# Celebrating our Faith

#### BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

#### CONFIRMATION

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

#### **EUCHARIST**

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the Sacristan.

#### RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear your confession at another suitable time.

#### THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

#### ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical court that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the maritage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Sunday, September 28 The Chasm at My Door

"Between us and you a great chasm is established" (Luke 16:26)

Amos warns about the comfort that numbs compassion, and Jesus paints the picture with names. The rich man does not get a name, but the poor man does. Lazarus. God knows the person at the gate. The great chasm in the parable is not geography. It is the habit of walking past a need so often that our heart forgets how to stop. The danger is not purple robes or good food. It is a life that never looks up from the table to notice who is lying at the door.

Paul tells us to pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. That list sounds like a marathon, not a sprint. So begin where you are. Bring a meal. Make a call. Offer a ride. Yes, even give up the good parking spot. Heaven measures wealth by how freely we love, not by what we store. If we bridge the small chasms today, the great one will not frighten us tomorrow.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, open my eyes to the Lazarus at my door. Stretch my heart until generosity becomes my habit. Amen.

#### Monday, September 29 Help From the Angels

"In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord" (Psalm 138:1)

Scripture shows a real battle, but it also shows a real victory. Michael and the angels fight, the dragon falls, and heaven sings. You and I do not carry flaming swords, but we do carry choices. Every time we refuse the lie and cling to the truth, we share in that victory. Every time we pray instead of panic, we stand with the hosts of heaven. Think of the angels as God's special forces who never forget your name or your address.

Jesus tells Nathanael, I saw you under the fig tree. The Lord sees us before we see Him. There is no duplicity in Nathanael, just a straightforward heart that is ready to be surprised. Ask for that grace today. Be simple enough to believe that God sends help. Be brave enough to ask for it. The angels are not decorations for Christmas cards. They are coworkers in the Gospel.

**Prayer:** Holy Angels, guard my steps and steady my soul. Michael, defend me. Gabriel, strengthen me. Raphael, heal me. Lead me closer to Jesus. Amen. Daniel 7:9–10, 13–14 or Revelation 12:7–12ab; Psalm 138; John 1:47–51

#### Tuesday, September 30 When Fire Is Not the Answer

"Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven?" (Luke 9:54)

Saint Jerome loved Scripture with a fierce love. He could be sharp with words, but he sharpened them on the Word. Today Jesus rebukes the disciples who want a dramatic display against a village that will not welcome Him. Fire would be fast and satisfying. Mercy is slower and stronger. Most of us do not call down fire. We call down sarcasm. It still burns.

Zechariah imagines crowds from every nation saying, Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you. That is the goal. Not that people fear our opinions, but that they sense God with us. The world does not need our heat as much as it needs His light. Ask the Lord to tame your temper and turn it into zeal for souls.

**Prayer:** Lord, curb my impulse to scorch and teach me to bless. Make my words a bridge to You. Amen.

## Wednesday, October 1

The Little Way to Big Courage

"No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the Kingdom of God" (Luke 9:62)

Nehemiah asks a king for letters, lumber, and time away. It is a bold request spoken with a prayer in his heart. Saint Thérèse shows us that bold faith can look very small. A quiet yes. A hidden act of love. A smile when you would rather sigh. The Little Way is not lazy. It is courage made simple. Keep your hand on the plow where God has placed you, and do the next faithful thing.

Exiles by the rivers of Babylon wept when they remembered Zion. Some days we feel that ache too. We long for what was. Jesus invites us to walk forward with Him. Do not stare at yesterday. Plow today. Trust that God will bring fruit from the furrows you cannot yet see.

**Prayer:** Jesus, give me Thérèse's simple courage. Teach me to love in small ways without looking back. Amen.

#### Thursday, October 2 Glad to Be Small

"Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the Kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 18:3)

When Ezra read the Law, the people stood, listened, wept, and then rejoiced. The Word first pierced them, then lifted them. That is what grace does. On the Memorial of the Guardian Angels, Jesus points to a child as the model. Children do not fake being strong. They ask for help. They forgive before lunch. They trust their Father.

Your guardian angel is not a fairy tale friend. Think of a loyal companion who never clocks out. When pride grows heavy, let the angel remind you how to be small again. When fear creeps in, let the angel nudge you back toward joy. The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart because they bring us home to the One who loves us.

**Prayer:** Father, make my heart childlike. Thank You for my guardian angel. Help me to listen and to rejoice in Your Word. Amen.

#### Friday, October 3

Soft Heart, Strong Hope

"If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts" (Psalm 95:8)

Baruch gives us a prayer of honest confession. No excuses, no spin. We have sinned. We did not listen. The result is rubble. That kind of truth is not meant to crush us but to clear the ground for rebuilding. A hard heart is like concrete. Nothing grows there. A soft heart may ache, but it can receive seeds of mercy.

