BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear vour confession at another suitable time.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Sunday, September 14

Lifted Up, Love Poured Out "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" (John 3:16)

Some signs make us smile. Fresh bread today. Senior coffee special. Other signs make us stop. A cross at the roadside, flowers tied with ribbon where someone we loved left this world too soon. Today the Church lifts high the greatest sign in history. The cross is where sin ran out of excuses and love refused to run away. Israel looked at the bronze serpent and lived. We look at the crucified Lord and find not only healing for our wounds, but a new way to live.

Paul sings the oldest hymn. Though He was in the form of God, Jesus emptied Himself and became obedient even to death on a cross. That is why every knee will bend. Not because He intimidates, but because He loves without measure. The Psalm warns us not to forget the works of the Lord. The cross is God's bold reminder that mercy is stronger than our complaints and patience is wider than our desert.

Prayer: Jesus, I adore Your holy cross. Let its shadow fall over my pride, my fears, and my shame until everything is remade in Your mercy. Amen. Numbers 21:4–9; Psalm 78; Philippians 2:6–11; John 3:13–17

Monday, September 15

A Mother Who Stays "Behold, your mother" (John 19:27)

Mary stands where most of us would fall. She does not preach. She does not fix. She stays. The Church calls her Our Lady of Sorrows, but her sorrow is not empty grief. It is love that refuses to leave when it hurts. Jesus gives her to John, and through John He gives her to the whole Church. When we feel the sting of life, a mother is in the house.

Paul urges prayers for all, even for those in authority, so that we may lead quiet and devout lives. That feels fitting today. The world aches in many places. The Stabat Mater invites us to stand by the cross and let our hearts learn the shape of love. Sorrow does not have the last word. The cross becomes the doorway through which Mary and her children learn to hope. **Prayer:** Mother Mary, teach me to stay with Jesus in hard places and to carry others in prayer when I cannot carry their pain. Lead me to your Son. Amen. 1 Timothy 2:1–8; Psalm 28; John 19:25–27 or Luke 2:33–35

Tuesday, September 16

A Church that Raises the Fallen"God has visited his people" (Luke 7:16)

A widow walks behind a coffin that holds her only son. Jesus sees her, and everything else becomes secondary. He touches the bier, speaks a word, and death backs away. Then comes my favorite line. He gave him to his mother. That is what grace does. It restores what sorrow tried to steal.

Paul lists the qualities of bishops and deacons. The list can sound like a job posting, but read it again after Nain. Gentle. Hospitable. Able to teach. Faithful at home. The Church needs leaders who carry the heart of Christ to gates where grief gathers. Saints Cornelius and Cyprian show us courage and charity under pressure. When the world sees a Church that lifts the broken and gives them back to those who love them, people whisper again, God has visited His people.

Prayer: Lord, make our pastors and deacons steady in virtue and tender in mercy. Let our parishes look like places where the dead rise and hope comes home. Amen. 1 Timothy 3:1–13; Psalm 101; Luke 7:11–17

Wednesday, September 17

Pillars, not Pedestals "The Church of the living God, the pillar and foundation of truth" (1 Timothy 3:15)

Pedestals are for statues. Pillars are for buildings that welcome people in from the heat. Paul says the Church is a pillar and foundation of truth. That means the Gospel must be sturdy enough for real life. It must hold when storms roll in and when critics poke at the mortar. The mystery we confess is not an idea. It is a person. Manifest in the flesh. Vindicated in the Spirit. Believed in by the nations.

Jesus laments a generation that will not be pleased. John fasts and they

complain. Jesus feasts and they complain. Wisdom is vindicated by all her children. Lives that are changed become the proof the world needs. Build your days on the Lord and let love carry the weight. Pedestals wobble. Pillars serve. **Prayer:** Living God, make my faith strong enough to hold others up. Let Your truth in me be more than words. Let it be a place of shelter. Amen. 1 Timothy 3:14–16; Psalm 111; Luke 7:31–35

Thursday, September 18

The Gift in Your Hands "Do not neglect the gift you have" (1 Timothy 4:14)

God has hidden something holy in you. Not for show, but for service. Paul tells Timothy to attend to reading, exhortation, and teaching, and to persevere so that his progress is evident to all. Growth is not a sprint. It looks like steady prayer, faithful habits, and humble course corrections. Keep going and the fruit will show.

A woman with a reputation walks into a respectable dinner and gives Jesus everything she has. Tears for water. Hair for a towel. Ointment for a perfume that fills the room. Simon sees a problem. Jesus sees a heart that knows it has been forgiven much. Do not let contempt, your own or anyone else's, stop your offering. Bring the gift. Pour it out. The Lord will call it beautiful. **Prayer:** Jesus, thank You for the gift You placed in me. Help me to use it with love, to persevere when I am tired, and to rejoice when mercy fills the room. Amen. 1 Timothy 4:12–16; Psalm 111:7–10; Luke 7:36–50

Friday, September 19

Content and Free "Religion with contentment is a great gain" (1 Timothy 6:6)

Paul is not scolding prosperity. He is rescuing souls from a trap. The love of money pierces the heart and leaves us restless. We brought nothing in. We take nothing out. If we have food and clothing, we can be content. That kind of freedom turns arguments into conversations and anxiety into trust. Jesus travels with a community that includes apostles and women of courage who provide for the mission from their resources. That is a lovely picture of the Church. Everyone brings what they have. The rich and the poor. The strong and the weak. All become family in the Lord. Blessed are the poor in spirit, the Psalm reminds us, because empty hands are ready to receive. **Prayer:** Father, give me a content heart and generous hands. Let my resources serve Your Kingdom and my joy point others to You. Amen.

