Trial Site & Information

The show site is indoors on turf. Please bring your own crate, clean up supplies, & water for your dog.

Clean indoor footwear required to enter the Field House.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, except when in the competition ring. Exercise and toilet your dog in designated areas. Please poop and scoop and use garbage containers on the site. Please be courteous to others using the area.

No aggressive dogs.

A warm-up ring will be provided for all exhibitors.

Registration is required and a fee will apply.

Warm up jumps will be available for all exhibitors without charge.

Trial Site Rules

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s).

Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

This is a NON-SMOKING facility. This is both inside of the building or near the doors.

On-Site Crating

Competitors are encouraged to crate dogs in their vehicles whenever possible. Parking is located immediately next to the building, making the distance from vehicles to the facility very short and convenient. For those who require indoor crating, several options will be available. Locker rooms will be available to rent and can accommodate multiple dogs and crates. These rooms will be rented on a group basis. A large multipurpose room will also be available for rental for crating. In addition, a limited amount of free ringside crating space will be provided. This area is intended for dogs that are comfortable in a busy environment and able to remain quiet and settled. Additional details and pre-registration information for all crating options will become available via the event webpage.



Bitches in Season – Permitted to run!

In season pants/underwear may be worn at handler's own risk. A mat will be made available for use on the start line for BIS. A handler may choose to use the mat, and it is to be used at their handlers' own risk. BIS will run in the scheduled location in the running order; no additional adjustments will be made.

New to 2026



Challenger

Removal of the Challenger Round.

In place of this round, any dog who finishes 1st in their height in ANY individual round (Thursday to Sunday) will earn an automatic Nat. Rd 3 Bye.

* Dogs must be entered in the National Rounds to be eligible.

* Dogs must run National Rd 2 regardless if they earned a Round 3 Bye.

Biathlon

Biathlon Agility will be a progression from Biathlon Jumping.

The top % (TBD) of each height in Biathlon Jumping will move on to Biathlon Agility.

Biathlon Byes can be now be won at Canadian Cups/Classics.

Standard Course Time Calculations

Set at 120% (to 3 decimal points) of the fastest clear round in each class and each height. If no clear rounds, then the fastest 5 fault rounds, followed by the fastest 10 faults, etc. will be used to calculate times. The Standard Course Time (SCT) will be rounded to the nearest whole number. Values of 0.4 and below will be rounded down, while value of 0.5 and above will be rounded up. SCT of 60 seconds will be inputted into the software (ATS) at the start of each event. The SCT will then be manually edited periodically throughout each rotation and finalized at the end of all rotations of a course.

Repeat & Move On

There will be no repeat and move on during all events. At anytime a team determined to be delaying their run to train or repeat a sequence or obstacle, they will be whistled off and must leave the ring. Repetitive incidents of Repeat & Move On by the same handler may be deemed as practicing in the ring. Practicing in the ring is not allowed at this event and may be deemed as unsportsmanlike.

Not For Competition (NFC)

There will be no NFC runs during any event at The Trupanion 2026 Canadian Open.

Delay of Start

The Delay of start rule, based on the most recent UK International Agility Rule book will be strictly enforced.

Starting before the GO/READY

At any time where a team starts their run prior to hearing the GO/Ready from the timer, they will have an automatic elimination score for that run. Teams may run the course, keeping in mind of no NFC and no Repeat & Move Rules.

Event Progression Guidelines

For events that include progression to a second round, specifically the Agility Biathlon and National Rounds (National Round 1 to Round 2, and Round 2 to Round 3), advancement will be determined by a progression percentage cutoff. The exact progression percentage will be announced by **August 19th, 2026**, and will be determined based on entry numbers. In addition to this progression percentage, any team whose course time is within 5% of the fastest dog's course time in that round will also advance to the next round, regardless of faults, even if they fall outside the standard progression percentage cutoff.

For clarity, the fastest dog's course time used for this calculation is simply the fastest raw course time recorded in that round and is independent of faults. This means the time used may not necessarily belong to the winning dog. For example, if the fastest course time in the round carries faults, that time will still be used as the reference time when determining the 5% window for progression. This provision ensures that teams demonstrating competitive speed relative to the fastest performance in the round can continue to the second round of the applicable event.

