


One hundred years ago this month, the cornerstone was laid for our sanctuary. Perhaps you will want to go outside and check the date. If you have children, it can be a wonderful teaching moment about the importance of dates and how we remember them with cornerstones. They are a lasting reminder of when our building was built.

According to our written church history, the cornerstone was laid as construction began in 1925. The congregation had worshiped in a previous building that was removed to make way for the new sanctuary. In the walls of that earlier building, a time capsule



It certainly took faith to begin such a project. Lucinda Harris—yes, the same woman connected with the Harris Building—donated \$16,000, a substantial gift at that time. According to Google, that would be about \$295,000 today. What a witness to her love for God and her belief that this church would be a place where people could grow in or discover faith.

We will celebrate the beginning of our church building with a hymn sing on October 19, 2025. Next year, we will mark 100 years of having the organ with a special concert. We even have the original 1926 bulletin from the organ's dedication concert. A world-renowned organist will join us to play, including several of the same pieces performed at

that very first concert.



One hundred years later, we are still worshiping in this sacred place. What a legacy, and what a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us as we gather here. See you in October for joyful worship and, of course, the KSU Men's Basketball Dinner.

We are excited to share that our church has recently switched to a new database system called Realm. For a number of years we relied on our previous provider, but the system was no longer keeping up with updates or fixing issues as they arose. This created challenges for our staff and limited what we could do as a congregation. After careful review, we realized it was time

for a system that would be easier to use, more cost-effective, and equipped to keep pace with today's technology. Realm offers all of that and more, streamlining several apps into one, reducing website hosting costs, and providing our staff with advanced, hands-on tools for communication, scheduling, reporting, and ministry support.

Through Realm, members will be able to update their own information, sign up for events, stay connected with groups and ministries, and give securely online with just a few clicks. Volunteers will also benefit from clearer scheduling and communication.



Frequently Asked Questions

Do I need to download the app?

No. You can access Realm online at https://onrealm.org. Simply create a password, and you can log in to use all features without needing to download the app.

Does this change how we live-stream Sunday worship?

No. You can still find our live stream on our website or on our Facebook page.

Do I need to use Realm to participate in church activities or volunteer?

No, you don't have to use Realm to attend worship or events. However, using Realm steamlines the ability to sign up for events, volunteering, and connecting with groups.

I didn't get an email, or the email link doesn't work. What should I do?

If you are having problems with the email, please contact Cathlene in the church office at chiggins@ fumcmanhattan.com. We may need to check our records to ensure we have the correct email on file. Please note that Realm links do expire, so you may need a new one sent to you.

While it may take a little time to get used to this new system, we believe Realm is the right step for our church. It helps us be better stewards of resources, supports our staff with the tools they need, and provides all of us with a simple, user-friendly way to stay connected. We are still early in setting up all the features this system provides, and many of our groups and activities are still being added. We encourage you to set up an account, log in, explore all that it offers, and be patient as we continue to implement the great tools Realm provides that you will soon be able to enjoy.

If you have any questions or run into any issues, I am happy to help. Please feel free to stop by the church office or give me a call anytime. I want to make sure your experience with Realm is easy and enjoyable.

YOUR FUMC OFFERINGS AT WORK


The First United Methodist Church of Manhattan performs God's work by providing and supporting a variety of programs that assist families, individuals, and children in our community as well as internationally. The means by which the Church provides these needed services on your behalf is accomplished in large part by your generous Giving. To that end we want to provide you with timely updates of the Church's financial position.

The graph below, which is updated monthly, provides a snapshot in time that compares actual monthly Giving to actual monthly expenses. You will note that Receipts are slightly lagging Expenses by \$12.6K dollars year-to-date. Applying a simple analysis using eight months of actual Receipts, coupled with four months of projected Receipts based upon a 2024 trend line, Receipts would fall short of projected expenses by an estimated \$37.7K dollars at the end of the fiscal year. The major factor for the shortfall remains the church's apportionment obligation.

Apportionments are funds that local churches make to assist in funding wider ministry activities. To date, the church has paid approximately \$25K toward its obligation of \$108K. This represents a start bolstering faith and commitment that FUMC can and will stand behind its obligation in support of God's ministry. While this is a positive step forward, as noted above, we are still facing a shortfall which needs to be addressed. The reassuring news is that there is still time left in the year to do just that!

Your Finance Committee, along with pastors and all committees within the Church, continue to focus on identifying ways to meet that worthy goal. But it will also need a unified congregation focused on stewardship, prayer, and action.








Join friends of Anapra on the November mission trip to the Susanna Wesley School!

Dates: November 22 thru November 30, 2025

Location: Anapra, Mexico (just across the border from El Paso, TX)

Our Mission:

The Susanna Wesley School is a private, Christian school in Anapra, Mexico, just across the border from El Paso, Texas. The school has 1st through 6th grade students in classes of approximately 20 to 25 students in each grade.

The school was founded 25 years ago by Antonio Briones, a former United Methodist pastor. Antonio and his wife Dina operate the school to this day, providing exceptional educational opportunities to students in a poverty-striken area, while sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ with the students and their families.

Friends of Anapra is a Manhattan, Kansas-based 501(c)(3) organization with a mission to support this incredible school through regular mission trips to maintain and update facilities, as well as monthly financial support for teacher salaries and operational expenses.

How can I participate in this Mission Trip?

Contact Friends of Anapra (info below) and let them know you want to go. The cost is \$600 per person (\$400 for students). We will depart for Anapra on November 22, cross the border, and settle into mission housing on Sunday the 23rd. The week of November 24-28 we will engage in mission work. We will depart for Kansas on Saturday, November 29 to arrive home the afternoon of November 30.

- 5. Fill in personal information. Enter "MY114" you will then see First UMC Groceries for God.
- 6. Click in the circle as this is our Groceries for God program.
- 7. Click on save and you should get a note at the top of the page indicating that your sign up has been completed.

You will automatically start earning rewards for FUMC right away on qualifying purchases*, made using your Shopper's plus card!

*Things that do not qualify are fuel, postage, alcohol, tobacco, Kroger gift cards, variable load gift cards among other things, but can be found on the website.
