BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

CONFIRMATION

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

EUCCHARIST

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the Sacristan.

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 1:30pm-3:00pm on Saturday in English during season and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear your confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Re-establishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Daily Reflections

by Father Jarek

SUNDAY, MAY 3 - A PEACEFUL HEART

"Do not let your hearts be troubled." (John 14:1)

There are moments when life feels unsettled in a quiet but persistent way. Nothing dramatic, just enough to keep your mind turning. A conversation replays. A decision will not settle. And before you realize it, you are trying to solve tomorrow, usually sometime in the middle of the night when nothing ever feels clearer.

Jesus does not step into that moment with explanations. He steps in with Himself. "Do not let your hearts be troubled." Not because everything is clear, but because He is near. Peace does not come from having all the answers, but from knowing who is holding the question.

Thomas asks for directions. Jesus offers a relationship. "I am the way." Stay close, and the next step will come into view. Not all at once, but enough for today. Peace grows not from certainty, but from trust that you are not walking alone.

Prayer: *Lord, when my thoughts run ahead of me, gently bring me back. Help me trust that I do not need the whole map, only the grace to take the next step with You. Amen. Readings:* Acts 6:1-7; Psalm 33; 1 Peter 2:4-9; John 14:1-12

MONDAY, MAY 4 - GIVING GOD THE CREDIT

"Not to us, O Lord, but to your name give the glory." (Psalm 115:1)

There is something quietly awkward about being praised for something that feels bigger than you. A compliment stretches too far. Someone gives you credit for more than you remember doing. And you are left smiling, nodding, and thinking, "Well, I did show up," hoping the moment passes without needing a speech.

Paul and Barnabas face that moment in an extreme way. People try to worship them. And they immediately redirect it. Not out of discomfort, but clarity. They know the difference between being used by God and being mistaken for Him.

Recognition becomes heavy when we hold onto it. It becomes light when we pass it on. What we receive with gratitude, we can return with humility. Quietly and without drawing attention, we let it point beyond us to the One who gave it.

Prayer: *Lord, keep my heart steady. When I am praised, keep me honest. When I am overlooked, keep me faithful. Let everything in me quietly point back to You. Amen. Readings:* Acts 14:5-18; Psalm 115; John 14:21-26

TUESDAY, MAY 5 - GETTING BACK UP

"It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships..." (Acts 14:22)

There is a moment after a setback when the hardest part is not what happened, but what comes next. Getting back up. Trying again. Walking back into the same situation that discouraged you before. And quietly wondering if you still have the energy for it, or if sitting this one out might be easier.

Paul is stoned, dragged out, and left for dead. And then he gets up. No speech. No explanation. Just a decision. Strength, it turns out, is often less about power and more about persistence.

Most of us will not face what Paul faced. But we all know what it means to feel knocked down. And sometimes grace looks like this: not a dramatic recovery, but a simple step forward, followed by another.

Prayer: *Lord, when I feel discouraged, give me the grace to rise again. Not all at once, but one step at a time. Stay with me in the effort, and steady my heart. Amen. Readings:* Acts 14:19-28; Psalm 145; John 14:27-31a

WEDNESDAY, MAY 6 - STAYING ROOTED

"Remain in me, as I remain in you." (John 15:4)

We like to see results. Something finished. Something improved. Something we can point to and say, "At least that worked." And when that is missing, it is easy to feel like nothing is happening, even though experience has taught us that the most important things rarely move quickly.

Jesus speaks into that impatience with a quieter invitation. Not produce. Remain. Stay connected. Stay rooted. Even when there is no visible outcome

yet. Growth, more often than not, happens out of sight.

Roots deepen before anything appears above the surface. What feels like stillness may actually be strength taking hold. And often the work God is doing in you is the part no one else will see, but you will live from it for years.

Prayer: *Lord, when I grow impatient, bring me back to You. Help me remain, even when I cannot see results, and trust the quiet work You are doing within me. Amen. Readings:* Acts 15:1-6; Psalm 122; John 15:1-8

THURSDAY, MAY 7 - BACK TO GRACE

"We are saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus." (Acts 15:11)

We have a way of making faith heavier than it needs to be. Adding expectations. Measuring ourselves. Carrying pressures we were never actually given, and holding onto them as if they were somehow required.

The early Church struggled with that too. What is required. What must be done. And in the middle of the discussion, Peter brings everything back to its center: grace. Not earned. Not negotiated. Given.

Faith does not begin with what we achieve. It begins with what we receive. And sometimes the most spiritual thing we can do is set something down and trust that God was never asking us to carry it alone.

