

BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear vour confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Sunday, October 12 The Tenth Thank You

"Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." (Luke 17:19)

The generals arrive with motorcades and speeches. Naaman arrives with a skin he cannot fix and a pride he cannot hide. God asks him to do something small and humbling: to dip in an ordinary river again and again. When he rises clean, he finally knows what power looks like. It is not swagger. It is mercy.

Ten lepers lift one prayer and receive one miracle. Only one returns to lift a second prayer, the one called *thank you*. Perhaps gratitude is the second half of every healing. The first half makes us whole. The second half makes us new.

Paul sits in chains and smiles because the Word is not chained. Grace keeps slipping under the prison door. If today you feel stuck, try the one move that is always available. Thank God out loud. Gratitude is a key that still turns in every lock.

*Prayer: Jesus, Master, teach me the second prayer. Make my thank you as loud as my plea. Amen. 2 Kings 5:14–17; Psalm 98; 2 Timothy 2:8–13; 1 Thessalonians 5:18; Luke 17:11–19

Monday, October 13

Looking for a Louder Sign

"This generation seeks a sign, but no sign will be given it except the sign of Jonah." (Luke 11:29)

Crowds press in, hungry for fireworks. Jesus offers Jonah instead, a prophet who ran, a city that repented, a queen who traveled far for wisdom. The lesson is almost simple enough to miss. Heaven's brightest signs are not in the sky. They are in the changed heart and the humbled mind.

We are fond of bargains with God: Send me a signal, then I will obey. Jesus smiles and flips the order: Obey, then you will see. Faith is not blind; faith just walks before it measures.

If you are waiting for a dramatic message written in the clouds, try the quieter message already written in your conscience, in Scripture, and in the faces of the people you avoid. There is something greater than Solomon here, and He is speaking. **Prayer:** Lord, tune my ears to wisdom and my will to obedience. Let my yes become the sign You can use. Amen. Romans 1:1–7; Psalm 98; Psalm 95:8; Luke 11:29–32

Tuesday, October 14 Inside the Cup

"Give alms, and behold, everything will be clean for you." (Luke 11:41)

Paul points to a universe that is always preaching. The heavens are a cathedral of constant homilies. Even a quiet night is full of God's voice if we let our hurry sit down for a minute.

A Pharisee is startled that Jesus skips the ritual washing. Jesus is startled that anyone could polish a cup and forget the soul that will drink from it. The Lord does not embarrass us for caring about the outside, He just refuses to let us stop there. Give alms, He says, and everything will be clean. Generosity is the soap that reaches places water cannot.

If you have been scrubbing your image while ignoring your interior life, try a very old remedy. Give something away: time, money, attention. You may find that the stain you could not reach begins to lift.

Prayer: Maker of my inside and outside, wash me with Your mercy and make me useful for love. Amen. Romans 1:16–25; Psalm 19; Hebrews 4:12; Luke 11:37–41

Wednesday, October 15

Kindness That Converts

"By your stubbornness you are storing up wrath for yourself, but God's kindness leads you to repentance." (Romans 2:4)

Saint Teresa of Jesus knew that a little cell with God is larger than a palace without Him. She wanted a heart so free that nothing could rent space there except love.

Paul warns that harsh judgments ricochet. We become what we condemn when we forget that the kindness of God leads to repentance. Jesus warns religious experts who load people with heavy packs and never offer a hand. Holiness does not admire its own strength. Holiness helps someone carry their groceries.

Try this today: trade one criticism for one concrete kindness. Listen without the quick verdict. Lift a burden you did not cause. The Lord who knows His sheep will recognize you by that sound.

Prayer: Jesus, make my judgments slow and my mercy quick. Teach me the freedom of a humble, spacious heart. Amen. Romans 2:1–11; Psalm 62; John 10:27; Luke 11:42–46

Thursday, October 16

No Boasting, Only Wonder

"All have sinned and are deprived of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

Paul brings us to the bright center. All have sinned. All are justified freely. We do not climb into grace by effort. Grace stoops and carries us. Faith is not a trophy on our shelf. It is the open hand that finally stops pretending and lets God be God.

