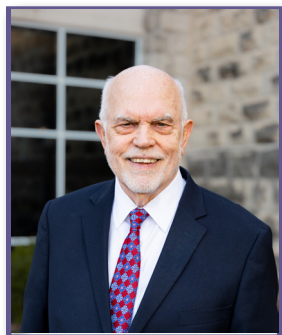

Picture this: in a dorm room across town, a young college student is sitting in front of a television, a laptop on her knees. On the computer's screen is 1.) a paper for a freshman English class, 2.) an internet page streaming TikTok videos, and 3.) an instant message window with multiple on-going conversations. Did I mention the snack next to the chair... or the cell phone waiting to ring? To ever-growing generations of young men and women, this is the world in which we all live. To those of us who grew up in an earlier age it's evidence of little less than chaos!

Truth be told, however, all of us multi-task to some degree. New studies reveal that we do a lot of it while we're driving. It's not cell phones that cause the most accidents through inattention while driving either, it's eating! Do YOU drink coffee while you're driving? Eat a muffin on the way to work? Start on the hamburger you got at the drive-thru before you get to wherever you're headed? I know, me too. However, even if the term is a new one as are some of the activities, we've all been doing it for a long time. What would your drive to work look like if these were part of your multi-tasking? What would dinner with your family be like if these were part of your multi-tasking? What would the serious conversation you need to have with a loved one be like if these were part of your multi-tasking?

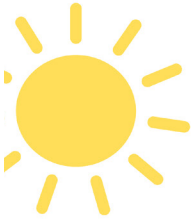

Seekers

Seekers is a group of young-at-heart seniors who are passionate about growing in faith and building meaningful friendships. At the core of this class is a strong sense of fellowship, where connection and conversation are just as important as study.

Each week, the class explores Scripture using the United Methodist Lectionary, taking time to understand the historical context and how those passages speak into our lives today. Sessions often include a short video for added insight, along with thoughtful discussion that allows everyone to learn from one another's experiences. The class also draws from John Wesley's teachings, helping connect faith to our Methodist roots.

By exploring the culture, setting, and people within each passage, the group works to better understand both the original message and its meaning for today. Members are encouraged to ask questions, share perspectives, and reflect on how God is at work in their daily lives. This shared learning environment helps deepen understanding, strengthen faith, and build lasting connections within the class.

Seekers meets Sundays at 10:00 AM on the third floor of the Education Center in the last classroom on the left.

Class members value the opportunity to learn from one another, offering encouragement and perspective through shared experiences and thoughtful discussion. Rooted Parents: It's a Season

Rooted Parents is a Sunday School class for parents in every stage of life—from expectant and new parents to those raising school-aged children, teenagers, and even adult children. We meet in The Link each Sunday (except the first Sunday of the month) from 10 to 10:45 a.m. during the discipleship hour.

This class offers a space for encouragement, honest conversation, and growing in faith together. We begin with fellowship, then move into Scripture, guided discussion, and practical take-home applications, ending in prayer.

After a six-week journey through Ecclesiastes—learning to trust God in every season—we'll soon begin a new series on 1 Corinthians 13, focusing on what truly matters in our homes and how love shapes the legacy we leave.

Open Door

Open Door is a welcoming, Scripture-based class for adults ages 70 and up who are seeking continued growth in faith and meaningful connection with others. With a strong foundation in God's Word, this class offers a steady and thoughtful approach to discipleship in a supportive community.

Each Sunday, the group gathers to explore a printed Sunday School curriculum, using it as a guide for engaging, discussion-based learning. Conversations are rich with insight, life experience, and a shared desire to better understand Scripture and its relevance for today.

The class meets in Classroom 1/2 and offers a friendly, relaxed environment where everyone is encouraged to participate, reflect, and grow together in faith.

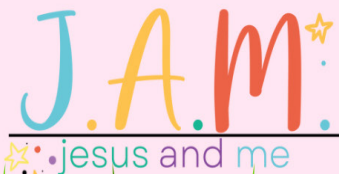



Scripture Focus for April

"Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep."

Romans 12:15

One of the reasons I started writing this monthly Scripture Focus was to give all of us something to talk about. Something we could mention to someone we've never met before, or a small spark to start a conversation with the person sitting next to us in the pew on Sunday morning.

This month, our conversation starter is a verse is all too familiar. It sounds simple. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. But like so many things that sound simple, it is easy to forget in real life.

I'll admit it, I sometimes get so caught up in my own little world - checking my email, thinking about the week ahead, worrying if I remembered to feed the dog - that I forget to celebrate the small joys around me. And don't even get me started on sharing in someone else's sadness without awkwardly fumbling my words.

This verse reminds us that our faith isn't just about private devotion or inward reflection. It's about being present with each other, noticing what's happening in someone else's life, and really engaging in the mess, the joy, and the celebration of living together as a community.

Here's the practical part. This spring, I want to challenge myself, and all of us, to use this as a conversation starter. See someone smiling about a new grandchild? Share in their joy. Notice someone looking tired or down? Ask them how they're doing and really listen. Maybe even say, "I'm praying for you," or better yet, share a funny anecdote that might make them smile. Trust me, it works better than you think.

And here's where the season helps. Spring gives us lots of natural conversation starters. Did someone's tulips survive the frost? Did the Easter Bunny finally get around to your neighborhood? Has anyone already eaten too many jellybeans? These light moments open doors to deeper conversations and shared laughter.

The goal is simple. Use Romans 12:15 as a gentle nudge to connect with people, celebrate life's wins, and share a shoulder when things get hard. Conversations like that often turn into the kind of connections that matter. And let's be honest, sometimes all it takes is one comment about the church coffee or the pollen count to start a meaningful exchange.

So this April, as Easter and spring fill us with new life and energy, let's remember that our faith is also alive in the ways we interact with one another. Joy and Sorrow are easier to carry when we share them, and laughter only grows when it is shared, even if it is over who hid the last chocolate bunny.

And just to be clear, I am still practicing this myself. So if you see me awkwardly celebrating your good news or fumbling my way through sympathy, consider it my humble attempt at Scripture in action. Rejoice together. Share the journey. Start a conversation.
