KSRA MATCHES: Information presented here is for CKGC matches only. Contact KSRA High Power Chairman John Heger for match bulletins for KSRA matches; contact information directly above. Note that the KSRA's State Championship Matches for Service Rifle, Match Rifle and Mid-Range are eligible for "legs" toward the Kansas Distinguished Rifleman Badge for KSRA members.

Rules: Current NRA/CMP High Power rules will govern as applicable. Empty chamber indicators will be required, available at \$2.00 each.

Eligibility: Open to all competitors; see KSRA match bulletins for special KSRA eligibilities and rules.

Entries and Fees: \$20.00 approved matches, \$15 non-approved, \$25 for benefit matches. See below for late entry fee policy. New for 2026 for ALL matches, registration starts at 8 AM,

closes at 8:45 and commence fire at 9 AM. Exception for Oct 9 3x600 match (see calendar on Page 1). Late arrivals may not be accepted. Pre-registration is available for KSRA matches only; see contact information on Page 5. For pre-registration for Fall Superlative Match, see above.

Late Entry Fee: This program survives on shooter provided assistance to function. Shooters are expected to arrive early enough to assist in setting out targets. Similarly, at the conclusion of live fire, shooters are expected to expeditiously stow their gear and quickly report to the pits to assist in tearing down and storing target equipment. Participants arriving during the last 15 minutes of the registration period or later will be subject to a \$10 late entry fee. If you are not here in time to provide assistance in one way, we will ensure your assistance another way.

Classification: NRA/CMP classification will be used as applicable. Those not having current classification will fire as Master Unclassified. If a class has less than three shooters, those individuals will fire in the next higher class, excluding the High Master class. Service rifle and Match rifle will compete together in one classification. Match rifle will be “any sight” except for Mid-Range Matches (see Mid-Range Course of Fire). Note that F and F/TR class shooters will be accommodated on the correct target during the Mid-Range matches.

Squadding and Scoring: Shotmarker electronic targets will be used up to a limit of four relays. Shooters must provide their own wi-fi enabled device in the form of a tablet or smart phone. All matches will be squadded, and competitors will verify scores for electronic targets and score and pull targets for each other by relays when firing on paper targets or as otherwise directed. All competitors are expected to assist while targets are set up and torn down and to help secure the range after the match as directed by the match director. Competitors refusing to perform these functions without a reasonable excuse will be excluded from CKGC matches in the future.

Convertible sighter shots: At the match director’s discretion, convertible sighters may be allowed during the slow fire prone matches. When allowed, either both sighters or the second sighter may be converted into record shots. Conversion of only the first sighter is not allowed. It is the shooter’s responsibility to inform the verifier if sighters are to be converted.

Block times: At the discretion of the match director, the preparation period and firing period may be combined into a block time of 25 minutes for slow-fire matches. When infiltration firing is used for more than one relay, the block time will be extended as announced by the match director and verifier’s responsibility to ensure that no shooter exceeds the individual time.

Match Director’s Discretion: Special announcements made by the Match Director will govern.

Aggregate Awards: The shooters with the highest total scores for slow fire and rapid fire XTC aggregates for the year will receive a special plaque for those accomplishments to be awarded after final scores are tabulated at the Annual High Power Picnic.

XTC Course of Fire: 80 Shot Regional Match course. (88 shots, 800 points).

Match #1: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, standing slow fire (single round loading) in 22 minutes. Distance is 200-yds using the SR target.

Match #2: 2 sighting shots and two 10 shot strings for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire with 1 reload in 60 seconds. Distance is 200-yds using the SR target.

Match #3: 2 sighting shots and two 10 shot strings for record, prone rapid fire with 1 reload in 70 seconds. Distance is 300-yds using the SR-3 target.

Match #4: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire (single round loading) in 22 minutes. Distance is 600-yds using the MR-1 target.

Match #5: Aggregate of matches of 1 through 4.

“New Shooter” “Fun” Event N.M.C. Course of Fire: If held, schedule to be announced at a later date: 50-Shot 500-point 200-yard reduced National Match Course. Specifically intended as introductory events for “new” shooters but open to all. Expect short delays for explanation of procedures, positions, etc. to new shooters and coaching thereof. Rifles and ammunition will be provided for “new” shooters. This will be a non-approved match.

Match #1: 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, standing slow fire (single round loading) in 12 minutes. Distance is 200-yds using the SR target.

Match #2: 2 sighting shots and one 10 shot string for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire with 1 reload in 60 seconds. Distance is 200-yds using the SR target.

Match #3: 2 sighting shots and one 10 shot string for record, prone rapid fire with 1 reload in 70 seconds. Distance is 200-yds using the reduced-for-distance 300-yard target.

Match #4: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire (single round loading) in 22 minutes. Distance is 200-yds using the reduced-for-distance 600-yard target.

3x600-yd. Mid-Range Course of Fire: Distance will be all 600-yards using the MR-1 target.

Match #1: Unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire, any sight.

