Isaiah's dream became Jesus' vision:




#### Cookie drop-off:



Cold and Flu season is upon us again. So, what can we do to try and stay well and prevent the invasion of germs/bacteria into our body? According to the CDC "since October 1, 2025 through November 22, 2025, there have been between 1.1 million to 6.7 million Flu Illnesses in the United States." These illnesses end up in Flu related Dr visits,

hospitalizations and can result in flu related deaths between 450-9400. Flu season runs typically between October to May according to the Florida Influenza Reports.

Chances are, the grocery cart you pushed, the escalator railing you held to get to the second floor of the mall, and the door handle you used to exit the movie theater have all been recently touched by someone suffering from or carrying the <u>cold</u> or <u>flu</u> germs. These bugs are contagious even before we show symptoms, so waiting until you feel sick to start exercising caution is too late.

Our hands are carriers of thousands of different types of germs/bacteria; in fact, the average hand harbors over 150 species. These are not just the cold and flu germs/bacteria that linger on our hands. Many of the species of bacteria found on our hands are harmless or may be even beneficial to the generally healthy person. E-Coli and Salmonella are not in this category. These are ones that we usually associate with the "GI Bug." They live in and cause problems in the gastrointestinal tract and during elimination sometimes ends up on the hands.

I once asked a nurse that worked in an Urgent Care who was seeing many sick folks during season...."how do you stay well with all these sick folks?" She said she keeps her hands away from her face. That makes sense! "Unfortunately, only five percent of us

properly **wash hands** after using the restroom." When we sneeze or blow our nose, we don't usually wash our hands immediately. Some of these germs/ bacteria

live well outside the body, on hard surfaces on linen or even in air droplets. Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus bacteria, otherwise known as MRSA, can live outside the body for days or even weeks under the right conditions.

So, what can we do to preserve our midst of all health the these germs/bacteria? Like the nurse told me....Keep your hands away from your face. Frequent hand washing with soap and water. Lather for 20 - 30 seconds before rinsing with clean water and then dry with air of a clean towel. When water is not available, then Hand Sanitizers may be appropriate. These should be 60-95% alcohol (mainly ethyl alcohol) to be effective against killing germs/ bacteria. As with soap, hand sanitizers should be rubbed onto all surfaces of the hand for 20-30 seconds and then allow drying.



Wipe shopping cart handles with sanitizing wipes and when you get home from the grocery store, wash all your fruits and vegetables. Lastly, If you are sick, stay home so others stay well.

#### Communications Corner

As the holidays approach, many of us are shopping online, giving to charities, and expecting packages at the do-or. Sadly, scammers know this too—and they often target older adults because they assume seniors are kind, trusting, and may be less familiar with newer technology. This season, a few minutes of caution can protect you and the people you love.

#### Common holiday scams to watch for:

#### 1. "Package problem" texts and emails.

You get a message that looks like it's from UPS, USPS, FedEx, or Amazon saying a delivery is delayed, needs a small fee, or requires you to "confirm" your address. The link leads to a fake site that steals your personal or banking information. These shipping-notification scams surge during December.

#### 2. Look-alike online stores and fake ads.

Scammers create websites that resemble real retailers or run convincing social-media ads for "too-good-to-be-true" deals. With today's tools, these sites can look very professional. People pay, but the gift never arrives—or their card details get stolen. Remember if the price is really low, it really is too good to be true!

#### 3. Gift card fraud.

Gift cards are a favorite holiday present—and a favorite tool for criminals. Some cards on store racks have been tampered with so scammers can drain the balance right after you buy them. Others involve someone pressuring you to pay for a "problem" using gift cards. Remember: no legitimate business, agency, or church will ever demand payment by gift card, including the clergy and staff of St. Michael's!

#### 4. Charity imposters.

The holidays bring out generosity, and scammers exploit it by posing as real charities (sometimes sounding like disaster-relief, veterans' groups, or even local churches). They may push for immediate donations and avoid giving clear details.

