

Mission Update

Mission Partners Meet with FPC to Address Food Scarcity in Lancaster City

Members of the FPC Mission Team recently met with several local mission partners to discuss practical steps for greater collaboration in food sourcing to supplement the Central PA Food Bank. Partnerships with the Midwest Food Bank and the Mid-Atlantic Regional Co-Op are being explored.

Key discussion points included ensuring an adequate supply of the *right* items—especially culturally relevant foods—and exploring ways to share transportation resources among organizations, particularly between those with trucks and those without.

An upcoming food exchange "app" or website designed to connect the entire charitable food network also shows great promise. Developed by Terry Kyle of Millersville, this platform will enable participating organizations to view both current needs and available resources. The resulting data may also prove valuable in communicating with donors.

Hunger-Free Lancaster County continues to address many of these same issues, including government advocacy and potential media outreach to raise awareness about food insecurity. Our local collaboration team is well represented within the Hunger-Free coalition, helping ensure alignment of efforts across the region.

The Giving Tree

Each ornament represents a meaningful opportunity to give through programs run by the School District of Lancaster.

Washington Elementary School has over 400 students. Last year, the school provided 250 gifts to students, and we are helping them reach that number with 20 gifts from First Presbyterian this Christmas season.

The Milestones School provides academic and therapeutic support for students aged 5-21 who face social, emotional, educational, and behavioral challenges. We are providing gifts for specific students and gift cards for their families.

The Apartment School at SDOL is a simulated apartment in a classroom that helps special needs students develop independent living skills. We are providing gifts for students and staff.

Lafayette Elementary is specifically helping refugee families this season, with gift cards from Weis and Walmart.

FIT (Families in Transition) supports students and families experiencing homelessness by removing obstacles that prevent them from having a positive educational experience. Services include connection with agencies, transportation, and providing necessities including school supplies. We will provide gift cards to the families.

Taught by FPC volunteer teachers, we study Scripture through reading, dramatic play, storytelling, and song.

Students begin worship in Shirk Hall (9:00 a.m.) OR the sanctuary (10:30 a.m.) with their families.

Teachers will escort students who wish to participate in Worship Arts to the upper level following the "Worship Arts Blessing."

Parents attending the 9:00 a.m. service - Students will be escorted back to you before the end of the service.

Parents attending the 10:30 a.m. service - Students will return to the sanctuary at the end of worship or can be picked up in the lobby.
