General Information and Regulations

1. **HEALTH AND SAFETY:** The Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey all signs and the instructions of the Organiser, Officials and Stewards.
2. **CONDITIONS:**
 - 2.1 The organisers reserve the right to eliminate or refuse any entry or limit the number of entries in any class and to cancel, merge or alter any class.
 - 2.2 The organisers will not be responsible for any accident or loss of property or otherwise arising from any cause connected with the show, competitions and it is a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the organisers blameless and shall indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings.
 - 2.3 No entry fee will be refunded in any class without the submission of a valid Doctor certificate.
 - 2.4 Every exhibitor making entries for the show or competition days shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and it is on this understanding only those entries are accepted.
3. **ENTRY ELIGIBILITY:** Entrants for all classes should be within a 20-mile radius from the showground address (B96 6RD)
4. **AGE CATEGORIES:** There will be three categories of entrants, Junior (4 years – 17 years), Intermediate (18 years – 35 years) and Open. The Juniors and Intermediates but those aged under 35 years are not precluded for entering the open classes.
5. **JUDGING:** Exhibitors will be contacted prior to onsite judging to confirm date and times for this to take place. Stewards for the classes will then text you on the day to confirm what time the Judge will be with you. Dependant on the number of entries in any class (s), judging may be spread over more than one day.
6. **OFFICIALS DECISIONS:** The Committee have the right to refuse entries.
7. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
8. **OBJECTION PROTOCOL:** Any objection or protest to be lodged with the Horse Secretary within 30 minutes of the event in writing, together with the sum of £100 as deposit, such amount to be forfeited if the objection is overruled. The matter will be referred to the objection panel. Objections may not be settled on the day.
9. **JUDGES:** Should a Judge be unable to officiate, a substitute will be appointed. Any judge substitutions will be listed on the website.
10. **ENTRIES: ONLINE ENTRIES PREFERRED.** Paper entries may be made using the attached form and contacting Sue Farmer via the details above. Entry closing dates for the classes are available online and on the entry form.
11. **MEMBERSHIPS:** If you purchase an adult or junior membership, then your entries into the farm and crop competitions are free. You must submit your entries to showmanager@hanburysshow.co.uk as you will be unable to claim the free entry through the online entry system. Anyone becoming a Junior Member must have an Adult Membership purchased and an adult must accompany a Junior competitor to the show (if attending). Please see the table at the beginning of the schedule for Membership Prices.
12. **NON-MEMBERS:** will be required to make the entries and payments online or via the post.
13. **ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees may vary; all fees are stated in the Schedule. The Society is VAT registered. Receipts available on request. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees.
14. **PRIZE MONEY** is stated under each section. All classes will receive rosettes and prize cards to 6th place. Where remote/onsite judging takes place, prize money will be paid via BACS. Exhibits judged on show day will receive their prize money on the day. Uncollected prize money will be deemed a donation to charity.
15. **EXHIBITORS** are responsible for their exhibits.
16. **TROPHIES:** All trophy winners must sign for them at the secretary's trailer before leaving the showground. All trophies, unless stated, are perpetual and are to be held for the period between shows. Trophies must be returned cleaned, in good condition and returned no less than six weeks

before the Show. Trophies must be insured – guidance available from Trophy Secretary. Please note some trophies cannot be removed from the showground and will be retained by the Society. These trophies are available for photographs.

17. **CANCELLATIONS:** If the Show is cancelled due to poor weather (where the field is considered unusable by the committee) or any other reason outside the Society's control, the Society will refund the entry fee minus £2.50 to cover administration costs.
18. **DATA STORAGE:** Information from entry forms may be stored on computer; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the Press for publication. Information about exhibitors and their animals may also be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Depts. of County Councils, BCMS, SAC, and others having regulatory functions as well as the Society's Veterinary, Environmental Health, Legal and Safety Advisers. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.
