

## Celebrating our Faith

#### BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Baptisms of children under 7 years old are offered every fourth Sunday of each month in Spanish and every second Sunday of the month in English. Please visit our website or contact our office for details and requirements.

At confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and confirm and renew our baptismal promises committing to a life of maturity in the Christian faith. Unconfirmed Catholics wishing to receive the Sacrament should contact the Parish Office to make arrangements for suitable instruction. Unbaptized or non-Catholics can be confirmed at the Easter Vigil when they are baptized or received into the Church as a part of Order of Christian Initiation of Adult. To enroll in OCIA, please call Griselda Cisneros at 992-0901.

#### **EUCHARIST**

Parishioners who wish to bring communion to their spouses should contact the parish office to pick up a pyx with the St. Leo's inscription on it. Please use this pyx when approaching to receive a host for your spouse or a family member in the Communion procession during Mass. If you need to receive a gluten free host due to a medical condition please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins and inform the

#### RECONCILIATION

Individual confession with a priest is the principal means of absolution and reconciliation of grave sins within the Church. The Sacrament of Reconciliation frees us from sinful patterns of behavior and calls us to complete conversion to Christ. Confessions are heard at 2pm on Saturday in English and 2pm on Sunday in Spanish in the Church. You may also approach any of our parish priests to hear vour confession at another suitable time.

#### THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at 992-0901 to be connected with the priest on duty.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Leo and plan to marry in our parish please contact our office at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date. Weddings cannot be scheduled until the marriage preparation process is complete and it is determined that the parties are free to marry.

ANNULMENT - Reestablishing the freedom to marry.

An annulment is more accurately described as a declaration of matrimonial invalidity. It is an official determination made by an ecclesiastical count that at the time of the marital consent exchanged by the parties a specific component of the marriage was lacking or defective. Hence, the marriage failed to be a marriage as defined by the Catholic Church. If you wish to reestablish your freedom to marry in the Church, please contact a parish priest to be your advocate in presenting your case to the Tribunal.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

#### The Dance at the Heart of Everything

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations... in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)

The Trinity isn't a logic puzzle to be solved with a flowchart—it's a love story written in three voices. One God, three Persons. Not division, but communion. Not rivalry, but relationship. At the center of everything—galaxies and gravity, birth and breath—is a dance of love: the Father pouring Himself out, the Son receiving and returning it, the Spirit binding all in joy. And the miracle? This isn't a private dance. It's an invitation.

When Jesus commissions the disciples, He names the Trinity—not as trivia, but as the foundation of Christian life. This name—Father, Son, and Spirit—isn't just the signature on our Baptism certificate. It's the rhythm behind every grace-filled moment: the name whispered over us in forgiveness, traced on our forehead in blessing, and sealed on our hearts in prayer. We are marked by this mystery—and made to reflect it.

So what does that mean on a random Sunday in June? It means love is your origin, relationship is your calling, and communion—not control—is your destiny. The Trinity reminds us that God doesn't operate solo. And neither should we. The spiritual life isn't meant to be a lonely climb—it's a divine dance we're invited to join, step by grace-filled step.

#### Prayer:

Holy Trinity, draw me into Your rhythm of love. Help me reflect Your joy, generosity, and unity in how I live, speak, serve, and love. Let me walk in Your name—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—with trust, gratitude, and awe. Amen.

#### Monday, June 16, 2025 God Is Not Moody

"Yes is yes." (2 Corinthians 1:19)

Let's be honest: we're a moody bunch. We make plans, then ghost them. We promise to eat healthy—until someone mentions tacos. Even our prayers can feel like emotional weather reports: sunny one day, stormy the next. But Paul reminds us that Jesus isn't like that. God doesn't flake, fumble, or file for emotional bankruptcy. His "yes" is not a tentative maybe—it's a rock-solid commitment. That's good news for people like us, who are still figuring ourselves out. When we wonder if we've failed too much or prayed too little, God doesn't roll His eyes or adjust the terms. His grace doesn't have an expiration date or a 30-day return policy. In Christ, God's answer is yes—steadfast, reliable,

and unshakably true. So when your mood swings like a tired toddler or your confidence needs a nap, take heart. You don't have to tiptoe around God like He's having a bad day. His love is settled. His promises are intact. And even when we're not steady, He still is.

#### Prayer:

Jesus, thank You for being the same yesterday, today, and forever. When I'm moody, messy, or mildly dramatic, remind me that You're not. Help me rest in Your steady love, and teach me to reflect a little of that steadiness in my own life. Amen.

#### Tuesday, June 17, 2025

#### Mercy in the Middle of the Mess

"Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy." (Matthew 5:7)

Mercy is not a warm feeling—it's a hard choice. It doesn't mean pretending everything's fine. It means knowing exactly how bad it was and choosing compassion anyway. Mercy refuses to reduce someone to their worst mistake. It says, "I see the mess—and I'm staying."