Prayer: *Lord, when I complicate what You have made simple, bring me back to grace. Teach me to live from what You give, not from what I try to prove. Amen. Readings:* Acts 15:7-21; Psalm 96; John 15:9-11

FRIDAY, MAY 8 - CALLED FRIEND

"I have called you friends." (John 15:15)

There are moments when we feel slightly out of place. Others seem more certain, more at ease, more confident in their faith. And quietly, we begin to wonder if we somehow missed something along the way, or if everyone else simply learned how to hide it better.

Jesus changes the language entirely. Not servants. Friends. Known. Chosen. Trusted with His heart. The relationship is not distant or formal. It is personal, close, and already given.

We spend a surprising amount of energy trying to earn what has already been offered. But belonging in God's presence is not something we achieve. It is something we slowly allow ourselves to accept.

Prayer: *Lord, when I question where I stand, remind me where I already belong. Help me receive Your friendship with a simpler, more trusting heart. Amen. Readings:* Acts 15:22-31; Psalm 57; John 15:12-17

SATURDAY, MAY 9 - CHOSEN FOR A PURPOSE

"Because you do not belong to the world... I have chosen you." (John 15:19)

There is a quiet moment many people recognize. You choose patience when others choose sharp words. You hold your ground when something does not sit right, even if no one else seems concerned. You let something go that you once would have argued about for hours, and you wonder if it really makes a difference.

Jesus speaks directly into that space. "You do not belong to the world...

I have chosen you." Not to separate you from others, but to anchor you. The difference you feel is not a sign that you are out of place, but a sign that your life is being shaped by something deeper.

Faithfulness is often quiet. It rarely draws attention. But it changes the atmosphere around you in ways you may never fully see. And sometimes the most important witness you give is not in what you say, but in what you choose, again and again.

Prayer: *Lord, when I wonder if it matters, steady me. Help me trust that even the quiet choices of faith shape more than I can see. Keep me faithful in the small moments that make a lasting difference. Amen.*

WHEN GOOD PEOPLE DISAGREE ABOUT GOOD THINGS

Fifth Sunday of Easter • Acts 6:1–7; Psalm 33; 1 Peter 2:4–9; John 14:1–12 • by Father Jarek

It usually begins with something small. A decision that feels overlooked. A responsibility that seems unevenly shared. A concern that lingers just long enough to become a quiet frustration. No one sets out to create tension. And yet, somehow, it grows. If you have ever been part of a parish, a family, or even a group of friends, you know how this works. Good people, with good intentions, can still find themselves at odds over good things. In fact, sometimes the more people care, the more complicated things become. We sometimes imagine the early Church as one long prayer meeting. It turns out they had meetings about the meetings.

Which is why the scene in Acts is so unexpectedly comforting. The early Church, filled with the Spirit, was not immune to conflict. Widows were being overlooked. Some felt neglected. Others likely felt defensive. A very human moment, right at the heart of a holy community. It is tempting to believe that strong faith should eliminate these tensions, that holiness should make relationships smooth. But Scripture offers something wiser. Holiness does not remove human weakness. It transforms how we respond to it. The apostles do not ignore the problem. They do not personalize it. They address it with clarity and trust.

“It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table.” At first, that can sound dismissive. But what follows reveals something deeper. They invite the community into the solution. They delegate responsibility. They trust others to lead. They do not tighten control. They build communion. There is a quiet wisdom here that speaks directly to our own lives. One of our most common struggles is the desire to carry too much, control too much, or fix too much. Sometimes out of generosity. Sometimes out of that quiet inner voice that says, “It will be quicker if I do it myself.” That voice has solved many small problems... and quietly created a few new ones.

The apostles resist that temptation. They remain anchored in what is essential for them, while allowing others to serve in ways that are just as meaningful. The Church is not meant to revolve around a few capable people doing everything. It grows through shared responsibility, mutual trust, and the humility to recognize that God works through many hands, not just our own. Even when those hands approach things differently than we would. And often, the problems themselves do not come from bad intentions, but from quiet oversights. No one set out to neglect the widows. It happened gradually, almost invisibly. Which is how division usually begins. Not with dramatic failure, but with small things left unattended.

And this is where the Gospel speaks gently but firmly into our lives. “Do not let your hearts be troubled.” Not because problems will disappear, but because Christ remains present within them. He does not promise a conflict-free life. He promises Himself. Peace, then, is not the absence of disagreement. It is the presence of purpose. It is the quiet confidence that even in imperfect moments, God is still at work, shaping something deeper and more united than we could create on our own.

