top Children's Cancer (Stop) was founded in 1981, by a 10-year old girl, named Bonnie, diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia or ALL. At the time, the survival rate for ALL was 35%; now in 2020 it is 90%!

Bonnie wanted to raise money to help other children and their families, so they would have a better future. Bonnie passed away in 1983 at the age of 12. Stop continues with the Mission: Committed to the Prevention, Control and Cure of Childhood Cancers.

Beginning in 1985, from the donations raised the Board of Directors started funding researchers, equipment and projects at UF Health. After donating over \$5 million dollars, Stop Children's Cancer Medical Advisory Board suggested supporting

Clinical Trials. In 2010, for the next 7 years, Stop pledged to donate \$1,050,000 at \$150,000 per year for the Stop Children's Cancer / Bonnie R. Freeman Clinical Trials.

In 2018, for the next 5 years, an additional \$1,000,000 was pledge: \$750,000 at \$150,000 per year to continue the Stop Children's Cancer / Bonnie R. Freeman Clinical Trials and \$250,000 at \$50,000 per year to establish the Sarcoma Clinical Trials. In 2019, the Board renamed the Sarcoma Clinical Trials in memory of Kimberly to the Stop Children's Cancer / Kimberly H. Flaitz Research Grant.

Teaming up with Sister Hazel's Lyrics for Life Foundation in 2019 and 2020, a generous gift of \$100,000 each year, totaling \$200,000, was donated to Stop. In memory of Jeffrey,

this gift established the Lyrics for Life / Stop Children's Cancer Jeffrey A. Block Research Grant for personalized targeted immunotherapy for T-cell Lymphoma and Leukemia.

To date, Stop Children's Cancer, a 501(C) (3), has raised over \$8 million dollars for significant research of childhood cancers at UF Health. As a result of Stop's many years of "seed money" donations to UF Health, an excess of well over \$20 million has been secured by Doctors and Researchers from additional donors advancing clinical trials and critical research. Stop continues donating to UF Health with the support of our amazing and giving community!!
