

#### BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

#### RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear vour confession at another suitable time.

#### THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the mariage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

#### Sunday, November 23

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The Throne That Does Not Flinch

#### "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." (Luke 23:43)

Kings usually sit on polished thrones far from the turmoil. Christ reigns from two rough beams planted in the middle of human cruelty. The insult above His head is accidentally true, and the only one who seems to grasp it is a condemned criminal with nothing left to offer but a plea. While experts mock and soldiers gamble, a thief gives Jesus the one gift still in his possession: trust.

Saint Paul tells us that in Christ all things hold together. It does not always feel that way. Families fracture, institutions wobble, tempers flare on the evening news, and our own inner world can look more like a crowded courtroom than a kingdom of peace. Yet on Calvary, nothing looks "held together" except the love of God. That is exactly where the Lord chooses to reveal a different kind of power, one that does not flinch at sin, sorrow, or failure, but goes straight through them.

The good thief reminds us that holiness is not a lifetime achievement award but a final yes to the mercy that has been chasing us all along. The gates of Paradise swing open for the one who dares to say, "Remember me." If there is room for him, there is hope for us. Prayer: Christ my King, reign in the real world of my fears, my habits, my relationships. When I am tempted to measure worth by strength or success, remind me that Your throne is mercy. Remember me when I forget You, and turn my last minute prayers into the beginning of

#### Monday, November 24

#### Memorial of Saint Andrew Dung Lac, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs Quiet Choices, Strong Souls

#### "Please test your servants for ten days." (Daniel 1:12)

Daniel and his friends do not stage a rebellion; they make a request. No slogans, no outrage, just a quiet line drawn in the heart and lived at the table. Surrounded by pressure to blend in, they choose fidelity over flavor. Their reward is not frailty but a strength and wisdom even a pagan king cannot ignore.

The martyrs we honor today did the same on a larger scale. They did not hate their persecutors or savor their own heroism; they simply refused to pretend that anyone but Christ was Lord. Most of our tests are smaller: saying something kind when gossip starts, closing the laptop when resentment tempts us to scroll for fuel, keeping prayer when the day feels too full and we feel too empty. Heaven notices.

Courage is rarely loud. More often it sounds like a gentle no or a quiet yes. Daniel's vegetables and the widow's coins belong to the same spiritual family. Both whisper to God, "I am Yours, even when no one is cheering."

**Prayer:** Lord, give me integrity in the small, inconvenient, unseen places. When compromise looks easier and approval feels addictive, strengthen my heart to say yes to You. Make my quiet choices a hidden praise. Amen. Daniel 1:1 to 20; Daniel 3:52 to 56; Luke 21:1 to 4

#### Tuesday, November 25

#### The Kingdom Without a Pedestal

#### "The stone that struck the statue became a great mountain and filled the whole earth." (Daniel 2:35)

Nebuchadnezzar dreams in metals and power: gold, silver, bronze, iron, all stacked like a monument to human achievement. Impressive, yes, but standing on fragile feet of clay. One unassuming stone, not cut by human hands, brings the whole structure down and quietly grows into a mountain that fills the earth. God seems strangely fond of underwhelming beginnings.

Our world still loves statues, even if we now build them with brands, titles, and follower counts. We polish our images, calculate our alliances, and forget how quickly one illness, one failure, one shift in history can crumble the pedestal. Meanwhile, the kingdom of God slips into the world through things that rarely trend: patient parents, honest workers, hidden intercessors, ordinary believers who forgive seventy times seven.

The real question is not whether we admire the statue, but whether we stand on stone that lasts. The mountain is already growing. Each small act of trust and sacrifice is another foothold in what cannot be shaken.

