm 149; John 15:26-16:4a

TUESDAY, MAY 12 - FAITH IN THE DARK

"About midnight... Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God." (Acts 16:25)

There is something revealing about the middle of the night. When everything grows quiet, the mind often becomes louder. Thoughts return, worries stretch themselves out, and questions that seemed manageable during the day begin to feel heavier. In those moments we discover what we truly lean on.

Paul and Silas are not facing a small inconvenience. They are beaten, chained, and confined. And yet in the depth of that darkness, they pray and they sing. Not because everything is resolved, but because they trust that God has not disappeared simply because their circumstances have.

Faith does not always remove the night, but it changes how we stand within it.

Sometimes the most powerful prayer is not eloquent at all, but a simple turning toward God and a refusal to turn away. Hope often begins not as a feeling, but as a quiet decision to remain.

Prayer: Lord, meet me in the quiet and restless moments. When my thoughts begin to overwhelm me, remind me that You are near, and help me remain with You until peace finds its way back. Amen. Acts 16:22-34; Psalm 138; John 16:5-11

WEDNESDAY, MAY 13 - SEARCHING AND FINDING

"In him we live and move and have our being." (Acts 17:28)

There is a quiet searching that runs through much of life. Even when things are going well, there can still be a sense that something is not fully settled. We look for meaning in progress, in clarity, in finally arriving at a place where everything feels complete, and yet that place rarely comes as expected.

Paul speaks into that longing with surprising simplicity. God is not far or hidden

behind distance. He is closer than breath and nearer than the thoughts passing through our minds. The One we are searching for is not waiting at the end of the journey, but is already present within it.

The challenge is not that God is difficult to find, but that we are often moving too quickly to notice. What we call searching is often an invitation to slow down, to become attentive, and to recognize that we are already held within His presence.

Prayer: Lord, help me recognize how near You are. In the middle of my routines and responsibilities, open my eyes to Your presence, and teach me to rest in You. Amen. Acts 17:15, 22-18:1; Psalm 148; John 16:12-15

THURSDAY, MAY 14 - CHOSEN TO LOVE

"It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you." (John 15:16)

Many of us carry a quiet assumption that we need to prove we belong. In our relationships, in our work, and even in our faith, we measure ourselves and wonder if we are enough. This constant striving can quietly exhaust the heart.

Jesus gently overturns that way of thinking. "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you." Before effort, before success, before anything was figured out, the relationship begins with His initiative, not ours. We are not chosen because we have achieved something, but because He loves.

And what are we chosen for. Not perfection or performance, but love. The kind that shows up, forgives, and remains. Much of our exhaustion comes from trying to earn what has already been given. To live as chosen is to begin from rest, not striving.

Prayer: Lord, help me live from the truth that I am already chosen. Free me from the need to prove myself, and teach me to love with the same patience and faithfulness You have shown me. Amen. Acts 18:1-8; Psalm 98; John 16:16-20

FRIDAY, MAY 15 - COURAGE TO SPEAK

"Do not be afraid. Go on speaking." (Acts 18:9)

There are moments when silence feels easier. Speaking up can risk misunderstanding, tension, or discomfort, and it can seem wiser to stay quiet. Yet what remains unsaid does not disappear. It settles quietly beneath the surface and shapes us in ways we do not always notice.

Paul hears something simple and direct. Do not be afraid. Keep speaking. Not loudly or forcefully, but faithfully. God is already at work, even when we cannot see the outcome, and our role is to remain steady and true.

Courage in faith is rarely dramatic. Most of the time it looks like saying what is true with patience and kindness, even when it would be easier to say nothing. What matters is not volume, but faithfulness.

Prayer: Lord, give me the courage to speak when it matters. Not with fear or force, but with clarity, humility, and trust that You are already at work. Amen. Acts 18:9-18; Psalm 47; John 16:20-23

SATURDAY, MAY 16 - GROWING TOGETHER

"They explained to him the Way of God more accurately." (Acts 18:26)

Growth rarely happens in isolation. Even when we are sincere and trying, our understanding is often partial. We see some things clearly and others only in part, and that is simply part of being human. It is in that incompleteness that the need for others quietly reveals itself.

Apollos is thoughtful and committed, and still there is more for him to learn.

Priscilla and Aquila step into that space not to correct harshly, but to guide with care. That is how real growth happens, not through embarrassment, but through relationships where truth and kindness meet.

We all carry areas where we are still becoming, and we all have moments when we help someone else take the next step. To grow is to remain teachable, and to guide is to remain gentle. In that shared process, a life of faith is formed over time.

Prayer: Lord, place people in my life who help me grow. Give me humility to learn, and grace to guide others with patience, wisdom, and love. Amen. Acts 18:23-28; Psalm 47; John 16:23b-28

When Love Does Not Fix Everything

Mother's Day

There is a moment most parents encounter, though few are prepared for it. It is the moment when love, as strong and sincere as it is, does not fix what is wrong. It may come early, with a child who is sick and cannot be comforted no matter how gently they are held. It may come later, when a son or daughter makes choices that lead to pain despite every warning that was given. Or it may come quietly over time, as worries settle in that cannot be resolved with a conversation, a sacrifice, or even a prayer spoken through tears.