Match #2: 2 convertible sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire, any sight.

Match #3: 2 convertible sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire, iron sight only.

Match #4: Aggregate of matches of 1 through 3.

KSRA EXCEPTION: KSRA Mid-Range matches will be 4x600 by adding one additional iron sight only match to the total aggregate (up to 4.5x scope allowed for Service Rifle only).

Special Note for Mid-Range Matches: F Open and F/TR will use the “F” target and may fire scope in all matches. Service Rifle may use any sights authorized under NRA/CMP rules for Service Rifle including up to 4.5x scope for all stages. Match rifle “sling” shooters may use “any sights” for the first two stages but must use iron sights in the 3rd and 4th stages to win. Match rifle shooters using scopes for all stages will shoot “out of competition” only. Except for the unlimited sighting shots in Match #1, sighting shots are “convertible” (both 1st and 2nd sighting shots or only the 2nd may be convertible to record shots but not 1st sighting shot without the 2nd being converted as well; shooter’s responsibility to inform scorer to convert sighting shots before beginning record firing). For matches with more than one relay, infiltration firing will be allowed whenever possible, especially during periods of high heat. AR Tactical Class may use any rifle and equipment authorized under governing body indicated on the calendar.

Special Notice for F Open and F/TR class shooters participating in Mid-Range Matches:

Competitors will need to keep in mind that we are new to this and learning as we go. Your patience will be appreciated. 7-second delay and last shot exposure rules will be followed. Both the CKGC and KSRA Mid-Range match schedules will be submitted to NRA or CMP under their Approved or Registered status as indicated in the match dates section, with scores reported for classification purposes. Please note that muzzle brakes and sound suppressors are not allowed per NRA/CMP rules; we will accommodate any shooter wishing to use a sound suppressor on an “out-of-competition” basis, but the use of muzzle brakes is prohibited.

Practice Nights: 2nd and 4th Wednesday evenings April through October, 5 PM to 8 PM or dark using Shotmarker targets. The 2nd Wednesday is reserved for 200 & 300-yard practice with

special emphasis on Introduction to AR Tactical and the 4th for 600-yards. Contact Dennis Chambers, 620-664-7004 or crtfishing@cox.net.

April Fool's Match Course of Fire: Non-approved with \$15 match fee; expect a variety of target presentations and rates of fire. Know your zeros and bring at least 88 rounds and be ready for most anything. Per special John Heger rule, bring a rifle that runs 100%. Course of fire and special rules will be announced after registration. Whining will not be permitted. Special traveling trophy for the high CKGC member. There may or may not be an April Fool side match for rimfire only after centerfire is completed. If held, entry \$5, and up to 50-rounds, any rimfire rifle and sight and 17-cal will be permitted.

Special Rules for M16A4 "Freedom Cup" Service Rifle Championship Match: This Match will be governed by CMP rules for AR-15 Service Rifle, which allows up to a 4.5x scope. While originally intended for the M16A4-gery clone rifles before scopes were allowed for Service Rifle, now any scoped rifle meeting AR-15 Service Rifle rules will be eligible for the Trophy. Shooters using rifles not in compliance may fire "out of competition" but will not be in contention for the Freedom Cup and their scores will not count toward the Dean Nelson Trophy standings. The Freedom Cup Traveling Trophy will be entrusted to the Match Winner (must be a CKGC member) for the following year. The Annual High-Power Picnic and presentation of the Dean Nelson Trophy will immediately follow the match. This will run concurrently with Day 2 of the CKGC Fall Superlative Service Rifle Weekend.

Awards: Classes will be combined upwards if there are less than (3) entries per class. Awards will consist of recognition only in match results for Match Winner and 1st Place for each classification, in order to justify the pit wall replacement project. See KSRA bulletins for award schedule for KSRA matches.

Food and potable water are not available at the range. Outhouse facilities are provided. It is traditional for the Match Winner to select where we go to lunch after the match.

Ammunition: Shooters firing at 600-yd. targets with .223 / 5.56 mm ammunition must use bullet weights of 68 grains or heavier. Shooters who are unable to hit their target by the 3rd shot will be removed from the firing line. Shooters may only use ammunition that will maintain bullets at supersonic speeds. Shooters will be removed from the firing line for bullets that keyhole at the target because of minimum velocity, or for lack of hits on target. Discretion and judgment of the Match Director as to what constitutes safe and legal ammunition, proficiency, equipment and/or rifles will prevail.

Weather Conditions: Matches will automatically be cancelled in the event of snow or ice hazardous to vehicular traffic. Cancellation in the event of rain will depend upon expected duration and volume; decision for rain cancellation may not be made before registration begins. We will not shoot in lightning or downpour conditions but reasonable delays to wait it out may be experienced. Match director's discretion to arrange for an alternate date in the event of weather cancellation. If the high temperature is forecast to exceed 95 degrees, or if rain is expected to move in, XTC matches may be converted to 58-round 200-yard N.M.C. events and the 3x600 Mid-Range matches may be converted to 2x600 and 22-cal match cancelled.

