Risk Assessment for Intervention Groups

Activity / Process / Operation

Working safely with Intervention Groups

Identify the hazards (anything that can cause harm):

Children and staff contracting the Corona Virus

Who might be harmed and how?

Children and adults catching Corona Virus through not maintaining social distancing and cross contamination

Estimate Risk Level (H/M/L)
Low

What measures are in place to reduce the risk?

- Interventions will take place in the corridor or empty rooms, which will be well ventilated – windows and doors open.
- Adults can work across different classes and year groups but should limit close contact with other adults and children as much as possible.
- Children in the intervention will maintain social distancing and work facing one way whilst in the intervention as far as possible.
- The adult must avoid close face to face contact with a pupil whenever possible.
- Staff delivering interventions will not be required to wear a mask.
- Children will bring their own equipment to use.
- The area that has been used by the children and adults during the intervention needs to be cleaned at the end of each session before a new group starts an intervention.
- Children attending an intervention must be from the same class group bubble.
- Children from different class bubbles must not mix at any point during the school day.