There is a kind of wisdom that only comes with time. We begin to realize that unity is not built on everyone thinking the same way. It is built on patience, humility, and a shared commitment to something greater than ourselves. Sometimes it is even strengthened through the very conversations we would rather avoid. So the question is not whether we will face these moments. We will. The question is how we will respond. Will we move toward understanding or retreat into frustration. Will we try to control everything or learn to trust others. Will we allow small tensions to divide us, or let them refine us. The early Church offers a quiet answer. Stay rooted in what matters most. Share the work. Listen carefully. And trust that God is present, even in the imperfect unfolding of community life. Because in the end, it is not perfect agreement that holds us together. It is grace.

A Prayer for Peace in Moments of Tension

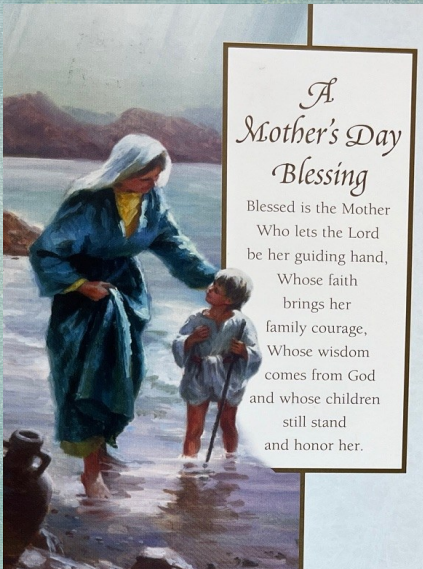
Lord, You know how easily small things

Amen.

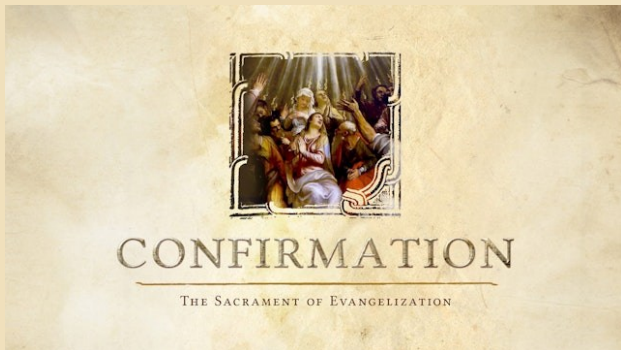

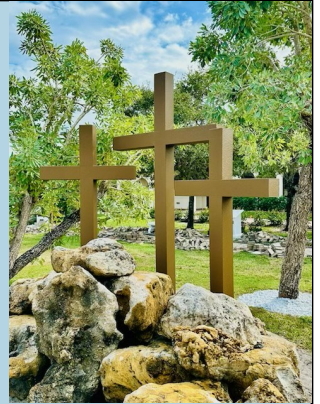

MEMORIAL BRICKS FOR THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS GARDEN



The St. Leo Stations of the Cross Garden is a sacred space to pray and reflect. Placing a brick in memory of a loved one, to mark a special event, or celebrate an anniversary is a timeless way to remember what matters most in our lives.

Memorial bricks may be ordered in two sizes, 4"x 8" (\$125) or 12"x12" (\$300). Brochures with more information and order forms are available in the parish office.

Our Capital Improvement Fund

St. Leo's Respect Life Ministry Why the Church in May Honors Mothers and Caregivers: Mary, Mother of Life

May has a way of revealing what was already there. Light stretches a little longer, gardens stir, and life quietly rises again. The Church, attentive to these rhythms, turns our eyes to Mary. Not simply as a figure from long ago, but as a living witness to how life is welcomed, protected, and sustained. Her "yes" was not a single moment of courage, but a lifelong offering of love, lived in ordinary days, in uncertainty, and even at the foot of the Cross. In her, we see that the work of nurturing life is rarely dramatic, but always sacred.

For this reason, the Church also honors mothers and caregivers in this month. Their work is often hidden, repeated, and easily overlooked, yet it holds families and communities together. They show us that real love is patient, steady, and willing to remain. Whether caring for children, supporting the sick, or accompanying the elderly, they reflect God's own tenderness in action. In a world that often measures worth by visibility and achievement, May invites us to see differently. To recognize that the quiet work of caring for others is not only valuable, it is essential. It is, in fact, a participation in the very love that gives life to the world.

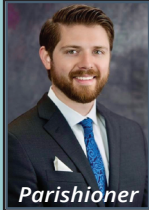
