Pool Rules

Children 15 and under must be supervised by an adult or a responsible person over 18.

No diving or jumping into the pool.

Inflatable floats and toys require manager approval.

Children under 12 must pass a swim test to access the deep end. Tests are offered in the last 10 minutes of each hour.

The pool will close if lightning or thunder occurs and will reopen 30 minutes after the last thunder or lightning.

No coolers, outside food, or drinks are allowed in the pool area.

No glass is allowed in locker rooms or the pool area.

No animals are permitted in the pool area.

PERSONAL HYGIENE

Shower before entering the pool. Swimming is not allowed for anyone with open cuts, sores, bandages, or communicable diseases.

Children who are not potty-trained must wear approved swimming diapers, available at the concession stand.

ATTIRE

Wear appropriate swimwear suitable for a family environment. Inappropriate attire will result in removal from the pool.

PROHIBITED:

Thongs

Sheer or transparent shorts/tops

Shorts with buttons, snaps,

zippers, or loose threads

Street clothes in the pool

These rules ensure the safety and enjoyment of all patrons. Failure to follow staff instructions or these rules may result in disciplinary actions, including permanent suspension from the pool and other Concord Parks and Recreation facilities.

Pool Parties

POOL PARTY RATES FOR 2026 SEASON

Private Rentals (during closed hours), Fee is \$100 for one hour (City Resident Rate) or \$150 for one hour (All Others) and includes two lifeguards, which safely covers up to 50 guests. Additional lifeguards for numbers over 50 are \$25 for each additional guard per hour; ratio of 1 guard to 25 patrons. Additional facility hours are \$50 (City Resident) or \$75 (All Others) per hour with a 2 hour maximum for private parties.

In addition, a \$50 Refundable deposit required.

Availability depends on the program schedule and current pool usage. Reservations require at least two weeks' notice, with full payment due at booking. Some dates may be unavailable.

ALCOHOL, WEAPONS, ILLEGAL DRUGS, OR SUBSTANCES ARE PROHIBITED ON CITY PROPERTY.

Behavior disrupting facility operations or public safety is not allowed.

Applications are subject to approval or denial by the City.

Affixing materials to walls, floors, ceilings, windows, or light fixtures is not allowed. Decorations must be removed after the event.

SAFETY at the POOL

The McInnis Aquatic Center is compliant with the guidelines expected by the Virginia Graeme Baker Act.

VIRGINIA GRAEME BAKER POOL AND SPA SAFETY ACT

Congress recently adopted the Virginia Graeme Baker Act. Facilitated by the National Swimming Pool Foundation and other professional organizations, all public pools are expected to be compliant with the regulations set forth by the Virginia Graeme Baker Act. This act addresses the danger of patrons becoming eviscerated or entrapped while utilizing pool facilities.

The act states "each pool must be equipped with antientrapment devices or systems that comply with ASME/ANSI A112.19.8 performance standard." The McInnis Aquatic Center is compliant with the guidelines expected by the Virginia Graeme Baker Act. The McInnis Aquatic Center operates a gravity flow system and each drain has been replaced with drain covers that are certified by a pool engineer professional and are deemed unblockable. Safety is our first priority at the pool and with this compliance, we will be able to continue a fun and safe environment.
