- Staff Institute Day went very well. The customer service training in the morning was well presented and well received by staff. While I consider EPL staff to be excellent stewards of great service, it is always good to hear from others about techniques they use to elevate the customer service experience and help both patrons and fellow staff members feel even more valued.

After lunch, staff participated in a team-building exercise that provided an opportunity to interact with staff from different departments. These exercises are always popular and help staff build connections with other team members.

All in all, it was a wonderful day and a great opportunity for staff to learn, connect, and have some fun together.

- We had another tornado warning this week, making this the third time this season that we've had to shelter in the basement with patrons. The Library was especially busy this time, as the warning occurred on a Tuesday during storytime. There were approximately 80 children and caregivers in storytime alone, in addition to everyone else in the building.

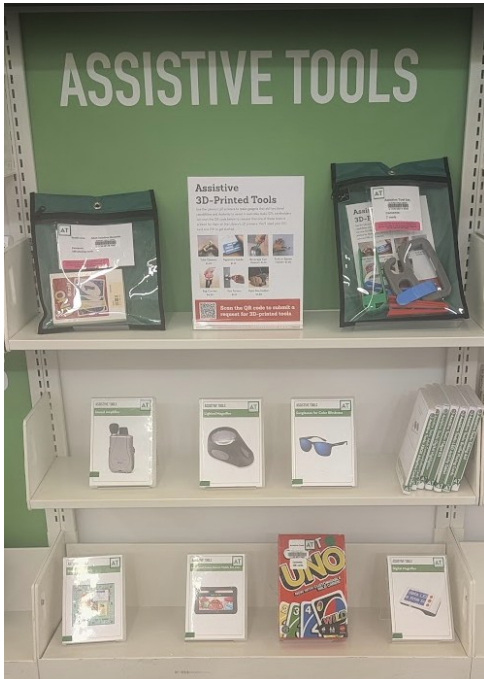

## Outreach to the Indigo of Elmhurst

Hayley Rightnowar and Rachael Mason teamed up for an outreach visit to the Indigo Memory Care Facility where they ran a requested Christmas in July program as part of the Indigo's ongoing week of Christmas themed activities.

### Programming

July began and ended with celebrations. At the start, we wished a Happy 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday to America with a variety of activities. Kids made a fun patriotic themed hat, took a short quiz to test U.S. history knowledge, measured their wingspan compared to an American Eagle, put together a floor puzzle of the United States, and a completed a special patriotic scavenger hunt.



The month ended with the Summer Reading Wrap Up Party, which included a concert by Miss Jamie on the Farm, face painters, a temporary tattoo station, a scavenger hunt, crafts, the prize wheel, and delicious cookies. We had a great group of both middle school and high school volunteers, which helped the event go smoothly.

The Summer Reading Program officially ended on July 31, but we continued to have a few check-ins through August 10. A total of 2265 children read for 10 days and 1580 completed the whole program. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive with patrons liking the prizes, the re-designed reading log, and the many registered and passive programming options on offer.

### Community Connections

Twenty curious K-2<sup>nd</sup> graders learned about the importance of bees during the Pollinator Power program on July 9. Roger Law, a regular storytime attendee and local bee keeper, brought in some bees, handed out wax straight from the comb, and even let the kids taste some honey. Law has experience with this age group and did an amazing job.



## Middle School Volunteers

There was great middle school engagement at the library this summer. In July, 55 volunteers worked for 243 hours staffing the summer reading program desk, assisting with storytimes and other programming, and completing clerical tasks such as sticker cutting and booklist folding. Nearly half of these volunteers attended the volunteer wrapup party, where they had a great time eating pizza, playing games, and doing crafts.

## Back to School with Camp Kinder

Camp Kinder had a record 22 kids registered this year with an average of 19 attending each of three days. Each day is designed to help the kids practice the classroom skills they would be expected to have in Kindergarten. There are two pretend “field trips” to practice lining up and walking quietly, as they would have to do in school hallways, going outside for our nature scavenger hunt and on a behind-the-scenes tour of Circulation. The camp also covers classroom etiquette such as raising hands before talking, sneezing in your sleeve, and asking to go to the bathroom. A carefully curated Kindergarten readiness packet went home on the first day, providing additional materials to review and practice skills.

