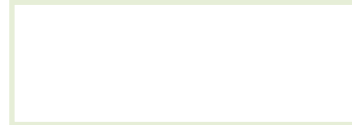

Greetings From Our Pastor

My dear parishioners,

As we move forward with our "Honoring the Past, Securing our Future" Campaign, I think it is important to share with you our early history of Saint Mary Parish –



In this first part of our history, we look from the time our community first started celebrating Mass in Vermilion, to the building of the church and our first renovation of the parish in 1930. The following information has been gathered from our parish records and compiled into one streamlined account.

Vermilion Catholics, considered a station of the Cleveland Diocese, were served by Father Peter McLaughlin in 1842 until 1843, the year it became a station of Chippewa. It was again listed as a station of Cleveland in 1847; little about the area's pastoral care is recorded between 1847 and 1857, when a priest from Elyria began serving settlers by offering Mass in private homes.

The first frame church was constructed in 1862, but lack of funds prohibited the completion of its interior and it was used in that condition with a dry goods box for an altar and rough benches for pews. When Father Louis Molon became pastor of Elyria in 1865, he guided Vermilion Catholics in the completion of the church interior and bought the adjoining lot as the site of the future rectory. The parish house was built in 1870 and has seen two additions since then.

Saint Mary attained parish status in 1871 with Father James Rouchy as pastor, though it continued to struggle. It reverted back to mission status in 1875 until 1879, when a second resident pastor was assigned. In the year 1900 the parish consisted of about twenty-eight families. With the loss of considerable importance as a lake port, Vermilion lost some of its Catholic families, a situation which caused Saint Mary to become a mission church to Huron. The tower bell was added to the church in 1914.

Father Paul's Message Continued...

The Very Reverend Alfred Metzger, from the Huron parish, served Vermilion as a mission, holding Mass at 8:00am on the 2nd and 4th Sundays and Holy days, and 10:00 on the 3rd and 5th Sundays. In the year 1922, according to the decree ceding Huron, Richmond, and Erie counties to the Toledo Diocese, Vermilion became attached to the Toledo Diocese.

On June 28, 1924, the Rev. William J. Cotter arrived at Saint Mary as the first resident pastor in 25 years. This date was also memorable because of a tornado having hit the Lorain and Sandusky areas, causing thousands of dollars in property loss and 85 fatalities. Standing knee-deep in mud from the storm flooding, Father Cotter described his new parish as "a little frame church that looked like Noah's Ark."

By this time, the amount of parishioners had increased to 65 households. The steady increase of lake front cottages made the little frame church inadequate, especially during the summer months. In 1927 plans were drawn for a new church to be made of stone and brick. The cost of building a new church seemed prohibitive and the plans were indefinitely dropped.

Father William Armitage served St. Mary's from 1929 to 1936. He found the church in a very run-down condition, inadequately sized, and no longer a fitting place for the Holy Sacrifice. Through his efforts, several of the parish societies were reorganized and with the cooperation of several of the leading workers of the parish, inaugurated a campaign to remodel the old church. Building experts declared the timbers in the old church in excellent condition; therefore, plans were drawn up for the remodeling and enlarging of the old building. The old edifice, which had stood for half a century facing Exchange Street, had been raised and a basement put under it, now facing Ohio Street. The seating capacity was now 350 persons and the entire interior of the church had been redecorated. By May of 1930, Mass was said for the first time in the new building.

On July 27, 1930, the new building was completely renovated and was blessed by the Rt. Rev. Bishop Stritch. Father Armitage labored zealously and successfully for 6 years tending to the spiritual welfare and financial balance of the parish during the Great Depression. During this time, he managed to pay off approximately \$6000 of church debt. He also introduced Saint Theresa as the secondary patron of the parish. His pastorate ended in the summer of 1936 when he was transferred to Holy Angels in Sandusky, Ohio. Father Armitage returned for visits as late as 1960.

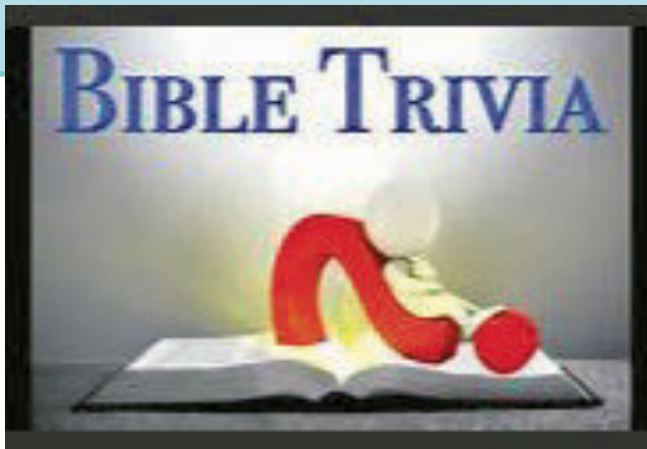

...is a way of giving back to God. We are called to give of ourselves through time, talent, and treasure. By teaching a class, you are able to give of both your time and talent in a very tangible way.

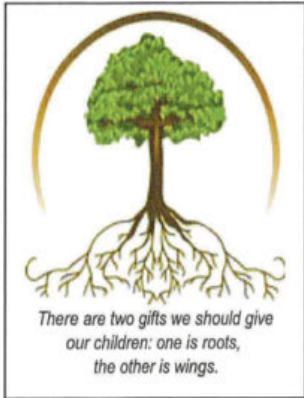

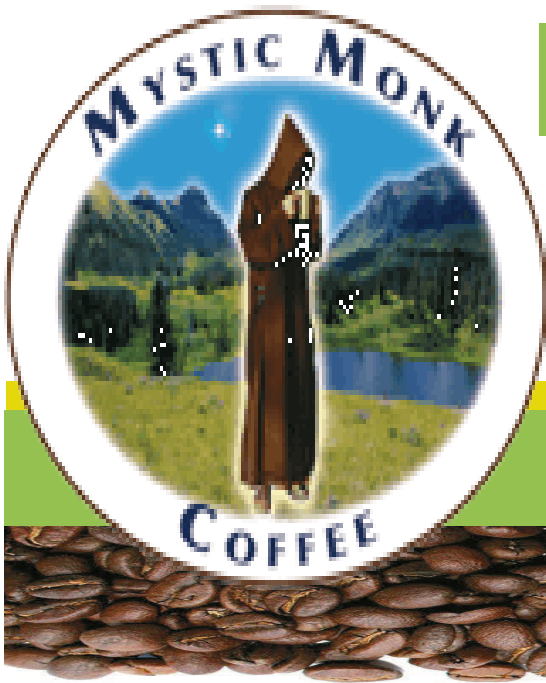
