YOUR FUMC OFFERINGS AT WORK


The First United Methodist Church of Manhattan performs God's work by providing and supporting a variety of programs that assist families, individuals, and children in our community as well as internationally. The means by which the Church provides these needed services on your behalf is accomplished in large part by your generous Giving. To that end we want to provide you with timely updates of the Church's financial position.

The graph below, which is updated monthly, provides a snapshot in time that compares actual monthly Giving to actual monthly expenses. You will note that Receipts have slightly exceeded Expenses by \$3.6K dollars year-to-date. Applying a simple analysis using seven months of actual Receipts, coupled with five months of projected Receipts based upon a 2024 trend line, Receipts would fall short of projected expenses by an estimated \$44.4K dollars at the end of the fiscal year. The major factor for the shortfall is attributed to the apportionment.

You may recall in last month's report that FUMC had not made a payment toward its apportionment obligation of \$108K. Apportionments are funds that local churches make to assist in funding wider ministry activities. I am pleased to report that since that publication \$18K dollars has been pledged toward the apportionment. This represents a good start bolstering faith and commitment that FUMC can and will stand behind its obligation in support of God's ministry. While this is a positive step forward, as noted above, we are still facing a shortfall which needs to be addressed. The reassuring news is that there is still time left in the year to do just that!

Your Finance Committee, along with pastors and all committees within the Church, continue to focus on identifying ways to meet that worthy goal. But it will also need a unified congregation focused on stewardship, prayer, and action.

SCRIPTURE FOCUS FOR SEPTEMBER


"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

September may bring Friday night lights and college kickoffs, but for many in our community, the real season is harvest. While the rest of the world debates quarterbacks and rankings, our farmers are watching the skies, running the combines, and praying over fields. It is long hours, aching backs, and a kind of faith city folks rarely understand.

Paul's reminder in Galatians speaks right into this moment. God sees every seed we plant, every act of kindness, every step of obedience, and every ounce of effort poured into our work, our families, and our faith. Just like the fields, the seeds we plant in our lives will produce a harvest in His timing, not ours. The waiting can be hard, but the promise is sure: if we do not give up, God will bring fruit from our faithfulness.

So as the combines roll and the sun sets earlier each evening, take heart. Your labor, whether in a field, a classroom, an office, or a quiet corner of your home, is not in vain. The same God who designed the rhythm of seed time and harvest is tending to the soil of your life. Keep sowing. Keep believing. And when the time is right, the harvest will come. Not just in grain or success, but in peace, joy, and a deeper trust in the One who never fails.

And maybe that is the bigger lesson of September. Seasons change. Fields empty. Leaves fall. Yet God's faithfulness stays steady through it all. No matter where you are planting, no matter what you are waiting on, you are not forgotten. The Lord of the harvest has already prepared the blessing.



- 2. Create an account including your e-mail address If you do not have an email address see instructions below
- 3. Enter your shopper card number or alternate ID# and last name
- 4. On the account summary screen scroll all the way down to Community Rewards click "en-roll"
- 5. Fill in personal information. Enter "MY114" you will then see First UMC Groceries for God.
- 6. Click in the circle as this is our Groceries for God program.
- 7. Click on save and you should get a note at the top of the page indicating that your sign up has been completed.

You will automatically start earning rewards for FUMC right away on qualifying purchases*, made using your Shopper's plus card!

*Things that do not qualify are fuel, postage, alcohol, tobacco, Kroger gift cards, variable load gift cards among other things, but can be found on the website.