At first, this feels like a failure. We instinctively believe that love should be enough to make things right, that if we care deeply enough, we should be able to protect, guide, and somehow prevent the pain. But life does not always cooperate with that belief. Even the most sincere love cannot control another person's path or shield them from every hardship. And so a difficult truth begins to emerge: love, no matter how deep, is not the same as control.

On a day like Mother's Day, we celebrate love in its most generous and enduring form. We remember the patience, the sacrifices, and the countless quiet acts that shaped our lives in ways we did not fully understand at the time. Yet beneath those memories lies a quieter truth. Even the deepest love cannot remove every sorrow, and even the most faithful heart cannot determine how every story will unfold.

The Second Reading speaks directly into this reality. Saint Peter tells us that it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing wrong. He then points us to Christ Himself, who loved perfectly and still suffered. This is the turning point. If love were meant to fix everything, then Christ would never have gone to the Cross.

No one loved more purely, and no one gave more completely. Yet His love did not prevent betrayal, rejection, or pain. It did not remove suffering from the world. Instead, it entered into it and remained there, transforming it from within. This is what love looks like at its deepest level.

The measure of love is not found in outcomes. A mother can do everything right and still watch her child struggle. She can pray with deep faith and still face silence where she hoped for answers. She can offer guidance, support, and sacrifice, and still carry the ache of not being able to make things better. Picture her sitting at the edge of a bed late at night, the room quiet, the words used up, staying anyway. None of this diminishes her love. It reveals it.

The love that remains when it cannot fix or control becomes something deeper. It is no longer dependent on results. It becomes presence. It becomes fidelity. It becomes the quiet decision to stay, to care, and to hope, even when there is no clear resolution. This kind of love rarely draws attention, but it carries a strength that does not fade.

In the Gospel, Jesus says, "I will not leave you orphans." He does not promise that life will unfold as we hope or that suffering will be avoided. He does not promise that every prayer will be answered in the way we expect. What He promises is presence, a love that does not withdraw when the path becomes uncertain.

This promise changes everything. When love cannot remove the pain, it remains within it. When it cannot solve the problem, it stands beside the one who carries it. Even without the outcome we desire, it becomes a quiet strength that sustains.

Many mothers understand this without needing to explain it. They know what it is to sit in silence with a child who is hurting and remain. They know what it is to carry concern long after others have moved on. They know what it is to love not only in moments of joy, but through seasons of waiting, disappointment, and hope.

In those moments, they reflect something of the heart of Christ. He meets us not only in resolution, but in what remains unresolved. He is present not only in healing, but in the long and patient work of becoming whole. His love does not step away when things are difficult. It stays.

That same love continues its work today. It is present in homes where prayers are still whispered, in hearts that continue to hope even when answers are slow, and in lives where love refuses to give up, even when it does not see immediate change.

So today, we honor not only the visible beauty of motherhood, but also its hidden strength. It is the strength to love when it is not easy, to remain when it is not comfortable, and to trust when it is not clear.

And for all of us, there is an invitation. To let go of the belief that love must fix everything in order to be real. To trust that faithful love is already doing something deeper than we can measure. And to rest in the promise that even in what we cannot change, we are held by a God who does not step away.

A Prayer in the Midst of What We Cannot Fix

Lord, You see the places in our lives that remain unresolved,
the worries we carry, the prayers that seem unanswered,
and the people we love whom we cannot protect from pain.

On this day, we lift up all mothers who have loved deeply
and still found themselves unable to make everything right.

Strengthen them in their quiet perseverance.

Comfort them in their hidden struggles.

Remind them that their love is not measured by outcomes,
but by the faithfulness with which they remain.

Teach us all to trust You more deeply.

To believe that even when we do not understand,
You are present and at work.

Give us the grace to love without needing control,
to remain without needing certainty,
and to hope without losing heart.

And in all things, help us to rest in Your promise
that we are never alone.

Amen.

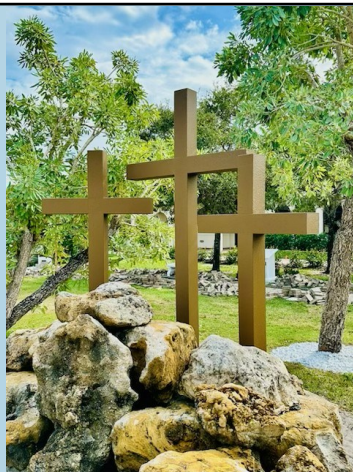

MEMORIAL BRICKS FOR THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS GARDEN

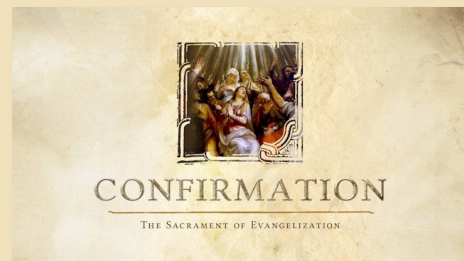
