

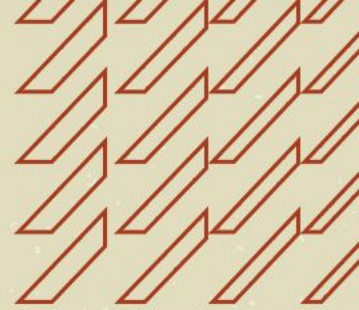


Melted Hearts and a Scarlet Cord: Salvation Extended to All Nations

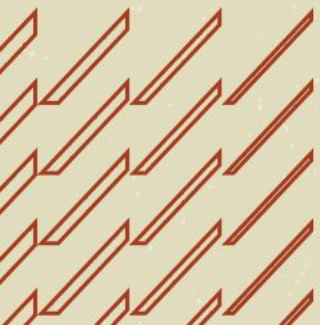
Joshua 2:1-24

Then the whole community broke into loud cries, and the people wept that night. All the Israelites complained about Moses and Aaron, and the whole community told them, “If only we had died in the land of Egypt, or **if only we had died in this wilderness!**”





Hebrews 11:31 - By faith Rahab the prostitute welcomed the spies in peace and didn't perish with those who disobeyed.

James 2:25-26 - In the same way, wasn't Rahab the prostitute also justified by works in receiving the messengers and sending them out by a different route? For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead.



Exodus 15:14-16

The peoples have heard; they tremble; pangs have seized the inhabitants of Philistia. Now are the chiefs of Edom dismayed; trembling seizes the leaders of Moab; all the inhabitants of Canaan have **melted** away. Terror and dread fall upon them; because of the greatness of your arm, they are still as a stone, till your people, O Lord, pass by, till the people pass by whom you have purchased.