Jesus warns towns that saw wonders but refused to change. We do not lack signs. We often lack the simple step of obedience right in front of us. Begin there. Call the person. Say the prayer. Return the kindness. Ask forgiveness. Hope rises when humility kneels.

**Prayer:** Merciful Lord, soften my heart. Let Your word take root today and bear the fruit of repentance and peace. Amen. Baruch 1:15–22; Psalm 79; Luke 10:13–16

#### Saturday, October 4

Joy on the Road

"Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20)

Saint Francis called himself a little brother and found a big joy. The seventy two come back thrilled with results. Jesus smiles and then redirects them. Do not build your joy on what you can count. Build it on the Father who knows your name. Results go up and down. Belonging stays steady.

Baruch tells the people to turn now ten times the more to seek Him. That is Francis in a sentence. When you stray, run back faster. When your love cools, add wood to the fire. When you serve, rejoice that heaven has carved your name where no thief can reach. That is a freedom no success can buy and no failure can steal.

**Prayer:** Most High and Good Lord, teach me the simple joy of Francis. Write Your love on my heart and make my life a song of praise. Amen.

# The Answer to Hate is Not Hate

# A Catholic Reflection on Love in Divided Times

When Erika Kirk stood at the memorial for her husband Charlie, she spoke words that cut through the grief and chaos like a light in the dark: "The answer to hate is not hate. The answer we know from the Gospel is love, love for our enemies, love for those who persecute us." In her trembling voice, forgiveness was not theory but lived discipleship, echoing Christ on the Cross. She said her husband wanted to save young men "like the one who took his life." Through her tears she added, "That young man, I forgive him." However the memorial may be remembered, her words shone as a moment of Gospel witness, reminding a weary nation that love is stronger than hate.

This Sunday's readings press the same truth upon us. Amos cries out against complacency, against the comfortable who "stretch on ivory couches" and ignore the collapse around them. The prophet's warning could just as easily be addressed to us, for how easily we grow numb to division, injustice, and violence. We scroll past tragedies, argue over politics, and fail to notice the Lazarus at our own doorstep. Erika's words jolt us out of this complacency: hate begets hate, violence multiplies violence. To stay silent in the face of injustice is wrong, but to sink into bitterness is equally deadly.

Psalm 146 reminds us that God is not on the side of the strong who trample others, but with the hungry, the captive, the blind, the stranger, the widow. "The Lord raises up those who were bowed down." If this is where God's heart rests, then it must be where ours leans as well. Forgiveness is not naïve. It does not excuse evil or erase responsibility. Rather, it is aligned with the very heart of God, who alone can break the chains of hate.

Paul's exhortation to Timothy could be addressed to every Catholic today: "Pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Compete well for the faith." Notice what is missing: anger, resentment, tribal victory. To "compete well for the faith" is not to crush an opponent but to hold fast to love when everything around us urges retaliation. Forgiveness does not weaken truth; it makes truth credible before many witnesses.

And then comes the Gospel, the piercing parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The true tragedy is not only the torment of the afterlife, but the chasm that had already been dug in the rich man's heart long before. He had stepped over Lazarus so many times that he no longer saw him. Even in death, he wanted Lazarus to serve him. His wealth was not the crime; his blindness was.

What divides us today is not only politics or culture. It is the great chasm of the heart. Once we demonize our neighbor, we no longer see his wounds. Once we let hatred define us, we no longer see the face of Christ in the other. No miracle can bridge that chasm if love is absent. Abraham's warning resounds: "Neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead." If Christ's own resurrection cannot melt our divisions, then nothing can.

Let us be clear: division destroys. It destroys families, friendships, parishes, nations. It reduces us to enemies rather than brothers and sisters, combatants rather than children of the same Father. Division is the strategy of the evil one, who knows that a house divided cannot stand. And when division festers, violence is never far behind.


Erika's words remind us that hatred is not only immoral. It is useless. Hate breeds more hate. Violence feeds on itself. Division consumes those who cling to it. Only love interrupts the pattern. Only forgiveness disarms the cycle. Only mercy plants seeds where blood has been spilled.

How, then, do we preserve Charlie's memory? Not by shouting louder than those who divide us, not by building monuments of stone destined to crumble, not by nursing the same fury that ended his life. The legacy worth carrying forward is not anger but encounter. The truest way to honor him is to carry forward the mission of dialogue: to meet even our fiercest opponents with respect, to listen with humility, and to debate with open hearts rather than clenched fists.

The surest way to keep his light alive is to turn away from the darkness of division. It is to master our impulses, to let self control steady us where vengeance tempts. It is to stand at the threshold of hatred and answer as Erika did, with forgiveness, with mercy, with love. The Christian confession is simple, though never cheap: the answer is not hate. The answer is love, the love we know in Christ.
