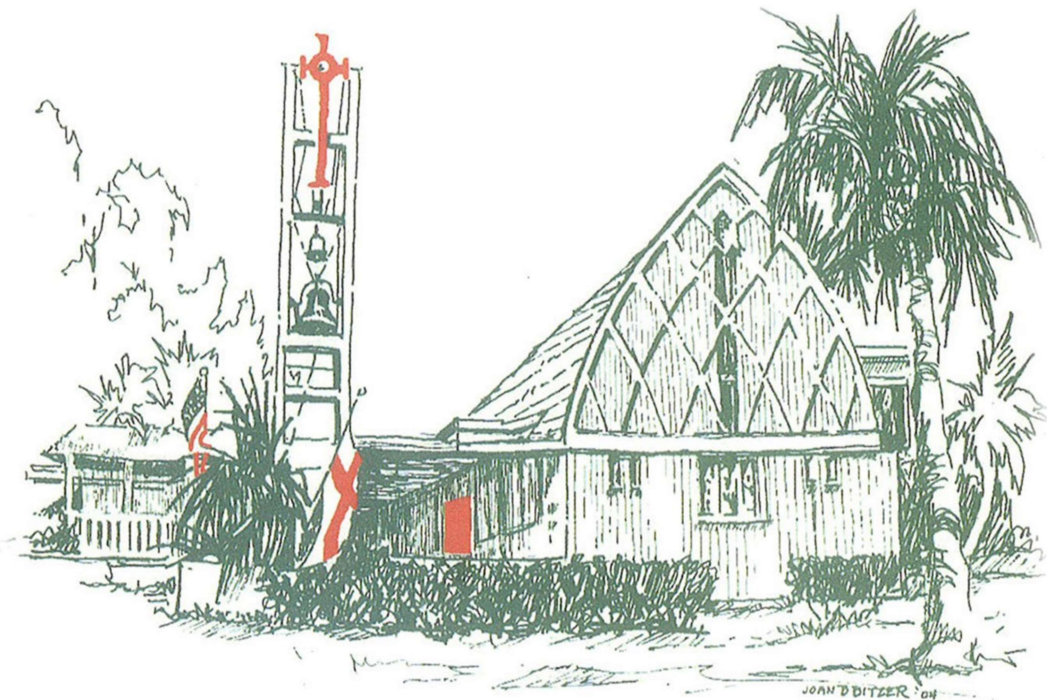

About Our Worship Today

Worship in the Episcopal Church is participatory and embodied. We stand and kneel, make the sign of the cross at times, sing and breathe together, and walk forward for communion each week. You are welcome to participate at your own comfort level. You will likely see people engaging differently at different times. One of the gifts of the Episcopal tradition is that there are a variety of 'right' ways to participate. The service booklet will give you the words you need and instructions. The words in bold print are said by everyone. Hymns can be found either in the booklet or in the blue or red hymnals in your pew.

May I have Communion?

Yes. All may come forward to receive communion (or the Eucharist). None are required to receive. We serve both bread and wine. You may choose to receive at your own comfort level, both bread and wine or just bread. You may take a sip of wine from the cup that is offered to you or dip the host into the chalice. You may also come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing, or you may choose not to come forward at all. Children may receive at any age.

Restrooms

Exit at the red doors in the back of the church and walk along the exterior deck through the double glass doors. Down that hallway are accessible restrooms on either side.

Worshiping with Kids

Joyful noise is most welcome here. Many families find that sitting close to the front helps children to see and engage better with the service. Our children's chapel program is held on the first Sunday of the month. It offers children a chance to participate in the first part of our service through story, song, and crafts at their level. We have changing stations in both restrooms.

The Liturgical Season

The Easter Season lasts for 50 days from Easter Sunday through the Day of Pentecost. We celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead following his crucifixion. Easter is the heart of Christian belief. Easter sets the experience of springtime next to the ancient stories of deliverance and the proclamation of the risen Christ. As we sing in hymn #182: "Christ is alive! His Spirit burns through this and every future age, till all creation lives and learns his joy, his justice, love, and praise."





The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 10:11-18

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. 
