BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear your confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical control and a time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Sunday, October 5 A Seed That Waits

"If it delays, wait for it" (Habakkuk 2:3)

The prophet's lament could be our own headline: ruin, violence, discord. Yet God answers with a vision that insists on patience. The just one lives not by outrage but by faith. We want quick fixes. God writes in longer sentences.

The apostles beg for more faith, and Jesus points to something so small it can hide under a fingernail. A mustard seed, too small to boast about, too mighty to measure when it grows. Faith is not glamorous; it is tenacious. It says yes when there is no applause. It waits, even when the waiting aches.

Perhaps the holiest line today is also the humblest: we have done what we were obliged to do. Heaven is not impressed by theatrics. Heaven smiles when we keep showing up.

Prayer: Patient Lord, write Your vision on my heart. Give me mustard seed courage to keep waiting and serving. Amen. Habakkuk 1:2–3; 2:2–4; Psalm 95; 2 Timothy 1:6–8, 13–14; Luke 17:5–10

Monday, October 6 Running the Wrong Way "You will rescue my life from the pit, O Lord" (Jonah 2:7)

Jonah buys a ticket to anywhere but Nineveh and promptly falls asleep during a storm. It is almost comic. When life gets messy, avoidance feels easier than obedience. But God loves us enough to chase us down with storms, strangers, and even fish.

The Samaritan in Jesus' story is Jonah's mirror opposite. Jonah flees from need; the Samaritan walks toward it. Jonah closes his eyes; the Samaritan opens his wallet. True mercy is not sentimental. It is costly and inconvenient.

If today you feel like Jonah, adrift, avoiding, or swallowed by troubles, take courage. God is not finished with you. And if today you meet a broken traveler by the roadside, do not cross to the other side. Mercy may be the shortest road back to God.

Prayer: Lord, when I run, find me. When I hide, wake me. Give me eyes to see the wounded and courage to stop. Amen. Jonah 1:1–2:1–2, 11; Jonah 2; John 13:34; Luke 10:25–37

Tuesday, October 7 Rosary Rhythm

"Blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it" (Luke 11:28)

Nineveh repents in a single day, while Jonah took three to learn obedience. Mercy is always faster than we expect, yet God gives it freely. The king steps down from his throne and sits in ashes, and the city is saved.

At Bethany, two sisters embody prayer: Martha with her hands, Mary with her ears. Both matter, but Jesus honors the listening heart. The Rosary is a school for both sisters. Fingers move bead to bead, while the soul sits quietly at His feet. Do not be ashamed if your thoughts wander while praying. Bring the wandering with you. Even distractions can become beads on the string if you keep offering them back. God is not measuring perfection. He is measuring love.

Prayer: Mary, teach me to ponder. Jesus, teach me to listen. Let my prayer be work and my work become prayer. Amen. Jonah 3:1–10; Psalm 130; Luke 11:28; Luke 10:38–42

Wednesday, October 8

The Shade and the Worm

"You are gracious and merciful, slow to anger" (Jonah 4:2)

Jonah sulks under a plant that grows overnight and dies by dawn. He loves the shade but resents the mercy that saves a city. It is easier to pity a plant than a people. We smile at Jonah, but are we so different? How quickly our moods rise and fall with comforts that will not last.

The disciples ask Jesus to teach them to pray. He answers with the prayer that has carried saints and sinners alike: Father, bread, forgiveness, deliver us. No ornaments, just essentials. The prayer is shade that does not wither, food that does not spoil.

God's question lingers: Should I not be concerned for Nineveh? And for you? And for the cattle too? The mercy of God spills wider than our grudges. The next time your comforts shrivel like Jonah's plant, remember that God's compassion has roots deeper than any shade and spreads wider than any sulk.

Prayer: Father, untangle my heart. Teach me to pray simply and to love generously. Amen. Jonah 4:1–11; Psalm 86; Romans 8:15; Luke 11:1–4

Thursday, October 9

The Midnight Friend

"Knock and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9)

Malachi hears the weary complaint: serving God seems useless, evil prospers. The Lord promises otherwise. Every faithful act is written in His book. No kindness is forgotten. No prayer is wasted.

Jesus imagines a man knocking at midnight until the neighbor relents. The point is not that God is cranky. The point is that persistence matters. To pray is to keep knocking, even when the door feels bolted. When the answer comes, it may not be the fish or the egg we asked for, but it will always be the Spirit who satisfies more than any gift.

Keep knocking. The door is not locked to keep you out but to draw you deeper in. And when the door finally opens, you may discover that the Giver Himself has been waiting inside all along with more than bread, with Himself.

Prayer: Generous Father, hear my knock. Give me the courage to keep asking until I find that You Yourself are the answer. Amen. Malachi 3:13–20b; Psalm 1; Acts 16:14; Luke 11:5–13

Friday, October 10 Empty Rooms Do Not Stay Empty "He governs the peoples with equity" (Psalm 9:9)

Joel sounds the trumpet: wake, fast, lament. His words are not melodrama but medicine. Sometimes the holiest act is to weep without excuse, because only honest tears clear space for mercy.

Jesus warns of a house swept clean but left vacant. Evil does not retire; it returns with reinforcements. A forgiven heart must become a filled heart. Otherwise, the same old voices come back louder than before. Holiness is not just subtraction. It is addition, filling the silence with psalms, the emptiness with acts of love.