Always do research before you contribute and go to the real website of an organization, not one that someone calls, texts or emails you.

### 5. "Grandparent/relative in trouble" scams — now with AI.

A call or voicemail says a grandchild or loved one is stranded, arrested, or in the hospital and needs money right away. Increasingly, scammers use AI voice cloning to sound like someone you know. The story is urgent, emotional, and meant to keep you from checking first.

#### Simple ways to stay safe:

- Pause before you click or pay. Urgency is a scammer's best tool. Take a breath.
- Go directly to the source. If a delivery notice worries you, open your browser and type the company's real web address yourself. Don't use the link in the text or email.
- Verify with a trusted person. If you get a call asking for money or personal info, hang up and call a family member or friend you trust—or call the person supposedly in trouble using a known number.
- Be wary of unusual payment methods. Requests for gift cards, wire transfers, crypto, or "paying through a special link" should be treated as a bright red flag. I am always happy to help as well!
- Check charities carefully. Give through official websites or well-known platforms. If you're unsure, ask the church office—we're happy to help you confirm a legitimate ministry.
- Talk about scams openly. The best protection for seniors is a loving circle of awareness. Share this list with parents, neighbors, and friends.

#### If you think you've been targeted

You are not alone, and you don't need to feel embarrassed. Scammers are professionals at manipulation. If something seems off, talk to someone you trust right away. You can also contact the AARP Fraud Watch Network Helpline (877-908-3360) for free, friendly guidance, or report suspicious activity to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov.

Let's look out for one another this season. A little healthy caution helps ensure that our Christmas generosity goes where it belongs—toward joy, love, and the care of our neighbors.



# Beyond the Broken Heart: Grief Support Group Starting Dec. 5 10am in the Meditation room @ St. Michael's

Saint Michael's will be offering a Grief Support Group beginning Friday, December 5th through Friday, February 27th. The group will meet weekly on Fridays at 10 AM, with the exception of December 26th.

This program provides a safe & supportive place for those who have lost a loved one to walk through the journey of grief alongside others who share similar experiences. Using Understanding Your Grief, created by Alan D. Wolfelt, Ph.D., C.T. there is no charge for the materials, optional donation basket to help cover costs will be available.

The group will be led by Wayne Luman, who has 20 years of experience in ministry, along with his wife, Cathy. Together, they have facilitated grief and support groups and have personally experienced grief and loss in their own lives. The St. Michael's Outreach Ministry is so very grateful to you for your thoughts, prayers, financial support and hands on engagement this past year. In thinking back on how we have been involved with our world, it has been another year of many blessings in so many ways.

We are fortunate to have wonderful financial support to share with communities near and far and have endeavored to share those resources responsibly. Most of our resources, both volunteer and financial, go to non-profits off island in Lee and neighboring counties. Those primarily include Misión Peniel, Pine Manor, Gladiolus Food Pantry, All Souls Episcopal Church, Community Cooperative and Lee Interfaith for Empowerment (L.I.F.E.). recently you have helped very successfully with our Holliday Giving Tree for Misión Peniel and Thanksgiving food collection for Gladiolus Food Pantry, and they are so very grateful. gratitude also comes from L.I.F.E. for your continued support, that is helping build their resources for working on social justice issues throughout our county.

Our on-island partnerships are very active also, primarily with CHR, FISH, and the Sanibel School, most recently with The Festival of Trees, Jog-n-Jam, and Thanksgiving celebrations. We have also been engaged with Love Sanibel Back and are part of Spiritual Pathways.

Our engagement goes far beyond our local community with support to communities in need across our world. This year we supported communities struggling from humanitarian and natural disasters in Haiti, South Sudan and Jamaica, as well as supporting students in the Dominican Republic. We were also very much engaged with natural disasters in the United States, as a St. Michael's team traveled to Burnsville, North Carolina to help folks rebuild during their struggles with the devastation caused by Hurricane Helene.

#### Women's Retreat — March 21


