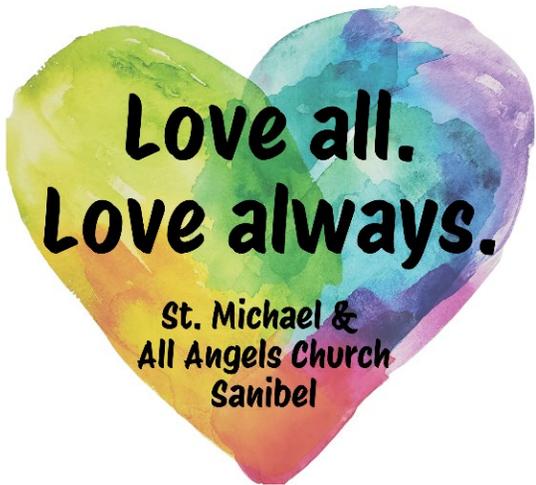

Soon you will receive a letter in your mailbox inviting you to make a gift to UTO. We hope you will give generously because the offerings for your blessings become the blessings for others.

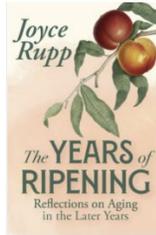

## Lent-in-a Bag

**Lent bags are filled with spiritual practices!**

Lent is a season to look at our spiritual health; to take some time to assess our relationship with God and others. This doesn't have to be a complicated or a time-consuming thing but rather something that can be done in the midst of our ordinary lives.

Our Lent in a Bag kits provide several resources to help you do just that, including a daily reflection booklet, Living Well through Lent that not only has a daily thought but, in the back, has several pages of examples of spiritual practices that you can explore. Read through them and pick one to try this season! If it doesn't speak to you, try another one and it might just be something you continue to do beyond Lent!

Also in the kits is a Living Compass Faith and Wellness Self-Assessment; a tool that you fill out and then chart on a circular compass the results to give you a visual look at the various components of your life. Perhaps it might show an area or two that needs some attention. If you found it helpful and want to explore it more, there will be a workshop on the assessment on March 23 at the Sanibel Recreation Center.

Also in the bag is an actual working compass that you can attach to your key ring, purse or backpack as a visual reminder that God is always at your side to guide you on life's path.

## Wellness 4 Life

The Sanibel Recreation Center has launched a Wellness 4 Life initiative, designed to promote wellness across the lifespan. In addition to fitness programming, Wellness 4 Life expands the Center's commitment to cognitive and brain health through a variety of talks, workshops, and interactive classes that are offered at no cost to the community.

St. Michael's is partnering with the Rec Center on two upcoming programs, which I will lead. After a popular January session, I've been asked to return with the **Exploring the Danish Practice of Hygge** interactive workshop on Thursday, March 12 from noon-1:30pm. If you haven't attended it yet, I encourage you to do so and bring a friend; it's a fun, interactive experience!

I'll also be leading a workshop focused on **Discovering Your Compass** and cultivating balance and wholeness on Monday, March 23 from noon-1:30pm. A faith and wellness self-assessment was included in the Lent in a Bag Kits. We will be using a secular version of that, an Adult Wellness Assessment, for this workshop and this will expand on that and give insights into working on the results of that assessment. It is amazing what you can learn about yourself in just a few minutes when you take the time!

Both of these workshops are free, and open to the public, you do not need to be a Rec Center member to attend. Please RSVP however, by calling the Rec Center at 239-472-0345. ## From Your Parish Nurse, Wendy



Each March, National Sleep Awareness Month reminds us just how important sleep truly is to our overall health. While many people think of sleep as simply “rest,” it is actually a critical part of maintaining physical health, emotional balance, and mental clarity. Unfortunately, millions of Americans are not getting enough of it.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), about 35% of adults in the United States sleep fewer than seven hours per night, which is less than the recommended minimum for adults (CDC, Sleep and Sleep Disorders). Consistently getting too little sleep has been linked to serious health concerns, including heart disease, diabetes, obesity, stroke, depression, and anxiety. Sleep deficiency doesn't just make us tired—it can increase long-term health risks.

The issue is not limited to adults. The CDC also reports that nearly 78% of high school students do not get the recommended eight hours of sleep on school nights (CDC, Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance). Developing brains and bodies require more rest, yet most teens are falling short. Additionally, data show that many younger children are not meeting age-appropriate sleep guidelines, which can affect behavior, attention, and academic performance.

Beyond sleep duration, quality matters as well. The CDC notes that 14.5% of adults report trouble falling asleep most days or every day (CDC, National Health Interview Survey). Difficulty staying asleep is also common. Poor sleep quality can interfere with concentration, mood stability, workplace productivity, and overall well-being.

National Sleep Awareness Month encourages individuals to adopt healthier sleep habits. Experts recommend maintaining a consistent bedtime schedule, limiting screen time before bed, creating a quiet and comfortable sleep environment, and speaking with a healthcare provider if sleep problems persist.



Prioritizing sleep is one of the simplest yet most powerful ways to protect long-term health. By becoming more aware of how much and how well we sleep, we can take meaningful steps toward healthier lives.
