#### **Mini Police**

Mini Police visited Wilfred Fuller House which is the Police Operational Training Centre in Clevedon. It specifically



provides training for the mounted section of the police force as well as training police dogs. This training centre is not open to the public so it was a unique opportunity to see first hand what kind of things the police do. As promised, I have included some photographs of what the children got up to.



Over the day, we visited 4 different areas. The first area

showed the children how they use drones in their work. They saw the different kinds of drones used, how they work and gave a great demonstration how they fly.


We then moved on to how they train the police horses. Children pretended to be a football crowd who were cheering and making a noise to show how the horse remained calm.