1 Timothy 6:2c-12; Psalm 49; Luke 8:1-3

Saturday, September 20

Make My Heart Good Soil "They bear fruit through perseverance" (Luke 8:15)

A farmer tosses seed like a man who believes in tomorrow. Some bounces on the path. Some sprouts on stone. Some wrestles with thorns. Some sinks into good soil and surprises everyone. Jesus is as honest as He is hopeful. The word meets resistance. The heart needs tending. Rocks must be lifted. Thorns must be pulled. Then the harvest comes.

Paul charges us to keep the commandment without stain until Christ appears. Saints Andrew Kim, Paul Chong, and their companions kept the faith through danger and gave Korea a legacy of courage. They were not flashy. They were faithful. Ask for their intercession as you loosen the soil of your life and welcome the seed again. Perseverance is the quiet way saints are made. **Prayer:** Lord, remove the stones and thorns from my heart. Plant Your word deep in me and give me courage to persevere until the harvest is for Your glory. Amen. 1 Timothy 6:13–16; Psalm 100; Luke 8:4–15

Lifted Up: Finding Life in the Shadow of the Cross

Numbers 21:4–9; Psalm 78; Philippians 2:6–11; John 3:13–17

Every family has its stories of stubborn road trips. Children asking "Are we there yet?" Parents sighing at the traffic. Snacks running out before the first rest stop. Israel's trip through the desert was one long road trip of complaints. "Why have you brought us up from Egypt to die in this desert? We are disgusted with this wretched food!" Their grumbling led to serpents slithering through the camp, and suddenly the people were begging for healing. God's answer was unusual: a bronze serpent lifted up on a pole. Look at it, and you will live.

Centuries later, Jesus told Nicodemus that He too must be lifted up, so that all who look to Him might have eternal life. And then came the verse that is so familiar it sometimes glides past us without impact: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son." We recite it, we see it on posters at football games, but do we pause to hear it as Israel heard the bronze serpent story? As a matter of life and death?

A Strange Medicine

The bronze serpent was not magic. It was a visible sign of trust. Looking at it meant turning away from panic and despair to place hope in God's mercy. The cross is stranger still. In Roman times, it was an instrument of shame, a billboard of fear. Yet God transformed it into the tree of life. What once symbolized humiliation now stands as the world's most recognizable sign of love.

When Paul sings in Philippians of Christ emptying Himself and taking the form of a servant, he is pointing to the deepest truth of the cross. Jesus did not cling to glory. He let go, stooped down, and embraced even death. That is why God exalted Him and gave Him the name above every name. Love did not avoid suffering. Love went through it and remade it from the inside.

Remembering the Works of the Lord

The psalmist reminds us not to forget God's works. That is our temptation: to grow numb to the cross. We wear it as jewelry, decorate churches with it, maybe even hang one in the car. But the cross is not an ornament. It is the place where God's mercy forgave, restored, and set us free. To remember the works of the Lord is to let the cross break into our present struggles, our illnesses, our broken families, our disappointments, and speak life where despair wants the last word.

The Cross and Our World

We live in a time where people want victory without cost, progress without sacrifice, love without risk. The cross exposes that illusion. It is not a shortcut. It is the long road of obedience, humility, and mercy. And yet, in that very cost, we find joy. Strange as it sounds, the cross gives us freedom. For if God could turn a tool of torture into the gateway of salvation, then nothing in our lives is beyond His reach.

The Feast of the Cross is not about admiring a piece of wood. It is about lifting our eyes to see what God has done. Just as the Israelites were healed when they looked up, so we are healed when we lift our gaze from our wounds to His. The cross tells us that our failures do not get the last word. Love does.

Conclusion

The next time you see a cross, pause for a moment. Not as habit, but as healing. The cross is God's answer to every serpent bite of sin, despair, and death. It is not condemnation but salvation. It is the sign that God so loved the world that He refused to leave us poisoned by sin. Lifted up, Christ draws us all to Himself. And in His shadow, we find not defeat but life.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As the violent conflict in Gaza continues, a grave humanitarian crisis is unfolding, with many Christians and innocent people struggling to survive. With this devastating situation in mind, I write to you in appeal for our brothers and sisters in need in the midst of these destructive events.

The Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, has expressed his concern with the situation, saying, "I am following with great concern the dire humanitarian situation in Gaza, where the civilian population is suffering from severe hunger and remains exposed to violence and death." Our Catholic Faith calls each of us to care for those in need, and, at this time in particular, for those who are suffering in the wake of this ongoing tragedy.

Recognizing the need of those who have been so severely impacted by the conflict in the region, the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has asked Dioceses throughout the country to take up a special collection to assist with humanitarian aid in Gaza. Within the Diocese of Venice, the collection will be taken on the weekend of **September 20-21**, **2025**

Your generosity and your prayers for the people of Gaza are deeply appreciated. May Almighty God bless you and your families. Please continue to pray for peace throughout the world, particularly in the middle east.