Jesus laments a generation that honors prophets with stone but ignores them in practice. We build monuments to voices we will not hear. We polish keys and then hide the door. Meanwhile, the psalmist cries from the depths and finds a God whose mercy is deeper still.

If you are tired of performing, breathe. The Father is not asking for a résumé. He is asking for trust. When you stop boasting and start marveling, you will find that doors begin to open.

Prayer: Father, I bring empty hands. Fill them with Your forgiveness, and teach me to live like a person set free. Amen. Romans 3:21–30; Psalm 130; John 14:6; Luke 11:47–54

Friday, October 17

More Than Many Sparrows

"Even the hairs of your head have all been counted." (Luke 12:7)

Ignatius of Antioch wrote letters on the way to his death, each page warm with courage and joy. He had learned the lesson Jesus teaches today. Do not fear the ones who can touch the body. Live with awe before the One who holds your soul. Then notice the small birds. Notice that not one slips past the Father's eye. If He counts the hairs on your head, you can stop counting your anxieties.

Paul reaches back to Abraham. Righteousness was credited not as a wage but as a gift. Try to earn love and you will be exhausted. Receive love and you will be changed. The forgiven become brave.

If fear has been steering your week, trade it for wonder. Speak the Name of Jesus out loud. Say it on your commute. Say it while washing dishes. It is hard to panic while you are praying.

Prayer: God of sparrows and martyrs, write courage in my bones and joy in my obedience. Amen. Romans 4:1–8; Psalm 32; Psalm 33:22; Luke 12:1–7

Saturday, October 18

Travel Light, Give Peace

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few." (Luke 10:2)

Paul misses his cloak and asks for his books. Even saints have errands. He also names his friends and the hurts that still sting. Yet one sentence glows: *The Lord stood by me and gave me strength*. That line could be the biography of every disciple.

Jesus sends seventy-two with pockets that jingle less and hearts that carry more. No spare sandals, but plenty of peace. Do not hover for better hospitality. Stay where you are sent and cure what you can. The Kingdom is near enough to touch.

If you feel under supplied for your mission, good. That is how the story works. Travel lighter than your fears suggest. Offer peace to the first doorway you meet. Eat what is set before you without grumbling about the menu. You may find that the Kingdom has already arrived for the person across the table.

Prayer: Lord of the harvest, send me where You wish, keep me light on my feet, and let my presence speak peace. Amen. 2 Timothy 4:10–17; Psalm 145; John 15:16; Luke 10:1–9

When Only One Turns Back: Learning to Notice the Good

"One of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice." (Luke 17:15) by Father Jarek

There is a small ritual you may notice at the Publix parking lot. After checking out, people wheel their carts toward their cars, load the bags, and then at that crucial moment half will carefully return the cart to the rack. The other half? They give it a gentle shove and trust the wind. I have often thought that our world could be divided into two kinds of people: the ones who return the cart, and the ones who do not. It is a small gesture, but it reveals something larger, how we respond to gifts we did not earn and moments that ask for a little effort in return.

Jesus might have said something similar about gratitude. Ten lepers cry out for mercy, all ten are healed, but only one turns back to say thank you. The other nine keep walking, perhaps eager to show off their new skin, to reunite with family, to start living again. Who can blame them? Yet the Gospel lingers on the one who paused, turned around, and noticed. It is that simple verb, noticed, that pierces the heart.

The Gift of Noticing

Gratitude begins not in manners but in awareness. It is not about saying the right words after receiving something; it is about seeing something you could have missed. Scripture gives us another example of someone who almost missed his miracle because he was looking for something grander.

Naaman the Syrian expected a prophet's spell, a bit of holy drama. Instead, Elisha told him to take a bath, seven times, in muddy water. Offended, Naaman started to leave, until someone talked him down: If the prophet had asked for something difficult, would you not have done it?