**Prayer:** God of all ages, free me from worshiping what is shiny and temporary. When I cling to false security, gently topple what cannot save me, and plant my life on Your quiet, unshakable love. Amen. Daniel 2:31 to 45; Daniel 3:57 to 61; Luke 21:5 to 11

#### Wednesday, November 26

#### The Handwriting on Our Hearts

#### "You have been weighed on the scales and found wanting." (Daniel 5:27)

Belshazzar drinks from sacred vessels as if they were party glasses, praising gods of gold and stone while ignoring the Lord who holds his next breath. Then a mysterious hand appears and writes on the wall. It is the most sobering moment of his life and probably the quietest that banquet hall has ever been. Judgment arrives in three words and no speeches. We may not see glowing letters above our dinner table, but God still writes warnings in our days: a troubled conscience, an uneasy peace, a conversation that hits too close, a child's question we cannot dodge. These are not divine attempts to embarrass us but invitations to

wake up before we drift too far. The Lord who weighs us is also the one who wants to heal what is missing.

The saints do not fear examination because they know who is holding the scales. Holiness is not perfection on display; it is honesty in motion. Better to read the writing now, with grace near at hand, than to pretend the wall is blank.

Prayer: Lord, if there is writing on the walls of my life, help me not to look away. Show me where I am found wanting, not to crush me, but to free me. Give me the courage to change while there is still music and mercy. Amen. Daniel 5:1 to 28; Daniel 3:62 to 67; Luke 21:12 to 19

#### Thursday, November 27

Thanksgiving Day

The One Who Turned Back

#### "And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice." (Luke 17:15)

Ten lepers cry for mercy, and all ten receive it. Only one returns. Jesus seems less offended by the numbers than saddened by the missed joy. Gratitude does not increase the miracle; it completes it. The Samaritan realizes that the blessing is not just clear skin but a new relationship. He does not simply get his life back; he finds the Giver.

On a day filled with recipes, football, and strategic seating charts, it is easy to treat gratitude like seasoning sprinkled on a very full plate. Yet real thanksgiving is not an item on the menu; it is a way of seeing. It notices that the people who irritate us are also the ones who have carried us. It recognizes that every breath, every second chance, every quiet protection we never saw is evidence of a patient love.

The nine are not monsters. They are busy. They hurry back to normal. The one who returns chooses wonder instead. That is the road where faith becomes worship and ordinary days become holy. May your Thanksgiving be more than a meal. May it be a turning back, a rediscovery of the Giver in every gift, and a reminder that joy begins where gratitude remembers to look up.

**Prayer:** Giver of every good gift, rescue me from casual blessings taken for granted. Open my eyes to see how deeply I have been carried, forgiven, and surrounded. Make my gratitude loud enough to honor You and gentle enough to bless others. Amen. Sirach 50:22 to 24; Psalm 145; 1 Corinthians 1:3 to 9; Luke 17:11 to 19

#### Friday, November 28

#### When Beasts Roar and Heaven Does Not Panic

"His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away." (Daniel 7:14)
Daniel's night is crowded with monsters: winged lions, lurching bears, leopards with too
many heads, and a final beast that defies description. It feels like watching the evening news
with the volume too loud. Yet above all this chaos, thrones are set in place. The Ancient One
sits, luminous and calm, and one like a Son of Man receives a kingdom that no beast can

Every generation is tempted to think, "This is it. The worst time. The loudest beast." Maybe. Maybe not. The point of Daniel's vision is not to feed our charts, but to anchor our hearts. Empires strut and stagger. Trends rise and fall. Algorithms shout. God does not hold emergency sessions. The Son of Man is still handed the kingdom.

Faith does not mean ignoring the claws and teeth of history. It means remembering that they are on a leash. The final word is not terror, but a rule of mercy that will never be voted out.

**Prayer:** Ancient of Days, when the world feels unhinged and my thoughts follow close behind, seat my heart beside Your throne. Help me trust that Your Son's quiet victory outlasts every roaring power. Amen. Daniel 7:2 to 14; Daniel 3:75 to 81; Luke 21:29 to 33

#### Saturday, November 29

#### Awake for the Right Reasons

#### "Be vigilant at all times and pray that you may have the strength to stand before the Son of Man." (Luke 21:36)

Daniel is shaken by visions and beasts, by timelines and threats, until an angel quietly assures him that in the end the kingdom belongs to the holy ones. Jesus, for His part, warns us not so much about monsters as about drowsy hearts. The real danger is to be lulled to sleep by pleasure, worry, or endless distraction until the great moment of meeting finds us spiritually in our pajamas.

