NOTE ON MINISTRY AT PCC

From Church Council Chair, John Marshall

The Peacham Congregational Church is in transition, following Sonia's decision to step down, and although a challenging time, the Church has a great future (as Sonia said in several excellent services during December). Our transition presents an opportunity to think about the Church and its Mission Statement and engage with our community about the Church's future.

In the absence of a called pastor, the Church Constitution requires appointment by the Council of a Search Committee consisting of 3-7 Members of the Church (including not more than two Associate Members), which the Council will take up at its next meeting set for February 25th. I recommend that the Council give the committee a broader mandate: not only search for a pastor deliberately, but also engage congregants and our community, asking what should the Church be going forward.

To begin, we have scheduled an informal meeting, open to all in the community, at the Meetinghouse on January 28th at 11 am. We will discuss the aspirations of congregants and others in the greater Peacham community for the Church, including whether the church should be "open and affirming": who should lead worship services and other spiritual activities during the transition as well as long-term, including pulpit supply and the possibility of an interim pastor; whether the Church should be allied with other churches, including those in the area looking for pastors, those with settled pastors, and associations like the UCC; and what should be the role, contribution and expectations of lay leaders and all church members during the transition and going forward.

As we transition in the absence of a called pastor, the Deacons have, under our Constitution, full responsibility for the spiritual welfare and ministry of the Church. The Deacons also have authority for pastoral supply, and they have accordingly taken the lead in planning and scheduling services led by guest pastors, lay speakers, and congregants (for the immediate future)—based on the flexible approach developed during Sonia's sabbatical last October—the details of which services appear below (and can be found on the Church Calendar at our website).

I close by emphasizing again that we have a meaningful opportunity, during this time of transition, to plan a great future for the Church as it enters the next chapter of its 230-year history.

GIFTS TO CARE FOR THE CHURCH AND THE MEETINGHOUSE

Over seventy years ago long-time Peacham resident Mrs. Lou Harvey Sargeant (1860-1935) made out her will to benefit her immediate family and, in the future, to benefit the Peacham Congregational Church and the Peacham Academy Alumni Association, in the name of her parents and her husband's parents. For many years local trustees – most recently Ms. Mary Farris (thank you Mary!!) – administered the funds, and the Church received some interest annually.

Just before the end of 2023 the Church was informed that the Probate Court in St. Johnsbury had agreed to dissolve the trust, providing about \$35,000 as a gift to the Church. Following the Church policy relating to gifts exceeding \$1,000 established by the Business Committee, the bulk of these funds will be split between the Olive M. Cheney Capital Fund, and the Endowment Fund. We are of course very grateful for the thoughtful foresight of Mrs. Sargeant, and will announce measures to be taken in honor of her memory, and that of the Harvey and Sargeant families.

The Church hopes that all its members and supporters are aware of Planned Giving opportunities that can benefit the Church or the Meetinghouse in the future. Details about making such bequests to support Church activities, Meetinghouse preservation, or related special areas of interest are on our webpage.

In addition, current tax laws make it easy for you to support the Church and the Meetinghouse through a traditional or Roth IRA. If you are 70 ½ or older (traditional IRA) or 59 ½ (Roth IRA), you can make tax-free contributions from your IRA to non-profit organizations of your choice. Simply have your IRA administrator direct a distribution in the amount you choose to the Peacham Congregational Church, which will not be subject to income tax. And your distribution can be set as either a one-time or recurring gift.
