Our Year in Numbers: GM MIC activity is up 24%
























90% of GM MIC workshops are with primary and secondary school children







GM MIC Workshops Conducted by Borough (Sep 24 – Aug 25)


GM MIC active in all 10 boroughs



Key Initiatives



Being a catalyst for change in the movement from pointed tip knives to blunt end knives within our homes.

Safe Disposal Points

Working alongside the authorities to increase the presence of safe and easily accessible knife disposal points.

Parental Awareness

Increase parental awareness and instilling a greater sense of responsibility through education.

Behavioural Change

Change the way the UK population perceive blunt end knives to obtain wide scale adoption.

GM MIC Plans and Key Objectives 2025/26

Main Objectives

- Maintain at least 200 MIC visits pa
- Secure growth in high school contacts (70:30)
- Increase delivery of Knife Crime C&C 30 schools
- Maintain relationships with existing 1ry schools Y5/6
- Extend reach in Rochdale and Salford
- Collect feedback from schools after each visit
- Develop links with GM community partners

Tactics

- Recruit new 4-5 new MIC presenters at sittings, inductions and via bench chair news
- Update Resources MIC Knives: C&C resources
 Cyberbullying Include law on sharing private images
- Refresh Core Intro and Quiz module
- Partnership working with GMP, VRU, Street Docs, GMFRS
- Use of local court, coroners court to attract more schools
- Appoint a second MIC co –coordinator
- Devolve visit tracking to local leads
- Devise post visit feedback google form for leads to send
- Identify / train local leads for Rochdale and Bury