The Stronger One has already entered the house. Let Him stay, and the squatters will not return. And if you keep the lamps lit with prayer and kindness, His presence will make the house not only safe but warm and welcoming for all who enter.

Prayer: Jesus, sweep clean my soul and stay within its walls. Fill me so fully that nothing dark can linger. Amen. Joel 1:13–15; 2:1–2; Psalm 9:2–3, 6, 16, 8–9; John 12:31–32; Luke 11:15–26

Saturday, October 11 Light in the Valley "Light dawns for the just" (Psalm 97:11)

Joel sees crowds in the valley of decision, a place where fear and hope wrestle. God roars from Zion not to frighten His children but to scatter their enemies. His voice shakes the earth, yet His heart is refuge for the faithful.

A woman blesses Mary's womb, and Jesus replies that true blessing is found in hearing and keeping the Word. Mary did both. The valley of decision is crossed not by dithering but by obedience, one clear yes at a time.

Choose today. Let His Word guide you in the valley, and light will break over your path like dawn. And when that light comes, it will not only show you where to walk, it will remind you who walks beside you, steadying every step.

Prayer: Lord, meet me in my decisions. Let Your Word be my compass and Your light my dawn. Amen. Joel 4:12–21; Psalm 97:1–2, 5–6, 11–12; Luke 11:28; Luke 11:27–28

Faith the Size of a Mustard Seed: Why the Church Advocates for Life at Every Stage By Father Jarek

The prophet Habakkuk cries out in anguish: "How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry out to you, 'Violence!' but you do not intervene." His lament is not foreign to us. At hospital bedsides, in the nightly news, or in endless streams of images online, we see suffering and wonder why God seems slow to act. Like the disciples in Luke's Gospel, we too whisper: "Increase our faith."

It is into this tension, between despair and hope, fear and faith, that the Church speaks her unrelenting message: every human life, from conception to natural death, is sacred. Not sometimes, not when convenient, not only when it fits our personal politics or passions, but always. Respect life is not a slogan. It is the Christian vision of the world.

God's Vision of Human Dignity

Habakkuk is told to write the vision clearly: "For the vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint." This vision is the heart of the Gospel: that every person is created in the image of God, endowed with dignity that cannot be earned or lost.

This dignity is not measured by strength, independence, wealth, or usefulness. It is bestowed by God Himself. That is why the Church stands for life even when the world scoffs. The unborn child who cannot speak, the elderly parent who can no longer remember, the worker who struggles to provide, even the prisoner who has committed terrible crimes, each life still bears God's imprint.

To see life through God's eyes is to embrace what society too often rejects. It is to say that weakness is not shame but invitation, that dependency is not failure but human truth, and that suffering does not erase worth but cries out for compassion. That vision becomes our responsibility, and it demands to be guarded.

Guarding the Treasure

Saint Paul tells Timothy: "Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit." He means the Gospel, but the Church has always understood that the treasure includes the lives entrusted to our care.

That guarding takes many forms. It means standing against abortion, which silences the most vulnerable voices. It means resisting euthanasia, which tempts us to see the sick as burdens rather than gifts. It means opposing violence in our streets and wars that disregard the innocent. It means caring for the poor, the marginalized, the imprisoned, and those who find themselves far from home.

To guard life is not selective work. It cannot be narrowed to one issue while ignoring others. That is why the Church often frustrates those who want her to be predictable, aligned neatly with political platforms. She is neither conservative nor liberal; she is Catholic. Her consistency flows not from ideology but from fidelity to the One who said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." And fidelity requires balance.

Passion and Balance

Let us admit something honestly: each of us has issues that stir our hearts more than others. Some are moved deeply to defend the unborn.

Others are drawn to fight poverty, racism, or injustice in prisons. Others are compelled to advocate for the elderly or for those who arrive among us in need. These passions are good. They are signs of God's Spirit at work.

But the Church calls us to something larger than our personal preferences. She asks us to weave those threads together into a seamless garment of life. To pit one life issue against another is to miss the fullness of the Gospel. It is not either or. It is both and. To love consistently is harder than to champion one cause. Yet the Gospel always stretches our hearts beyond what feels comfortable.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells the apostles that servants do their duty not for thanks but because it is right. In the same way, our work to respect life at every stage is not about recognition or winning arguments. It is about fidelity. It is about doing what is right simply because God's vision demands it.

Respect Life in the Real World

What does this look like in daily life? It means accompanying women in crisis pregnancies with compassion and hope. It means visiting a nursing home where residents hunger for presence more than medicine. It means advocating for just wages, so families can live with dignity. It means opposing the death penalty, not because crimes do not matter, but because mercy does. And it means remembering that the Holy Family themselves once had to leave their home in search of safety. Christians may differ on how best to solve these challenges, but we cannot differ on this: every person carries the image of God and deserves our respect.

These are not abstract ideals. They are mustard seeds of faith planted in ordinary soil. Each small act, listening, protecting, visiting, welcoming, is a seed of fidelity to God's vision.

Conclusion

Respect life is the Gospel in its fullness. To honor life is to honor God. To disregard life is to wound His image.

This October, we are invited once more to be people of life. We may be drawn more to one issue than another, but together we guard the whole treasure. Together we sow seeds of faith that, in God's time, will uproot even the deepest roots of violence and despair. Each small act, listening, protecting, visiting, welcoming, is a mustard seed of faith, proclaiming that every human life is sacred, every life is worth our love, and every seed of compassion will bear fruit in God's time.