Running Orders

There will be no reserve seeding running orders, except for the National Round 3 Final, which will be a reserve seeded running order based on the National Round 2 results. Teams who must use their bye to progress to National Round 3 will run first in their height in National Round 3, then following the National Round 2 results, in reserved order.

All running orders will be finalized prior to the event, except for last-minute changes for unforeseen circumstances.



Master Series Last Chance

Open to all dogs who have **NOT** earned a Master Series Final Bye.

Master Series Last Chance consist of 2 rounds, a Jumping Round and an Agility Round. The Last Chance Rounds are for those teams who have not yet earned a Master Series Bye for the 2026 Open Masters Series Final.

Only teams without a Master Series bye may enter the Master Series Last Chance.

There will not be a cash prize for the winners of the Master Series Last Chance. Cash prizes will go directly to the Master Series Final.

Teams who have earned a bye from the Master Series Last Chance heat, will be automatically be entered in the Master Series Final and payment is due on the evening of Wednesday, August 26th, 2026.

Master Series Final

Open all dogs who have earned a Master Series Final Bye. You must enter the same height of which your bye was earned, with only one exception. A dog moving from a regular height to a select height, not the reverse.

Master Series Final consists of 2 rounds, a Jumping Round and an Agility Round.


Only teams who have earned a Master Series Final bye may enter. Those teams who earn a bye from the Master Series Last Chance will automatically be entered in the Master Series Final, payment is due on the evening of Wednesday, August 26th, 2026.

The Master Series Final will follow the Canadian Master Series Tournament Rules, with the exception of earning byes. Winners of the Master Series Final will be crowned the 2026 Master Series Champion and go home with prizes along with the total cash prize collected over the 2025-2026 season, the Master Series Last Chance and the Master Series Final cash prize money. See below for Canadian Master Series Tournament Rules.

Canadian Open Masters Series Rules

The aim of the Masters is to encourage more competitive running in UKI classes and improve the overall standard of top-level agility. The Masters has been created for dogs and competitors whose goal is to compete at both National and International level.

- The Masters is considered one class made up of 2 rounds: an Agility and Jumping round with results combined.
- Entry open to ALL dogs of all levels.



- Separate competition for each jump height.
- Running order for second round will NOT be in reverse order
- Cumulative scoring; dog with the lowest score wins. Faults converted into seconds (5 faults = 3 seconds) and time faults treated the same as course faults but converted on a 1:1 ratio.
- In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Agility round will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the 2nd round course.
- Eliminations will result in 100 faults with a 60-second course time.
- Dogs that score 320 cumulative and over will not be placed nor awarded prize money.
- A no-show in either class will result in a disqualification from the class and therefore will not be eligible individual class placement, overall placement or eligibility to qualify for the Final.

Pain & Longevity CLINIC

Agility Biathlon

The Mancuso Pain & Longevity Clinic Agility Biathlon consists of 2 rounds, Agility Round and a Jumping Round.

Entry is open to all dogs, and guarantees entry into the Jumping round, while the Agility Round is a progression. Byes can be earned by winning any Canadian Biathlon Event at a Cup or Classic, and submitted with your entry. Teams with a bye must run the Biathlon Jumping. The winner of the Biathlon per height, will be named the 2026 Biathlon Champion.

For progression details from the Jumping round to the to the Agility Round see 'Event Progression Guidelines' on the previous pages.

The Agility Biathlon will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level.

Agility Biathlon is scored as a clean 1st event, with time use only as a tie breaker. In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Agility round will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the 2nd rounds course

A no show in either class will result in disqualification from the Agility Biathlon Championship, including prizes and awards.





Speedstakes Challenge

The Sivret Speedstakes Challenge consists of 2 Speedstakes rounds. Open to all dogs, no bye or prequalification required. All dogs entering will run both rounds, and the winner of the Speedstakes Challenge per height will be named the 2026 Sivret Speedstakes Challenge Champion.