But here's the beautiful twist: those most capable of mercy are the ones who've needed it. They've sat in their own shame. They've felt the sting of forgiveness. And now they carry grace like a lantern for others lost in the dark. Mercy doesn't shame—it shelters. It doesn't condemn—it carries. Jesus blesses the merciful because they are the bridge back to hope. When we choose mercy, we reflect His heart. And that's what the world needs—less judgment, more bridges.

#### Prayer:

Jesus, thank You for showing me mercy when I least deserved it. Help me carry that same mercy into my relationships, my home, my daily life. Let me be a shelter for the wounded and a sign of Your grace. Amen.

#### Wednesday, June 18, 2025

#### Secret Grace Is Still Grace

"Your Father who sees in secret will repay you." (Matthew 6:6)

God does some of His best work behind the scenes. Creation started in darkness. Jesus rose while the world was still sleeping. And today, the Holy Spirit still whispers in places no camera will ever reach. In a culture where even coffee foam gets a photo shoot, Jesus dares us to live differently—to give without a selfie, to pray without performance, to fast without fanfare. If your act of penance includes announcing your fast between bites of kale, you might be missing the point.

But don't mistake hidden for unimportant. The quiet acts of love—the favors no one sees, the forgiveness no one knows about—are sacred. They shape you. They echo in heaven. God isn't looking for grand gestures. He's looking for hearts that love without needing a stage. If you've ever cleaned up without being thanked, held your tongue in a hard conversation, or prayed in a parking lot while everyone else went about their day—He saw that. And He smiles.

So let the world chase followers. You follow Christ. Let others measure by clicks. You measure by love. And when no one notices your kindness, your restraint, or your hidden act of grace—rest easy. You ween't doing it for them anyway.

#### Prayer:

Father, thank You for seeing what others don't. Teach me to love in secret, serve without applause, and trust that what is hidden in grace will shine in eternity. Amen.

#### Thursday, June 19, 2025

#### Optional Memorial of St. Romuald, Abbot

#### Holy Silence, Humble Roots

"When you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing." (Matthew 6:3) St. Romuald wasn't running away from the world—he was running toward God. In a noisy culture, he discovered the strength of stillness. He embraced solitude not to isolate, but to listen. He built communities not on power or prestige, but on prayer and simplicity. His silence wasn't empty—it was filled with God.

Jesus affirms this way of life in today's Gospel. True holiness doesn't demand recognition. It flourishes in quiet places—when you help without a headline, forgive without fanfare, and fast without sympathy. In the quiet, your heart tunes itself to the rhythm of heaven.

Our culture doesn't reward the hidden path. But Romuald reminds us that silence, stillness, and secret faithfulness are not wasted. They are the seeds of real holiness—and God sees every one.

#### Prayer:

Lord of silence, quiet my heart so I can hear You. Teach me to value hidden faithfulness over public approval. Help me live with humble generosity, hidden devotion, and joyful simplicity. Amen.

#### Friday, June 20, 2025

#### Storing Treasure in the Right Place

"For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." (Matthew 6:21)

Jesus isn't warning us against treasure—He's just making sure we're not storing it in a leaky basement. Earthly treasure, while shiny, has a short shelf life. It rusts, breaks, gets hacked, or disappears in one market crash or moth invasion. Heaven's treasure, on the other hand, doesn't need a security system. It's stored in God—untouchable, incorruptible, and oddly resistant to inflation.

But this isn't just about money. It's about where your attention goes when you're exhausted, what you daydream about in traffic, and where you spend your best energy. Our hearts tend to follow our calendars and our click history. If you're not sure where your treasure is, check your browser tabs—or your mood when the Wi-Fi goes out. That'll tell you plenty.

Still, Jesus isn't shaming us—He's inviting us. The good news? There's always time to reallocate. You don't need to sell everything and move to a monastery. Just start by asking: is this pulling my heart toward God or away from Him? If it's the wrong vault, move your heart. Heaven's interest rate is better anyway.

#### Prayer:

Lord Jesus, help me treasure what lasts. When I chase the temporary, call me back to You. Let my time, my thoughts, and my love point toward heaven—where my heart truly belongs. Amen.

#### Saturday, June 21, 2025

#### Memorial of St. Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious

#### The Purity of Purpose

"Do not worry about tomorrow." (Matthew 6:34)

St. Aloysius Gonzaga lived like a holy highlighter—he didn't just exist; he emphasized what matters. Born into nobility, he walked away from power and privilege to follow Christ. He didn't hedge his bets or multitask his soul. When a plague broke out, he didn't Google how to escape; he showed up to serve. His purity wasn't just about avoiding sin—it was a laser-sharp focus on God. One life. One love. One purpose.

