Does God's grace prompt you to action or apathy? How should we respond to the grace of God?

We respond rightly to God's grace by heeding its warning, sheltering in its provision, and sharing its blessing.

Costly grace is the treasure hidden in the field; for the sake of it a man will gladly go and sell all that he has...It is the kingly rule of Christ, for whose sake a man will pluck out the eye which causes him to stumble, it is the call of Jesus Christ at which the disciple leaves his nets and follows him...Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow, and it is grace because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner.

Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of his Son: "you were bought with a price", and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is grace because God did not reckon his Son too dear a price to pay for our life, but delivered him up for us. Costly grace is the Incarnation of God.
