His Parents, Joseph and Alyssa join him on the field tonight.

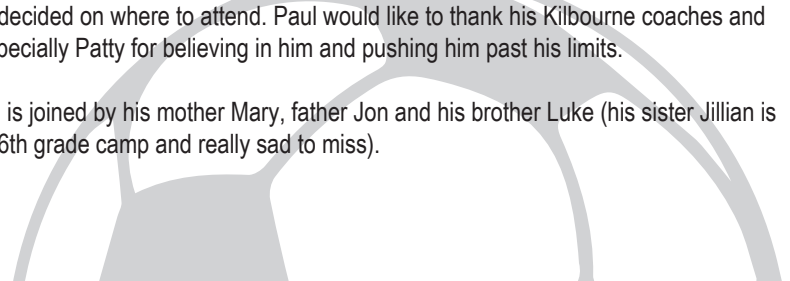


Paul Sterenberg | #22

He is joined by his mother Mary, father Jon and his brother Luke (his sister Jillian is at 6th grade camp and really sad to miss).





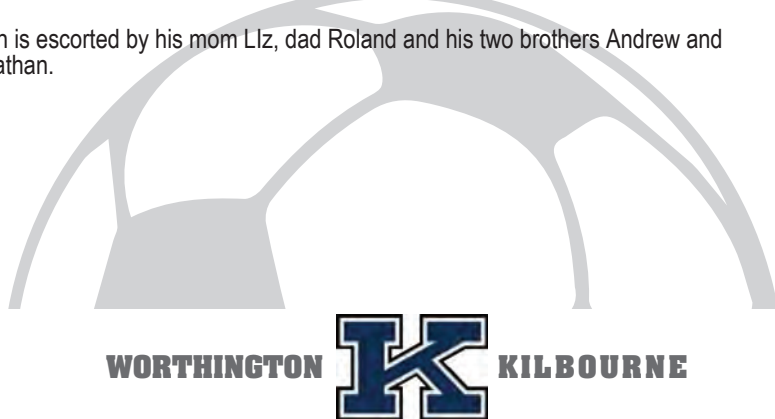
Ian Varga | #20

Isaiah Kim | #6

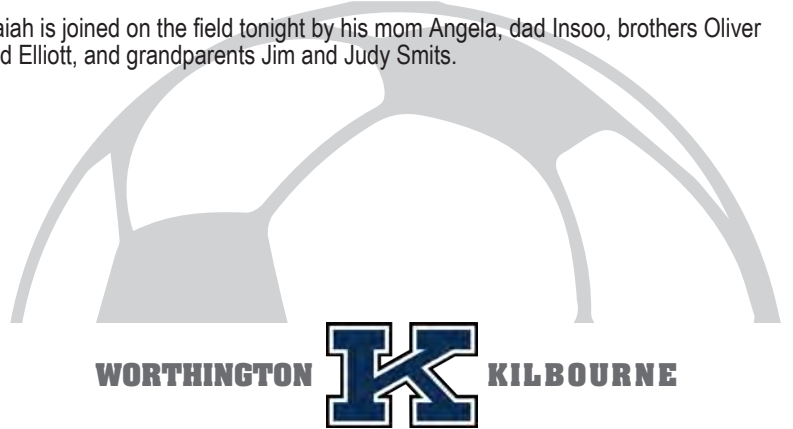

Isaiah is joined on the field tonight by his mom Angela, dad Insoo, brothers Oliver and Elliott, and grandparents Jim and Judy Smits.



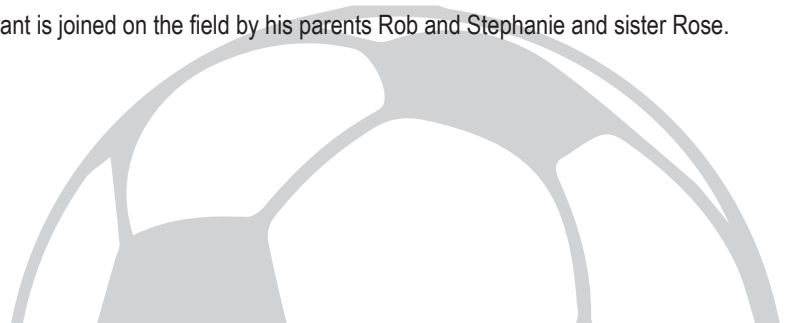
Grant Darner | #17

Grant is joined on the field by his parents Rob and Stephanie and sister Rose.