The Speedstakes Challenge will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level.

Speedstakes Challenge will be scored as a time plus faults event.

Cumulative scoring; dog with the lowest score wins. Faults converted into seconds (5 faults = 5 seconds) and time faults treated the same as course faults but converted on a 1:1 ratio.

In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Speedstakes Round 2 will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the 2nd round course.

Eliminations will result in 100 faults with a 60-second course time. A no-show in either class will result in disqualification from the Speedstakes Challenge Championship, including prizes and awards.

Games Challenge

Games Challenge consists of 2 rounds, round 1 - Snooker, followed by the final round 2 - Gamblers.

Round 1, Snooker, is open to all dogs without any bye required, however, to progress to the final round 2

Gamblers, you must have progressed through from Round 1, Snooker. Progression % (TBD). Also, those with a Games Challenge Round 2 bye, earned by winning the Pentathlon at a Canadian UKI Classic, will get an automatic entry to Round 2, Gamblers, regardless of their Round 1 score. Teams with a bye must run Snooker. Teams who are tied at the cutoff criteria will all move on. In the event a percentage of dogs is used to progress through to the next round, decimals will be rounded up.

The winner of the Games Challenge per height, will be named the 2026 Games Challenge Champion.

The Games Challenge will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level.

Eliminations (dogs not stopping the timers) will score 0 points with a 60-second course time.

A no-show in either class will result in disqualification from the Championship including prizes and awards.

Cumulative scoring: highest number of points wins with time as tie breaker only. In the event of a tie for the Games Champion, the scores from the Gamblers round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the Gamblers.



Canadian Open National Championship (3 National Rounds)

UKI Canadian Open Championships consist of 3 rounds. Round 1 is a Jumping course, Round 2 & Championship Final Round 3 are Agility courses. The winner of the Championship Final round 3, per height, will be named The Canadian Open Champion. The National Rounds will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level. The National Rounds are scored as a clean 1st event, with time use only as a tie breaker. A no-show in either class will result in disqualification from the UKI Canadian Open National Championship, including prizes and awards.

National Round 1 (Jumping)

Open to all dogs who have **not** earned a bye to round 2 or round 3. The number\percentage of dogs that progress to Round 2, from Round 1, will be decided as entries are finalized. Eliminated dogs do not progress to Round 2 regardless of time.

Teams who are tied at the cutoff criteria will all move on. In the event a percentage of dogs is used to progress through to the next round, decimals will be rounded up.

For progression also see 'Event Progression Guidelines' on the previous pages.

National Round 2 (Agility)

Open to all dogs who have either progressed from Round 1 and those with a Round 2 or Round 3 bye. Dogs with a Round 3 bye will run round 2.

Same as Round 1, a set number of dogs will progress from Round 2 through to Round 3 (excluding those team with an Elimination score). Teams with a round 3 bye will be excluded from the progression criteria and will run in the Championship Final Round 3, regardless of their Round 2 score. Teams who are tied at the cutoff criteria will all move on. In the event a percentage of dogs is used to progress through to the next round, decimals will be rounded up.



National Final Round 3 (Agility)

Open to all dogs who have progressed through from Round 2 and those with a Round 3 bye. Additionally, any dog who finishes 1st in their height in any individual round (Thursday to Sunday), will earn an automatic National Round 3 bye. Dogs must have entered the National Rounds to be eligible, and dogs must run National Round 2 regardless of their earned Round 3 buy.

The winner of the Championship Round 3 will be crowned The Canadian Open Champion.

In the event of a tie, a runoff of the National Round 3 course will decide the winner.

You agree to indemnify and hold harmless UKI and its representatives (including the club/group/ trial organizers, show management) from any claims, including legal fees, arising from injury or damages caused during participation in any event or training.