Christian vigilance is not nervous doom watching. It is the alertness of someone in love, staying awake not to calculate dates but to welcome a Person. It remembers that every choice leans us either toward deeper communion or quieter indifference. The Lord is not trying to catch us in a trap, but to keep us from drifting so far that joy feels like a surprise we are not ready for.

Perhaps holiness can be summed up simply: live so that if Christ walked into your day at any moment, you would not need to scramble to hide anything. You would just stand up, a little amazed, and say, "I was hoping it was You."

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, wake what is sleepy in me. Shake loose the habits, excuses, and mild addictions that steal my freedom. Teach me to live each day ready to look into Your eyes without fear, only gratitude. Amen. Daniel 7:15 to 27; Daniel 3:82 to 87; Luke 21:34 to 36

# THE THRONE THAT LOOKS LIKE A CROSS

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe ~ Luke 23:35–43

If you have ever chaired a parish committee (except St. Leo, of course), you already know that thrones are seldom comfortable and never quiet. Everyone wants progress, no one wants change, and by the end of the meeting, you would gladly trade the crown for a nap. Leadership, even in its smallest form, rarely feels majestic. It feels like standing in the tension between gratitude and grumbling, between the desire to serve and the temptation to escape.

That is why Christ the King Sunday always lands with such unexpected beauty. The Gospel gives us no golden palace, no trumpet fanfare, no circle of loyal followers. Instead, our King reigns from two rough beams planted in the middle of human cruelty. He wears a crown of thorns, and His throne is a cross.

The scene could not look less like victory. Soldiers gamble for scraps. Experts mock. Spectators sneer. The only one who seems to recognize the majesty before him is a condemned criminal with nothing left to offer but a final plea: "Jesus, remember me." And Jesus, with royal calm, replies, "Today you will be with me in Paradise." It is the strangest coronation in history and also the truest.

#### A Kingdom That Turns Power Inside Out

The world admires power that dominates, that controls, that secures results. Christ rules by surrender. His throne is not lifted above human suffering; it is planted firmly within it. His rule is not maintained by fear but by forgiveness. His kingdom has no borders, no army, no treasury, and yet it outlasts every empire that ever raised a sword.

This feast reminds us that the King we serve does not govern by the logic of this world. His authority is not enforced but offered. His subjects are not

coerced but invited. His victory does not erase pain; it redeems it from within.

Most of us spend our days trying to build small kingdoms of comfort, success, or control. But those kingdoms tremble. One illness, one loss, one

disappointment, and they begin to crumble. Christ's kingdom does not tremble because it is founded on self gift, not self preservation. Love is the only power that cannot be dethroned.

And here, just days before Thanksgiving, gratitude becomes the daily act of stepping out of those fragile kingdoms and into His. Every thank you we offer, whether for a warm meal, a kind word, or a mercy we did not deserve, is an act of citizenship in His realm. Gratitude dethrones pride and enthrones love.

#### The Astonishing Logic of the Cross

If we are honest, the cross still offends our instincts. It is absurd that salvation should come through apparent defeat. It is absurd that the Almighty should refuse to save Himself in order to save others. Yet this divine absurdity is the seed of all hope. It means that no sorrow, however deep, is beyond redemption. It means that weakness is not wasted, that tears carry authority, that compassion is stronger than coercion. On Calvary, God does not explain suffering; He shares it. He takes the full weight of cruelty and transforms it into mercy.

And gratitude is born there, at the intersection of pain and love. True thanksgiving does not wait for everything to be perfect; it begins when we recognize that even in loss, God is near. Every Eucharist, which means "thanksgiving," draws us back to this truth: that our King reigns not by taking, but by giving Himself completely. Every Mass is a royal banquet where love conquers pride and where heaven quietly whispers, You have more to be thankful for than you can ever count.

#### The King Who Does Not Flinch

Every throne built by human hands eventually trembles. Power built on applause fades when the crowd grows silent. Strength built on pride collapses when life humbles it. Even the most confident heart falters when its plans unravel. But Christ's throne does not tremble. It absorbs every blow and still forgives.

At the heart of this solemnity stands Saint Paul's astonishing truth: "In Christ all things hold together." That includes our families, our failures, our futures, and every uncertain place where we fear the pieces will never fit again. Even when the world seems to fracture, Christ remains the center that holds.

