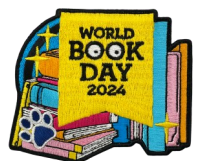

Dear parents and carers,

We have made it to the end of a long and rainy January, but there has been lots going on in school to brighten everyone's spirits! Last week, we held a 'Disconnect to Reconnect' day in school, involving no screens and no lights in lessons to show our care for the world as stewards. Pupils and staff highlighted how calm the day was and how much they enjoyed it! It may have provided an insight for pupils that they can survive without screens! January also highlighted our monthly value of 'empathy' with pupils working hard to understand the feelings of others—a huge congratulations to all of our empathy winners. February will see school focus on 'friendship', as we (alongside our parents) support pupils as they grow into socially aware, kind and responsible citizens of the world.
