


of women between the ages of 50 and 74 received a mammogram within the last two years.

And, over the last four years...




... screening rates have been **increasing.**

And, even within the MHCP population, gaps in screening exist **by race group.**




of **Black women** with MHCP coverage received a mammogram in the last two years
