Overcoming Poverty & Loss

Chaidy's life began with loss; her father died when she was just eight days old. Raised by her mother alongside her two siblings, she soon faced another heartbreak when her mother left to work in Thailand and never returned. Since then, Chaidy and her siblings have relied on their elderly grandparents, living in a small hut, with little food and no stability. Her grandmother brought Chaidy to ASAP supported Samraong Adventist School in Cambodia. There, Chaidy discovered new hope, God's love and grew in faith. After two months of Bible study, she chose to give her life to Jesus through baptism.

Most of the over 8,000 students supported by ASAP Ministries come from families unable to provide for them. Through ASAP's mission schools, they are receiving not only education but also hope for a brighter future and the life-changing knowledge of a loving God.

Overcoming Opposition & Fear

Naw Yin Wie,* a 14-year-old student, faced fierce opposition when she chose to follow Jesus. Raised in a Buddhist home, she first encountered Christ at ASAP supported Nah Laihka School and longed to be baptized. But when she asked her parents, they refused. The following year, they intervened again, arriving at school to stop her and even planning to remove her entirely. Though pressured, threatened, and warned she could be disowned, Naw Yin Wie held firmly to her faith. Courageously, she chose Christ and was baptized. Despite hardship, she stands strong, trusting that God will never abandon her.

Many students like Naw Yin Wie face intense family opposition when choosing to follow Jesus. Despite threats, rejection, or loss of support, they remain committed to their faith. Your prayers and support help these young believers continue their education and grow stronger in Christ.





A Teacher's Prayers

Through the prayers, love, and dedication of ASAP teachers, hearts are being transformed. Even in challenging circumstances, students are choosing to follow Jesus, as teachers faithfully intercede and nurture them, trusting God to work in families and open doors for faith to grow.

Saoly, a 15-year-old Buddhist student, had studied at ASAP supported Takong Adventist School since childhood. Though kind and bright, he resisted baptism, fearing his parents' strong opposition to Christianity. "I want to believe," he admitted, "but my parents forbid it." For years, his teacher encouraged him and prayed, but nothing changed. Discouraged, the teacher stopped praying. Not long after, Saoly's teacher felt led to pray again, faithfully lifting his name to God each day. After a month, at the baptism sign-up, Saoly appeared! When asked, he smiled and said, "My parents told me, 'If you want to believe, then believe.'"
