Susie Wilson and Sue Sterrett are coordinating this year's stewardship campaign. You will receive a packet in the mail later this month.







From Your Parish Nurse, Wendy



November is the National Family Caregivers Month, which leads me to think, it is a time when we all need to reach out and recognize all the family caregivers who provide assistance to loved ones who are ill, disabled, injured, or just aging and need help. Some of these caregivers are aging along with those they are trying to assist. Others have jobs in the workforce, are parents, or they may be struggling with an illness themselves. Sound familiar?

According to the National Council on Aging, "Families are often the primary source of support for older adults and people with disabilities. In fact, today in America, more than 53 million family caregivers provide unpaid care. That's an economic value totaling more than \$470 billion."

Caregiving sometimes can be overwhelming and even make you feel isolated and alone. We need to be aware of people in our congregation and community that may need you. The need can be as simple a listening ear, preparing a meal or even a little respite time to allow them to recharge.

Sometimes it is difficult to navigate and find the resources that can help caregivers. Use the 'Helpful Caregiver Resources' list provided to maybe find some avenues to help. Luminary Volunteers Needed!






