

# Reach One—Reach a Village





In the remote mountains of a communist country, a young father named Luke Pheth\* faced one of the darkest moments of his life.

At just 23 years old, Luke and his wife were eagerly expecting their first child. Though they were poor, they worked tirelessly to provide for their growing family, spending long days tending their rice field on the steep mountain slopes near their village.

One afternoon, after a full day of labor, Luke's wife made the familiar walk home alone. But this time, as she made her way along the path, she was violently attacked by evil spirits—a terrifying reality that many in their region have come to fear.

That night, in pain and panic, she gave birth prematurely to a baby girl. Just one week later, their newborn daughter died.

Shaken and devastated, Luke turned to the only help he knew: the village witch doctor. The diagnosis was grim. Unless they held a special ceremony and sacrificed a pig, the doctor warned, the spirits would return—and take their next child, too. But Luke didn't have the money to pay.

With no one to turn to and nowhere to go, Luke remembered something—his cousin was a Christian. That one thought changed everything.

Luke reached out, and his cousin contacted Michael Dang,\* his church pastor. Michael quickly sent a church member to Luke's home. They didn't come with charms or rituals—they came with faith and prayer.

The church member prayed boldly that night, asking God to break the power of the spirits and bring healing and hope to Luke's home. That one prayer began a spiritual transformation that would ripple through a village.

For a month, Luke and his wife continued to pray and seek God with open hearts. Then, unexpectedly, they moved to work on a banana farm in another region. It seemed like just another job, but God was already orchestrating something greater. In a remarkable twist of providence, **Chavanh Meang**,\* a faithful ASAP church planter, had also moved to the same farm—and was living in the very same building.

For the next year and a half, Chavanh shared the Bible with them, prayed with them, and taught them about Jesus. God was softening their hearts, healing their pain, and drawing them to the truth.

Eventually, Luke and his wife returned home. This time, they were not the same.

Luke soon began attending the local Seventh-day Adventist church. As he listened to the messages and experienced the love of the church family, his heart was deeply moved. When the next baptism was held, Luke made the life-changing decision to commit his life to Jesus, stepping out of spiritual darkness into a brand-new future.

After that day, everything changed. The evil spirits never returned. Sickness and strife vanished from their home. Luke and his wife began to truly love each other again. Peace and joy replaced fear and sorrow.

But Luke couldn't ignore what God put on his heart next.

Three years later, he looked around the church and saw that no one new was joining. He prayed, and God placed a bold idea in his heart: "What if I start a church in my own village?"

He spoke with his church pastor, who encouraged him to step out in faith and serve as a local missionary, doing what God was calling him to do. Several families from Luke's village who had been traveling to church each week joined him to begin worshiping in his home.

That was in 2020. Today, in 2025, Luke's home church has grown to 186 people from 27 families. Eighty-six have been baptized, and 100 more are preparing to give their lives to Jesus.
