

## 2025-2026 Stitch-Along: Folk Art














Join us for a stitch-along, inspired by Nordic folk art. A stitch-along is a mystery cross-stitch pattern where new parts of the design are released each week. Every Sunday, we send you the next piece until you have a completed pattern. This is an asynchronous program where everyone stitches at their own pace.

### Materials List

**Fabric** – Begin your project by purchasing 14 count Aida cloth, at least 14"x12". The pattern is 168 stitches wide and 138 stitches high and the final product will measure 12"x9.86" with 14 count. You are welcome to use other count Aida, but will need to do the conversions yourself. You can choose your Aida color, but we recommend avoiding green or blue fabric.

**Thread** – The pattern uses DMC embroidery floss. You can find these at a store like Michaels. Each floss color has a corresponding number. The numbers below are based on using 3 threads, but you may use as many threads as you prefer. [If you cannot find any of the colors, you can find substitutions here.](#)

Purchase 1 skein each of these colors:

Purchase 2 skeins of this color:

**Needle** – Use a tapestry needle, size 24-26.

**Hoop** – A hoop is not a requirement, but can be very helpful. Any wood or plastic hoop 5"-10" will work. You can move the hoop around your fabric when focusing on different areas of the pattern.

**Scissors** – Sharp scissors are best, but any scissors will do.
