#### MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

### Spiritual Pathways

Engaging in spiritual practices is how we grow in our faith. One of the most common (and important) spiritual practices for us Christians is celebrating the Eucharist. Going all the way back to Jesus' last supper with his disciples, followers of Jesus have gathered to tell the story (Liturgy of the Word) and to break the bread (Liturgy of the Eucharist). This practice shapes and forms us as disciples striving to live the Way of Love, reminding us who we are (God's beloved) and what we are called to do (love and serve the world in God's name).

But the Eucharist isn't the only spiritual practice. There are literally hundreds of ways to grow closer to God and one another. Some people find spiritual growth and enlightenment through nature walks, or yoga, or serving the less fortunate. Others grow through learning and enjoy book groups, discussions and Bible study. Others engage in prayer practices like meditation or morning prayer or compline from the Prayer Book. Some enjoy retreat experiences or days of reflection. There are countless spiritual practices: knitting, visiting someone who is sick, being a Eucharistic visitor, singing in the choir, etc. etc. etc. etc. ...

As a way of organizing and expanding spiritual practices here at St. Michael's, we have created Spiritual Pathways. This effort "seeks to nurture the sacred journey of each individual by offering diverse spiritual pathways that awaken the heart, engage the body, and expand the soul. Through contemplative practice, active service, compassionate care, formation and communal worship, there are opportunities for transformation, healing, and deeper connection with the unconditional love of God. Rooted in love and open to all, we walk together on the journey of sacred discovery."

"In Florida, pharmacies can administer the 2025-2026 Covid-19 vaccine to eligible adults (18+) without a prescription, provided they have a protocol agreement with a supervising physician. Major pharmacies like Publix, Walgreens, and CVS have confirmed they are offering the updated shot." Basically, it is an approved standard for vaccinations that pharmacies follow.

# From Your Parish Nurse, Wendy

October is Breast
Cancer Awareness
Month. The following are
statistics quoted from the

National Breast Cancer Foundation Inc. "One out of every eight women in the United States will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime." "In 2025, an estimated 316,950 women and 2,800 men will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer, and an additional 59,080 new cases of non-invasive breast cancer diagnosed." Breast cancer does affect all races and all ethnic groups. "Black women are 40% more likely to die from breast cancer than white women." Hispanic women have a lower incidence of breast cancer than any other group. Asian, Pacific Islanders, 1American Indian and Alaska Native women all have a lower incidence of breast cancer and death from breast cancer. Of all ethnic groups, "an estimated 42,170 U.S. women will die from breast cancer in 2025." "Breast cancer is the most common cancer in American women, except for skin cancers." "Half the women diagnosed with cancer are 62 years old or younger. About 9% of all new breast cancer cases in the U.S. are diagnosed in women younger than 45 years old." Like with any cancer, early detection is critical to long survival rates. According to the American Cancer Society, "Mammograms can often show abnormal areas in the breast. They can't tell for sure if an abnormal area is cancer, but they can help health care providers decide if more testing (such as a breast biopsy) is needed." Sometimes other additional tests like ultrasound and CT scans are indicated as well for questionable results.

We are fortunate in our area to have two organizations that support those with breast cancer who are underinsured or not insured at all. They support them emotionally and financially. On Sanibel and Captiva there is the Pink Project. Mary Bondurant is the founder of the San Cap Pink Project. They have different events that occur during the year to fundraise, as well as

events that support and promote help to the community. One of those events is the Pink Out Picnic: Health & Hope Expo which is happening on Thursday, October 23rd. St Michaels will have a table at this event. Thanks to those who are knitting pink mini shawls that we will have at our table. We will also have literature to tell people who and what we are. This event is open to the community but be sure and register for lunch.

Another organization that also supports those who are unable to financially meet the needs and challenges of breast cancer is Partners for Breast Cancer Care. Their Mission Statement states they are "dedicated to serving our community's women and men who desperately need (our) help." Partners "fund breast cancer screening, diagnostic testing and treatment for underserved women and men in Lee, Hendry, Glades, Collier and Charlotte Counties at no cost to them."

# Women of St. Michael's Salute the Men Sharing Our Journey with Love

The "Episcopal Church Women" (ECW) of Saint Michael's, comprised of all women at Saint Michael's (regardless of denomination), last month celebrated the 51st anniversary of Episcopal women's ordination to the priesthood. To my surprise and delight, I learned that our very own **Father Stan Dull** was a part of this.



When he was seminarian, he told his bishop Right (The Reverand Ogilby) that he did not want to be ordained before women Stan's advisor told him, "If you persist with this, you will never be a bishop" (which proved true). Bishop

Ogilby did appoint Stan—a Deacon, not yet a priest--Co-chair of the Diocese of Pennsylvania's Committee to Plan for and Promote the Ordination of Women. As such, he was friends with Susan Haitt, a woman who became one of the famous Philadelphia Eleven. She asked him to make sure a proper bulletin for the service on July 29 was published and that was his behind-the- scenes role that day.

After the ordination, the Presiding Bishop called all the bishops to a confab in Chicago. Still Co-Chair of the Pennsylvania Committee, Stan went to Chicago as an "interested party," not in with the bishops but in an outside room, listening. The bishops were trying to decide if the ordinations were valid. Stan remembers hearing one bishop say "Sometimes someone has to go too far so the rest of us will go far enough." The bishops decided the ordinations were "Valid but irregular." In view of that, Stan's Committee decided it would be best for him to actually be ordained to the priesthood (he had a call from a parish where he was a Deacon) and become the Priest-in-Charge and invite one of the newly-

ordained women to serve at a regular service. That did happen, in 1975, at the Church of the Ascension in Parkesburg, PA—a key milestone on the journey of women.

Thank you, Father Stan Dull! While we are applauding the guys, we also give a big shout out for the men of Noah's Ark. They lift the furniture, fix just about anything, unload the dock, keep up spirits, and help eat the cookies. Over the years, men of the Ark have done décor, books, hauling and housewares. There is a spot waiting for you. Come join the gang:

Safeguarding Online<sup>TM</sup> is an internet-based training program developed by Praesidium and provided by the Church Pension Group. Safeguarding Online can be accessed at any time, from anywhere. The program presently consists of six modules. Each module offers easy to understand, step-by-step instruction and ends with a brief quiz.

- Those holding elected or appointed positions throughout the Diocese, including all Diocesan Committees, Councils and Agencies




