Session Meeting Synopsis October 15

The Session opened with reflection and prayer on the theme of faith—how humor nurtures hope and reshapes our view of the world.

Highlights:

- Facilities & Budget: Trustees presented the 2026 Budget for first review.
 - Work on the Manse slate roof begins in November and chapel renovation plans are underway.
- Worship: Three-week Advent small groups begin soon, with registration opening October 26. This year's theme is "From Generation to Generation." A related exhibit by Freiman Stoltzfus will be featured in Gallery Hall.
 - A task force is gathering data to help Session revisit the idea of streaming online worship services.
 - Formation: Worship Arts is currently focusing on Exodus, while the Youth Group is exploring key elements of worship with Pastor Dan.
 - Join us for Family Ministry's "First Friendsgiving" event on November 16 at 5:00 p.m.— featuring a soup potluck. (Note: This event replaces this year's Advent wreath-making event.)
- Mission/Care: Planning is underway for the June 2026 Youth Mission Trip. A series of Mission Partner workshops is being developed, and the next RISE Against Hunger event is set for March 22, 2026.
- Personnel: We look forward to welcoming a part-time Pastoral Care Director. The church is also seeking to hire two additional nursery staff and is preparing for a new 9:00 a.m. Tech support person.
- Nominating: The team reports all officer vacancies have been filled. Members are encouraged to attend in person to affirm these calls at the congregational meeting on November 16.
