ALL: In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven. Thanks be to God! Amen.



Ways to Give: Mission Giving

Our third quarter mission giving supports non-profit organizations serving those in the Lancaster community experiencing housing insecurity.

Clare House (344 E. Chestnut St.) is a transitional housing program for mothers and children facing homelessness. Clare House has an employment-focused program that provides safety, housing, and supportive services with the goal of financial stability. www.clarehouselancaster.org

TLC (105 E. King St.) provides temporary housing and support for individuals, couples, families, and veterans who are experiencing homelessness. Their building, a hotel built in 1910, is currently undergoing a \$15.3 million renovation. Formerly known as the Transitional Living Center, this program of Tenfold serves about 200 individuals annually. www.WeAreTenfold.org/TLC

Chestnut Housing (434 E. Chestnut St.) provides affordable rental housing to people experiencing homelessness, and they are committed to supporting affordable housing solutions in the City of Lancaster. www.chestnuthousing.org

September, October, November

Jesus spent time with people eating and drinking, and the first Christians met over a shared supper. FPC Supper Club provides the opportunity to meet new people and to strengthen ties among people you know, all while sharing a meal. Groups will consist of 6-8 adults who plan their own meals and gather once a month for three consecutive months (September, October, and November). Please register by August 24.

What is the time commitment?

Participants commit to three evenings together—once a month for three consecutive months (September, October, and November).

What's the agenda?

The only agenda is friendship!

Who hosts? Who cooks the meals?

It's potluck! We suggest you take turns hosting and providing the main dish, inviting other participants to bring sides, desserts, and/or drinks. You are welcome to have multiple meals at the same home or to make plans to eat at a restaurant.

What about families with children? Indicate on your registration if you would like your children to join you! All participants can specify their preference for groups with families or adults only.

What about dietary restrictions? Include any allergies or dietary restrictions/ preferences in your registration. A small group of 6-8 should be able to accommodate all needs.

What if a Supper Club cannot find a date to meet? Groups will do their best to accommodate all schedules, but a Supper Club may have to move forward with a date, even if it does not work for everyone.

Will my Supper Club be the same group as last time? No! A new round of Supper Clubs calls for a new group! While there may be some overlap, you will have the chance to connect with new friends this time around.

Quietly explain the parts of the service and actions of the pastor, ushers, musicians, etc.

Sing the hymns, pray, and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.

If you have to leave the service with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back. As Jesus said, "Let the children come to me."

Remember, the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to the church, to God, and to one another. Let them know they are at home in this house of worship.

The Nursery

Suggested for 6wks up to 4yrs

Second Floor, open 9:00-11:30 a.m. / Professional Staff

Nursery students engage in free-play, a short Scripture lesson and organized activity time.

We ask that you assist with your student's hand-washing upon arrival. We have hand sanitizer stations as well.

A nut-free snack is provided. Please bring a labeled water bottle and alternative snacks if needed. A changing table, with quiet room are also available.

Worship Arts Faith Formation

Suggested for 4yrs through grade 7

Worship Arts begins with a combined lesson and then splits to separate ageappropriate groups to study. A peanut free snack is offered.

Taught by FPC volunteer teachers, we study Scripture through reading, dramatic play, storytelling, and song.

Students begin worship in Shirk Hall (9:00 a.m.) OR the sanctuary (10:30 a.m.) with their families.

Teachers will escort students who wish to participate in Worship Arts to the upper level following the "Worship Arts Blessing."

Parents attending the 9:00 a.m. service - Students will be escorted back to you before the end of the service.

Parents attending the 10:30 a.m. service - Students will return to the sanctuary at the end of worship or can be picked up in the lobby.