Naaman obeys reluctantly and comes out clean. Then comes the true miracle: he sees. He sees that the God of Israel is the only God worth serving. That kind of seeing is rarer than healing. Like the Samaritan leper, Naaman had to learn that gratitude begins in humility, that God's grace often hides in the ordinary. Most of us, if we are honest, live like the nine lepers, rushing toward the next thing without ever really noticing the last miracle. We pray for healing, find it, and move on. We pray for help, receive it, and forget. We complain of rain, then fail to give thanks when the sun returns. Gratitude requires interruption. It asks us to stop midstride and turn back.

The Noise of Negativity

Our world trains us in the opposite direction. We live in what some sociologists call the culture of complaint. The news thrives on outrage. Social media rewards discontent. Even dinner conversations can turn into competitive complaining: who had the worse traffic, the harder week, the more annoying neighbor. To say thank you sincerely today is not only good manners, it is a mark of discipleship. Gratitude feels almost countercultural, a small rebellion against cynicism. It means choosing to notice what is still good, still beautiful, still redeemable, even in the midst of what is broken.

Psychologists have long confirmed what Scripture already knew: gratitude rewires the heart. It does not erase pain, but it restores perspective. It teaches us to see that our lives are not problems to be solved but gifts to be received. The challenge is that gratitude requires attention, and attention is the rarest form of generosity. We cannot be thankful for what we refuse to see.

The Eucharistic Vision

If gratitude begins in noticing, the Eucharist teaches us what to notice, everything. In Greek, the word *Eucharist* literally means thanksgiving. At every Mass, we practice what the Samaritan leper did: we turn back. We take bread, bless it, break it, and give thanks. Ordinary food becomes a vessel of divine grace simply because it is noticed, lifted up, and blessed.

The miracle is not just what happens on the altar; it is what begins to happen in us. Week after week, the Eucharist retrains our eyes. We learn to notice God in small, daily mercies, in the morning light through the blinds, in laughter over coffee, in a conversation that mends what pride once tore. To live eucharistically is to live alert, to carry that posture of gratitude into traffic jams, doctor's offices, and even difficult family dinners. It is to whisper, again and again, "The Lord has done wondrous deeds."

Gratitude with a Smile

Of course, gratitude does not come naturally. It often begins in humor, that gentle awareness of how easily we miss the obvious. We ask God for patience, and He sends us a slow cashier. We pray for peace, and our phone rings with a relative who tests it. Heaven, it seems, has a quiet sense of irony. Sometimes our thank you has to grow through moments like these, through realizing how often we have been rescued, taught, or humbled without even knowing it. Humor softens the soul, creating room for grace to enter. It reminds us that we are not gods but grateful guests.

The Samaritan who returned was doubly an outsider, a foreigner and a former leper, yet he is the one who makes Jesus smile. Maybe gratitude always looks a little foolish to the efficient. It stops when everyone else keeps walking. It bends down to praise when others are rushing to plan. But heaven measures things differently.

Gratitude as Vision

At the end of the story, Jesus says to the grateful man, "Your faith has saved you." Not your manners, not your enthusiasm, but your faith. Gratitude and faith, it seems, are two sides of the same coin. Both involve trust in what we cannot see, the faith that God is present, and the gratitude that He already has been. Faith without gratitude becomes grim. Gratitude without faith becomes shallow. Together they make a soul radiant. So perhaps the question for us this Sunday is simple: How often do I turn back?

When was the last time you stopped in the middle of a busy day and said, "Lord, thank you, not because everything is perfect, but because You are here"? When was the last time you looked at your life not through the lens of what is missing but through the lens of what has been given?

If we could recover that art of noticing, of returning, of glorifying God in a loud voice, we might rediscover the joy that modern life has quietly misplaced. "The Lord has revealed to the nations His saving power." (Psalm 98:2) And perhaps, if you listen closely, even amid the hum of traffic and shopping carts, you might hear it, the quiet sound of one grateful guest turning back to say, "Thank you."




