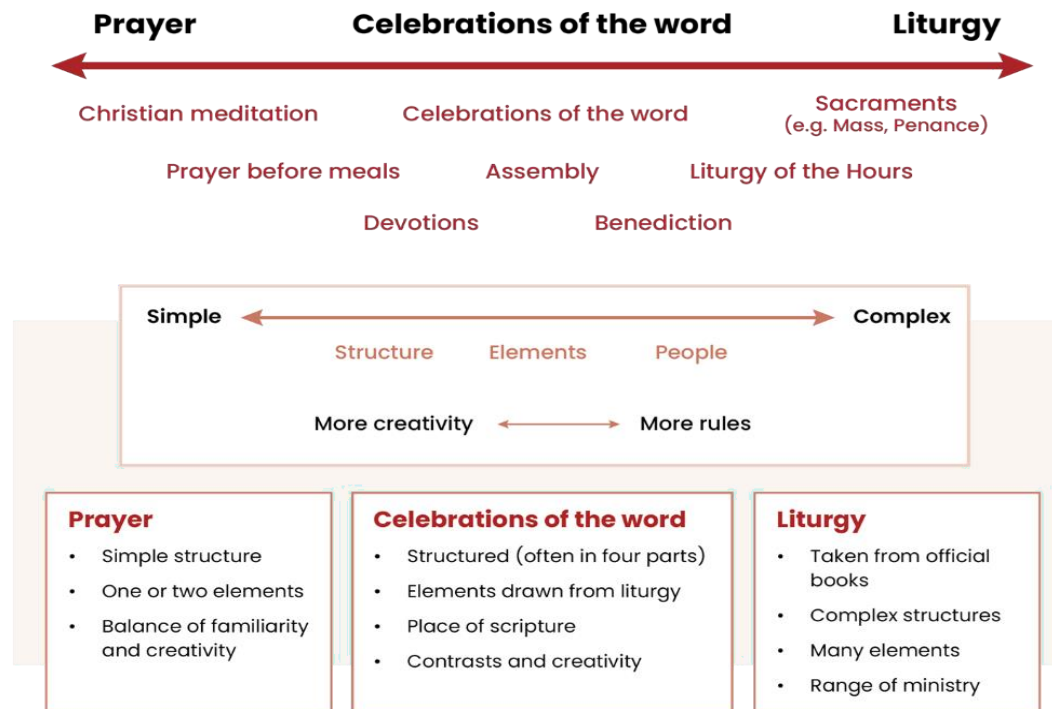

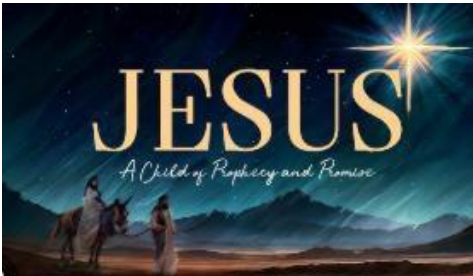

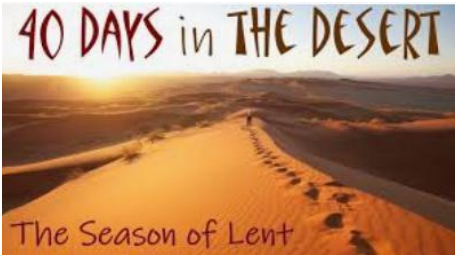

The experiences of prayer and liturgy provided by the school engage pupils deeply and lead them to a full, active and conscious participation. Pupils demonstrate this by, for example, the quality of prayerful silence, their attentiveness and response to prayer and liturgy, and their engagement in communal singing		Appropriate to their age and capacity, pupils have a detailed understanding of the wide variety of ways of praying that are part of the Catholic tradition. This would include, for example, the use of scripture, symbol, silence, meditation, reflection and liturgical music. They demonstrate an excellent understanding of the shape and meaning of the Church's liturgical year and how it is expressed in the prayer life of the school.		Pupils work collaboratively with others, such as teachers, other pupils and chaplains to prepare creative and well- constructed experiences of prayer and liturgy. Due to the school's provision of liturgical formation for its pupils, they can undertake liturgical ministries with confidence, understanding and skill. Pupils have a developed capacity for evaluating the quality of the prayer and liturgy they have planned and can identify how to improve next time.