2. Hazards & Safety

The exhibitor/owner acknowledges all potential hazards associated with the training facility, event, and premises, including but not limited to:

The condition of the grounds; Lighting and security measures (or lack thereof); Electrical appliances and fittings; Parking areas and fencing; The potential for a dog to escape from the training or competition area; The presence of unfamiliar animals and people; The presence of other dogs; Agility equipment; Course design and course set up; The possibility of another ill animal or your own getting ill. The exhibitor and owner assume the risk of any harm arising from any and all of these including allowing their dogs to run wearing collars, stop pad protectors, bitch in season pants, or any similar items.

By entering, you voluntarily assume any and all risks associated with these hazards and any other potential hazards not listed. All participants must exercise caution, monitor their dogs, and clean up after themselves and their animals.

3. Conduct & Enforcement

UK Agility International reserves the right to:

- Excuse any participant for what it deems excessive harshness toward a dog and for behavior considered aggressive or abusive toward another person or dog.
- Revoke, suspend, or ban any entry or membership at its sole discretion if deemed necessary to protect the interests of UK Agility and any of its associates, agents, officers, or members.

Participation in UKI events, including membership, is a privilege, not a right. UK Agility International has full authority to impose suspensions or bans without prior notice.

4. Rules & Regulations

By entering, you agree to comply with all UK Agility International Rules & Regulations, including any amendments. Additionally, you confirm that:

- You will not bring any dog that has been knowingly exposed to an infectious or contagious disease within 21 days prior to the event.
- To the best of your knowledge, your dog is not subject to disqualification under UK Agility International Show Regulations.

BY ENTERING UKI EVENTS, COMPETITORS AGREE TO the following, and the terms and conditions listed on page 5

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all

times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show.

This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page. Each competitor acknowledges through their entry to the UKI event that their participation is a privilege and not a right.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of UK Agility International rules and regulations including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry.

Please ensure to read the move up rules – section 2.0. At a UKI trial where the dog is competing for more than one day and the dog completes the requirements for a level on a prior day, they must move up the following day.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available to view free from the UKI web page. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk and whilst every care will be taken the show management and UKI will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property while at the UKI event.

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete in UKI Trials, with the exception of dogs over 15 calendar months of age eligible to compete in Nursery Classes & Speedstakes classes.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition without refund if it is: suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal or if it is likely to cause itself damage or its welfare is in danger if it continues competing.

It is expressly understood that competitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, will at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. Any competitor or competitor's dog that is dismissed from the show by the judge and or show manager in accordance with UKI rules and regulations will have no recourse to any refund of fees paid such as entry fees, camping fees, crating fees and any other fees associated with the event.

It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Dogs left in hot cars, or dogs appearing to be in distress, will be dealt with as seen fit by the Show Management.

Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the show management reserves the right to appoint another judge.

Should circumstances so dictate the show manager, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary.

Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to UK Agility International. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond our control, the SHOW MANAGEMENT may defray such expenses from the entry fee to cover the cost of the show preparation. These accounts will then be made public.

Rules of Conduct:

UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions including on social media platforms.

By virtue of their entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations and agree to accept any sanctions that are imposed for failure to comply. The judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring. The show officials have responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in a verbal warning, written warning and/or expulsion of a competitor, dog, or any person from the event by conducting the procedure outlined in the UKI rule book. UKI head officials, through further investigation, may impose sanctions including suspension or expulsion from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or trial officials will take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds; actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog; willful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show; any acts of poor sportsmanship; violation of procedural rules; compulsive, correctional training on the grounds; willful misrepresentation on entry forms; willful misrepresentation of animals; dog aggression; failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog including a dog clearly not under the control of the handler; concerns for the welfare of a dog or who is unfit for competing; intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors; creating excessive delays as a failure to respect the authority of event officials.

Social Media Conduct

Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, trial management & staff, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Any of these cases may sanction removal from all associated social media pages and even lead to expulsion of UKI events and even further expulsion of organization membership.

Media & Sponsor Rights Release

Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right. Sponsors of UKI events may email entrants with their product and or service information. If a competitor does not wish to receive emails from these sponsors, they must email the show management before the close of the trial entry date to declare this, ensuring they receive a receipt email that this information has been received by the trial management.