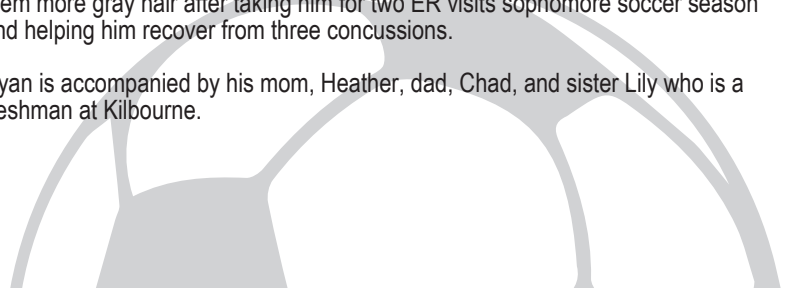
Ryan Foisset | #14

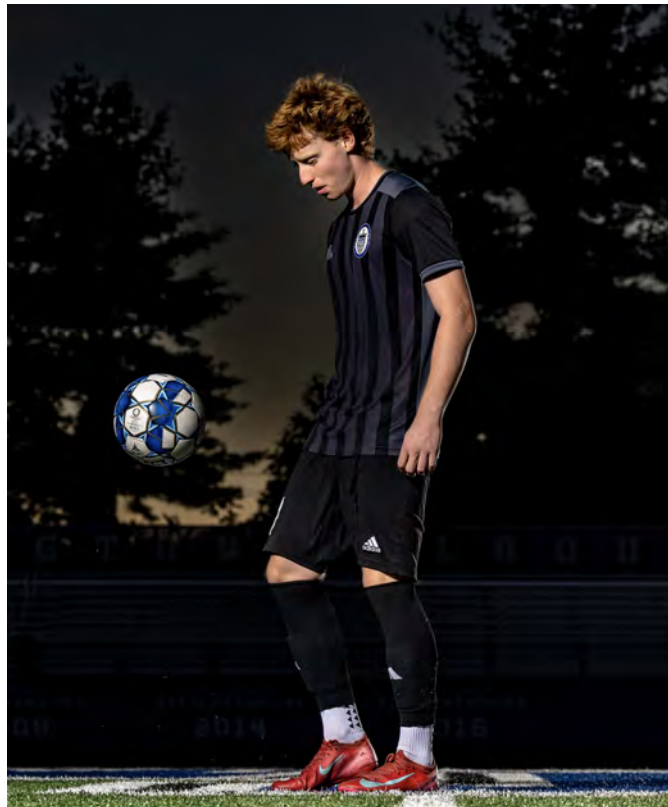

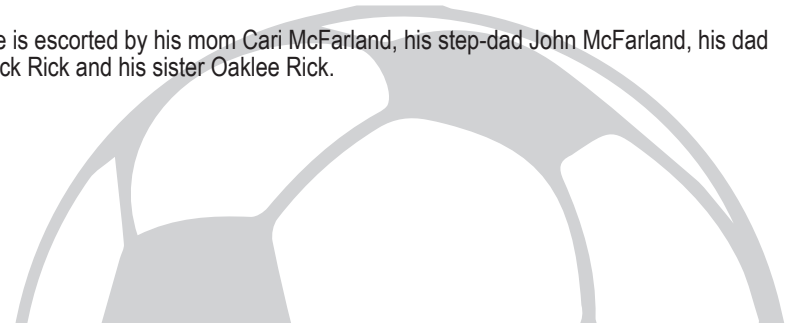
The highlight of Bowen's career is scoring the winning goal against Delaware Hayes his Junior year.

Nick's parents Emmanuel and Anna join him on the field.





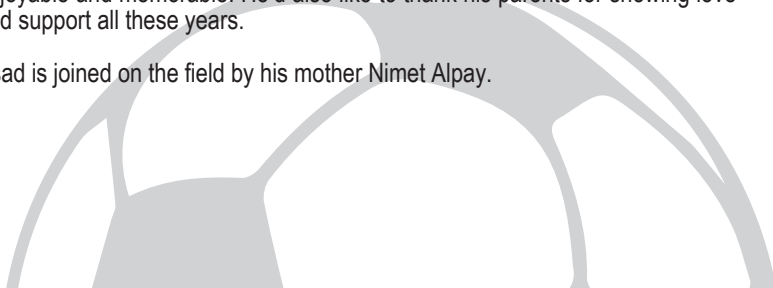
Esad Alpay | #11
