BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear your confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the mariage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Sunday, October 26

The Prayer That Pierces the Clouds

"The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds." (Sirach 35:17)

Some prayers rise like incense; others crawl through tears and still reach heaven first. The tax collector in the temple offers no theology, no résumé, just breath and honesty. God hears that sound as clearly as thunder. Meanwhile, the Pharisee polishes his virtue until it blinds even himself. Heaven waits through his monologue in silence, unmoved.

Paul writes with the peace of a man who has emptied his cup for Christ and found the taste of joy at the bottom. His words carry the fragrance of surrender: I have kept the faith. There is a strange freedom in being poured out, nothing left to protect, nothing left to prove. Humility, not eloquence, makes the prayer soar.

So pray today with both feet on the ground. Speak small words, but let them come from deep water. The sky may seem closed, but remember, God's ear is nearer than your pulse. And when your words falter, let your silence finish the prayer; heaven understands sighs better than speeches.

Prayer: Lord, strip my words of pretense and fill them with truth. Teach me to pray, not as a performer, but as one beloved. Amen.

Monday, October 27

Standing Tall Again

"Woman, you are set free of your infirmity." (Luke 13:12)

Eighteen years. Imagine the horizon forgotten, the spine folded over like a question mark. Then Jesus speaks, and the question becomes an exclamation. One sentence, no thunder, no ceremony, and she stands tall for the first time in a generation. Dust gives way to daylight. Worship begins not in the synagogue but in the posture of her body.

Paul calls us heirs, not slaves. That word, *heirs*, sounds almost reckless in its generosity. We belong not as servants cowering by the door but as children who have learned to run again. Fear bends us; love lifts us.

If life has stooped you with disappointment, hear this: Christ still calls you by name. Lift your soul. There is a new horizon waiting at eye level. And when you rise, take someone's hand beside you, so grace can stand two hearts tall.

Prayer: Abba, raise what has fallen in me. Teach me again the dignity of a soul standing tall in Your light. Amen.

Tuesday, October 28 Built Together

"Through him the whole structure is held together." (Ephesians 2:21)

Every cathedral begins as dust and stubborn hope. The mortar is patience; the blueprint, prayer. Saints Simon and Jude never sought grandeur; they were foundation stones, invisible under centuries of grace. God builds with quiet hands and prefers the sound of humility to applause.

Jesus spends the night in prayer before choosing the Twelve. He prays over fishermen, tax collectors, and one man destined to betray Him. Heaven chooses with eyes that see beyond résumé and failure. What holds the Church together is not strength but surrender, the willingness to be fitted wherever love requires.

So if you feel ordinary today, remember the apostles who were, too. The ordinary becomes sacred the moment it bears the weight of another soul. Together we become a living temple, each small stone indispensable.

Prayer: Master Builder, set me firm in the wall of Your mercy. May my life, however small, help hold the world together in love. Amen.

Wednesday, October 29

The Narrow Door and the Spacious Heart

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate." (Luke 13:24)

The question is statistical: "Will only a few be saved?" Jesus refuses the math and gives us a doorway. It is narrow, yes, but not because heaven is stingy. Love simply cannot be carried in bulk. To pass through, you must let go of luggage: grudges, self importance, the well folded scorecard of comparison.

Paul speaks of a Spirit that prays when we cannot. Even our wordless sighs become music in God's hands. Grace knows the way through tight spaces. The narrow door

opens into a banquet; its small entrance only makes the welcome more astonishing.

So travel light today. Forgive before you are asked. Pray even when your words wobble. Heaven's door is closer than you think, and wider than it looks from the outside. Once you step through, leave the door open for the next weary traveler.

Prayer: Lord, unclench my hands so I may pass freely through Your mercy. Teach me to love without luggage. Amen.

Thursday, October 30

Nothing Can Separate

"What will separate us from the love of Christ?" (Romans 8:35)

Paul's words sound like a defiant hymn sung from the middle of a storm. He names every possible enemy of love, death, life, angels, demons, the future, the past, and strikes each from the record. Nothing holds. Love remains. It is the one law the universe never manages to repeal.

When Jesus calls Herod a fox, He is not being clever; He is naming a predator whose noise cannot silence compassion. Then, like a mother hen, He spreads His wings over a city that will not be gathered. That image alone could save theology from itself, power bending down into tenderness.

If you feel hunted by worry or guilt, step beneath those wings. Fear counts losses; love counts feathers. Beneath that shelter, even the trembling can rest. And once you have found peace there, become that shelter for someone else; the safest wings are those that learn to open.

Prayer: Christ, keep me within the reach of Your mercy. When I scatter, call me back to the warmth beneath Your wings. Amen.

Friday, October 31

Dinner with the Watchers

"They were observing him carefully." (Luke 14:1)

Jesus walks into a dinner party where the main course is scrutiny. Eyes flicker over Him like candlelight. The man with dropsy sits swollen and silent, suffering invited but not welcomed. The question hovers: will He heal or behave? He heals, of course. Love never waits for polite permission.

Paul writes of anguish for his own people, a love so fierce he would trade his soul for theirs. Only hearts stretched by divine mercy can speak like that. Maybe that is the hidden miracle of this dinner: Jesus eating with those who misunderstand Him and still breaking bread. Grace keeps pulling up extra chairs.