CMP Approved “Vintage” As-Issued Military Rifle Matches

The James Broadhead M1 Garand Match

The Randy Lawrence Bolt Action Service Rifle Match

GENERAL: Beginning in 2025, these are 55-shot CMP “Games” style matches fired on the 200-yard electronic SR targets and will be CMP approved. Block times including preparation periods for slow-fire stages may be used at the discretion of the match director. Scoped and “unlimited” style rifles may be allowed according to the CMP rule book; Match Director’s judgement as to what constitutes a compliant rifle according to the rule book will prevail.

Course of fire: We will use the CMP As-Issued Military Rifle Course B consisting of:

- 5 Sighting shots and 20 shots for record, slow fire prone in a time limit of 25 minutes.
- 10 Rapid fire prone from standing in a time limit of 80-seconds (no sighting shots).
- 10 Rapid fire sitting from standing in a time limit of 70-seconds (no sighting shots).
- 10 Slow fire standing in a time limit of 10 minutes (no sighting shots).

CMP Scoring and Awards: CMP score cards will be used and submitted to CMP for record purposes and CMP achievement pins will be awarded according to CMP cut scores.

Awards for Broadhead and Lawrence Matches: Shooters using the appropriate *as-issued* rifle for these matches will receive custody of the Broadhead or Lawrence Memorial Plaques for the following year. Must be CKGC member to be eligible!

Rimfire Side Matches

The “Vintage” and “New Shooter” events will be followed by 22-cal any-rifle, any-sight, any-position match at 100-yards, 20 shots for record fired slow fire in time limit of 22-minutes with unlimited sighting shots. Front and rear rests allowed. Block times may be used at the discretion of the match director. Sighters will not be convertible. Note that these will remain 100-yard “walk and paste” events using paper targets.

200-yard 22-cal any-rifle, any sight matches will be fired following the 3x600 Mid-Range matches. These will be similar to the 100-yard match above except these will be pull and mark events using paper targets and target pits. A minimum of two relays will be required. These will be subject to cancellation under adverse heat conditions and will not be held after the KSRA Mid-Range matches.

Entries to the above matches are no charge to all participants.

Special Sighter Side Matches

For an optional \$5 entry fee, shooter’s sighting shots will be recorded with fees split according to the following schedule: One third to high score; one third by drawing; one third to the program. This will be offered at all events except the April Fool, “New Shooter” and Wednesday night practices. For matches with unlimited sighters, if any, only the first two sighters will be recorded for the side match. Money awarded will be rounded off (up or down) to the nearest whole dollar.

THE DEAN NELSON TRAVELING TROPHY

The Dean Nelson Traveling Trophy will be entrusted to the shooter (must be a CKGC member) who has accumulated the most total points of all the CKGC 200/300/600-yard XTC matches thru the annual High-Power Picnic, plus the M1 Garand and Bolt Action Service Rifle matches. Additionally, only scores fired using the appropriate rifle during the M1, BASR and M16A4 matches will count toward the trophy. The 200-yard “fun” matches, Mid-Range matches, the April Fool’s match, and the KSRA matches will not count toward the trophy. The trophy is named for Norman Dean Nelson (1937 – 1997), a member of Central Kansas Gun Club and a fierce Kansas high power rifle competitor for many years. The inscription on the Trophy reads “He was always willing to share his knowledge with others and particularly enjoyed instructing those who showed an interest in high power shooting” which is a masterpiece of understatement. We should all strive to follow his example; very few of us will ever exceed it. Dean has left the range now; we are diminished.

CAMPING OR OVERNIGHT USE OF CLUBHOUSE

Camping and/or overnight use of clubhouse facilities by non-members have not previously been authorized by CKGC Board of Directors. However, CKGC member Daniel Klingensmith has now made arrangements and taken responsibility to provide these amenities for non-members who are participating in scheduled high power rifle matches. For campers, potable water and sanitary hook-ups are not available but electricity is available on a limited basis. The HVAC equipped clubhouse can also be made available for overnight use as a bunkhouse. Bring a cot or be prepared to sleep on the floor. The clubhouse has indoor restroom facilities but no showers. Be aware that alcohol is totally prohibited on club property. Also be aware that Daniel is making this available subject to his being present for on-site supervision, and availability may not be possible if he cannot be present to supervise. PRONE SMALLBORE RIFLE PROGRAM

The following smallbore rifle prone events are also offered at CKGC. These are CMP approved events with scores reported to CMP for classification purposes and for E.I.C. matches, for working toward the CMP Distinguished Rifleman Badge for smallbore rifle. In general, these are 22-cal any rifle, any sight matches fired from the prone unsupported position at 50 and 100-yards on paper targets. 17-cal, 5mm and 22 Magnum not permitted. Registration 8 – 8:45 AM, commence fire at 9 AM. Contact Program Chairman John Heger for more information (see page 5 for contact information).