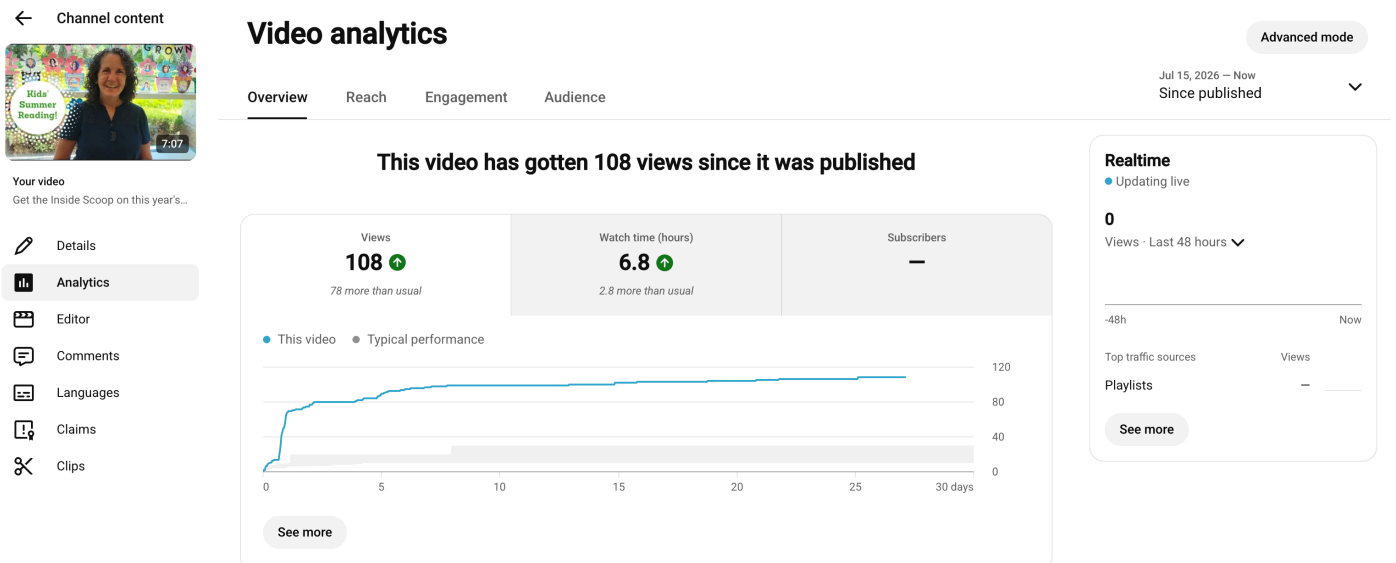

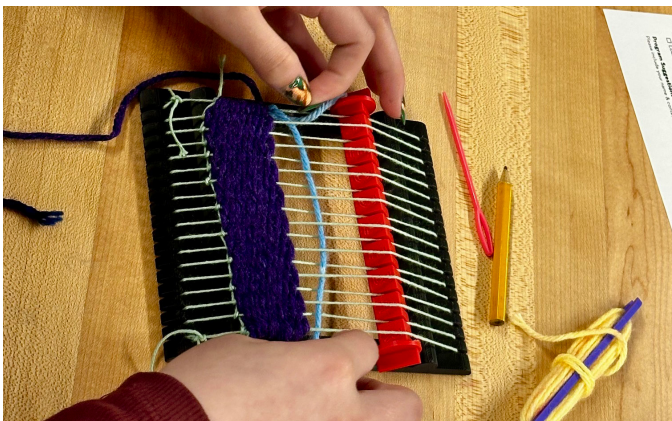

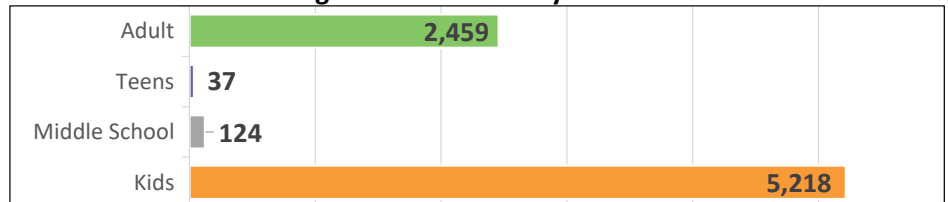