If your table tonight holds tension or silence, set an extra place for Christ. He is good with awkward pauses and excellent at softening them. His quiet presence can turn even scrutiny into grace.

Prayer: Lord, let compassion be my etiquette. Where conversation grows cold, make my presence warm. Sit with us until peace tastes familiar. Amen.

Saturday, November 1

The View from the Mountain

"Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God." (Matthew 5:8)

John's vision spills beyond counting, faces from every border and accent, robes washed, palms waving like green alleluias. The saints are not marble statues but people who kept walking toward mercy until it changed their shape. They carry the scent of struggle and the shine of grace.

The Beatitudes read like the family photo album of heaven: the meek smiling shyly, the mourners finally comforted, the merciful still wiping someone's tears out of habit. No one poses, they simply belong. Purity of heart is not flawlessness; it is seeing God everywhere and refusing to give up on love.

So climb the mountain again. Look down on the world not with pride but with tenderness. You are already part of that great crowd in the making, robes still in the wash, hearts still learning the rhythm of mercy. Keep walking toward the light; your place at the feast is already being set.

Prayer: Lord, let my heart grow transparent enough to catch Your light. Make my life a quiet beatitude others can glimpse and give thanks for. Amen.

The Crown Nobody Sees

(Based on Sirach 35:12-18; Psalm 34; 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18; Luke 18:9-14)

There is a kind of person heaven delights in, the one who keeps goodness alive quietly. They are not loud or dramatic. You might not notice them unless you look closely: the caregiver who stays late, the volunteer who keeps stacking chairs after everyone has gone home, the parent who whispers a final prayer after the lights are out. Their work rarely trends, but it holds the world together.

Saint Paul must have had such people in mind when he wrote, "I have competed well, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." Those words sound victorious, but he wrote them from prison with no crowds, no applause, only a man at peace with what he gave. His race was never about winning but about staying faithful, one step at a time. That is how the crown of righteousness is earned, by finishing with love, not fame.

The tax collector in Jesus' parable understood that truth. He does not make a speech or defend himself; he simply says, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." That short, trembling prayer carries more grace than a lifetime of self promotion. Jesus says it was he, not the proud Pharisee, who went home right with God. Heaven listens differently than we do. It hears humility before it hears credentials.

There are moments in every age when humility is mistaken for weakness and mockery passes for courage. Voices grow louder, as if shouting proved wisdom. Dignity and respect for others begin to sound old fashioned. But whenever truth is used to wound rather than to heal, something sacred is lost. The line between confidence and cruelty can vanish before we notice, and when it does, both truth and mercy fall silent. A people cannot live on derision; hearts cannot be lifted by scorn.

That is why the quiet souls matter so much. The woman who still writes thank you notes. The man who drives his neighbor to treatment. The grandmother who prays for faces she barely remembers. They live without spectacle, but they carry the light that keeps faith human. If you listen carefully, you can almost hear heaven applaud. Their faith is not glamorous, but it is steady and bright.

The crown Paul speaks of is not a jeweled trophy for a few elites. It is a quiet radiance that forms in anyone who loves without reward, who forgives without being asked, who serves without being seen. The Church is filled with these hidden saints, people who polish halos they will never notice and whose reward will surprise them because they never thought of earning one.

So keep doing the quiet good. Keep the faith when no one seems to care. Keep showing up, forgiving, setting the table, folding the linens, and whispering the prayers that only God hears. The Lord stood by Paul; He stands by you.

And when you reach your finish line with no medals, no headlines, just a soul poured out, you will find what Paul found: the Lord already waiting, holding a crown that shines only on the humble.

Prayer

Lord, when I grow tired of unseen goodness, remind me that You see it all.

Teach me to measure my life not by applause but by love given.

Let faithfulness be its own joy until the crown You promise becomes simply the light of Your face.

Amen.







Ante Dios no podemos fingir ni aparentar: Él nos conoce profundamente. Por más cara de buenos que pongamos, Él ve más allá: ve nuestro corazón. Tampoco podemos decirle cuán buenos somos, porque nos conoce y sabe perfectamente nuestras acciones. Hoy, Jesús nos cuenta otra parábola: la de dos hombres que fueron al templo a orar. Cada uno lo hace a su manera, y al escuchar el relato, nos damos cuenta de que uno lo hace mejor que el otro. Pero lo más importante es que los dos hablan con Dios. Con este ejemplo podemos aprender a orar y a presentarnos ante Dios tal como somos. "Efectivamente, el fariseo, a pesar de las obras, perdió la justicia; el publicano, en cambio, se granjeó la justicia por la humildad de sus palabras. Aunque, a decir verdad, la del publicano no era propiamente humildad: de hecho, la humildad se da cuando uno que es grande se humilla a sí mismo. La actitud del publicano no fue

humildad, sino verdad: sus palabras eran verdaderas, pues él era un pecador"- San Juan Crisóstomo (350–407), Homilía 2 sobre la Penitencia.

"Pero, aunque somos pecadores, no debemos desalentarnos, porque el Señor está con nosotros, quien nos ha dado todo y nos hará vencer también este pequeño paso de hoy, con la gracia de la fuerza, de la valentía, de la oración, de la vigilancia y de la alegría" (Papa Francisco). En conclusión: puede ser que en cada uno de nosotros vivan un fariseo y un publicano. Ambos necesitan de Dios para ser liberados y perdonados. Ante Dios, oremos con verdad y con sinceridad de corazón.