Jesus invites us into that same simplicity—not by shrinking our responsibilities, but by reordering our priorities. We worry about everything from gas prices to group chats, from family drama to future plans. But worry never wrote a resurrection. It just drains today dry. Aloysius didn't ignore reality—he just believed in something deeper. He knew that trusting God doesn't mean nothing goes wrong; it means Someone is holding it all together.

You don't have to join a monastery or take a vow of poverty. But you are invited to clarity. What would your life look like if you truly believed God was enough? Maybe less scrambling, more surrender. Less panic, more peace. One heart, one purpose—pointed toward heaven.

#### Prayer:

Jesus, quiet the noise around me—and within me. Like St. Aloysius, help me focus on what matters most. Teach me to live with holy purpose, trust deeply, and walk lightly into tomorrow. Amen.



## The Dance of God: Understanding the Trinity as Relationship An Essay on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

There's something quietly holy about watching people dance who know each other well. They move in sync, without needing to shout instructions. A glance, a rhythm, a shared breath—and suddenly the space between them becomes alive with grace. That image, surprisingly enough, might be one of the best ways to imagine the mystery at the heart of our faith: the Trinity.

The early Church Fathers had a word for it—*perichoresis*. It means "to dance around," and they used it to describe how the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit relate to one another: not as isolated individuals, but as Persons moving in perfect unity and love. The Trinity isn't a riddle to be solved with diagrams and metaphors—it's a living communion of love. Not three gods, not one God wearing three hats, but one divine essence in three distinct Persons, eternally giving, receiving, and loving.

In today's Gospel, Jesus commissions the disciples to go out and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). Notice: it's name, not names. That's important. Jesus isn't giving us a formula—He's inviting us into a relationship. To be baptized in this name is to be swept into the very life of God, into the eternal movement of love that has always existed: the Father who gives, the Son who receives and returns, and the Spirit who unites.

Saint Paul closes his Second Letter to the Corinthians with a blessing that has echoed through centuries of Christian worship: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you" (2 Corinthians 13:13). Grace, love, fellowship—those are not abstract theological terms. They're deeply human needs. We crave grace when we've messed up, love when we feel unseen, fellowship when we're alone. And Paul reminds us: the Trinity is not distant. It is the source of everything our hearts ache for.

Even the Old Testament gives us glimpses of this living God. In Exodus, Moses meets a God who is "merciful and gracious, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity" (Exodus 34:6). These are not cold attributes; they describe a God who engages, who relates, who loves. And in Daniel, we see three young men tossed into a fiery furnace—but not alone. One "like a son of man" walks with them, a mysterious companion whose presence makes the fire survivable. That's how God works—not from a distance, but from within the flames.

So what does this mean for us today, in the middle of ordinary life filled with distractions, deadlines, and difficult relationships?

It means that relationship is not optional. If we are made in the image of a relational God, then we are made *for* relationship—with God and with others. That's why loneliness feels like starvation. That's why bitterness corrodes the soul. That's why joy shared is joy multiplied. The Trinity teaches us that love is not a side project of God—it is who God is. And that divine love is not possessive or self-serving. It's always outward-moving, always life-giving, always opening space for the other.

The Trinity also reminds us that holiness isn't about escape. It's not about becoming a spiritual solo act. It's about participating in God's own rhythm of life. Every act of forgiveness mirrors the Father's mercy. Every sacrifice made in love reflects the Son's self-giving. Every moment of unity, especially in a divided world, echoes the Spirit's quiet power.

So maybe we don't have to fully understand the Trinity to live it. Maybe the best way to "explain" it is to reflect it—to live lives of faithful love, selfless service, and courageous communion. Maybe that's how the world begins to glimpse what God is really like—not just by the words we say, but by the lives we share.

Because in the end, the Trinity isn't a puzzle. It's a dance. And the invitation is simple: step in.

A Prayer to the Trinity

O Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit— You are not a riddle to solve, but a love too vast to measure.

You are the rhythm behind my breath, the warmth in every real relationship, the stillness in the center of my chaos.
You made me in Your image—not for isolation, but for communion—with You, and with others.

Father, draw me close with Your steady love.
Son, walk beside me when I stumble,
and teach me how to pour myself out in love.
Holy Spirit, bind my heart to others,
especially when I want to run, hide, or hold back.

Teach me to live like You—
open, giving, and joyfully aware of others.
Make my home a reflection of Your harmony.
Make my life a small echo of Your eternal dance.

And when I feel too broken, too tired, or too small to love like that—remind me:
 I don't have to do it alone.
You are with me, within me, and before me.
 Always one. Always love. Always God.
 Amen.




## **Our Capital Improvement Fund**