To live under His kingship is to trust that love has the final word. It means standing beneath the cross not as spectators but as citizens of His kingdom, one where mercy outweighs judgment and hope endures longer than despair. It means learning to see divine order within human confusion, divine peace within the storm, and divine presence within pain. Gratitude, then, is not sentiment; it is strength. It is the quiet defiance of faith that says, "Christ still reigns." When we give thanks in the middle of hardship, we declare our allegiance to a kingdom that does not flinch.

#### The Humor of Heaven

There is a kind of holy humor in the whole story. The soldiers who mocked Him, the rulers who sentenced Him, the sign they nailed above His head, each was meant as ridicule, yet each proclaimed the truth. "This is the King of the Jews." They meant it as sarcasm. Heaven meant it as revelation.

Perhaps God Himself smiled at the irony. Humanity tried to dethrone Him, and He turned the instrument of death into His throne. The world designed a cross for humiliation, and God used it for coronation. This is the laughter of divine love, quiet,

And maybe Thanksgiving, in its simplest form, is our way of joining that divine laughter: seeing grace where the world sees loss, finding blessing where the world sees burden, and giving thanks not because everything is easy, but because love is still alive.

#### Citizens of a Different Kingdom

We live in an age where outrage is currency and humility is mistaken for weakness. But Christ the King shows us that real strength does not shout. It bleeds. It forgives. It keeps loving.

Our King is not distant. He reigns in hospital rooms and kitchen tables, in moments of patience, in hidden acts of generosity, in faith that refuses to give up. He reigns every time forgiveness outpaces resentment, every time gratitude wins over entitlement, every time faith survives disappointment.


So when we gather this Thanksgiving, around tables or hospital beds, in laughter or in quiet, we are not just celebrating a national holiday. We are acknowledging a kingdom that cannot be shaken. Gratitude is its language. Love is its law. And joy, even in sorrow, is its crown.

Yes, the throne looks like a cross. The crown looks like thorns. The royal decree sounds like mercy. But this is the only kingdom that will last forever, the one built not on fear of losing but on love that never stops giving.

And when we finally stand before that King, He will not test us on knowledge or achievement. He will ask only one question: Did you learn to love like

I did, from the cross outward?

If we can answer yes, even tremblingly, then we will hear again the royal promise spoken to a dying man who saw what no one else could: "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

# CHRIST THE KING

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST KING OF THE UNIVERSE

The Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe is celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, before the beginning of Advent that starts the new Church Year. As the last Sunday of the year, Christ the King Sunday is the conclusion of the Church's liturgical journey through the life of Christ and the gospel message. Its purpose is to celebrate the coming reign of Christ as ruler of the renewed creation that will characterize the fullness of the Kingdom of God. That hope is born from the entire life of Christ and his teachings that we have been celebrating during the past twelve months.

The first Sunday of Advent follows Christ the King Sunday and consequently, a new cycle of Sunday Mass readings, drawn from a different Gospel, begins the new cycle of the Church Year.

#### History

The Solemnity of Christ the King is a newer feast in the Catholic Church that was instituted by Pope Pius XI in his encyclical Quas Primas in 1925.

At the time, secularism was on the rise with the establishment of non-Christian dictatorships in Europe and many Christians began to doubt Christ's existence and authority. In response, Pius XI established the feast with the intent to reaffirm and refocus faith and respect for the kingship of Jesus and as the ruler over both creation and history.

#### Christ as King

Christians have long celebrated Jesus as Christ, and various aspects of his reign are celebrated in Advent (when Christians wait for his second coming in glory), Christmas (when his star

reveals him to be "King of the Jews"), Holy Week (when he is the crucified king), Easter (when he is resurrected in power and glory), and the Ascension (when he returns to the glory he had with the Father before the world was created).

Originally, the feast was celebrated on the final Sunday of October, prior to All Saints Day.

In 1969, to emphasize its importance, Pope Paul VI moved the feast to the last Sunday before Advent. So now the old liturgical year ends by celebrating Christ's kingship and the new year begins with Advent, when we await the coming of Christ to rule our hearts and lives.






