best to you; wait until you have weaned him; only may the LORD establish his word." So the woman remained and nursed her son until she weaned him.—1 Samuel 1:21-23

Hannah sought the Lord. She takes initiative to seek God's guidance and act independently from her husband to fulfill her own vow. She sought God's direction for her own life and the life of her son, and she moves in obedience.

❖ What do you make of Elkanah's response to Hannah's vow?

And when she weaned him she took him up with her, along with a three-year-old bull, an ephah of flour, and a skin of wine, and she brought him to the house of the LORD at Shiloh. And the child was young. Then they slaughtered the bull, and they brought the child to Eli. And she said, "Oh my lord! As you live, my lord, I am the woman who was standing here in your presence, praying to the LORD. For this child I prayed, and the LORD has granted me my petition that I made to him. Therefore I have lent him to the LORD. As long as he lives, he is lent to the LORD." And he worshiped the LORD there.

—1 Samuel 1:24-28

Hannah worships. Hannah fulfills her vow and she initiates the worship.

Who is the "he" that worshiped? There are a couple of possibilities.

Assignment

Perhaps you know what it feels like to be oppressed, to be looked down on. Though we may not like being labeled as inferior, sometimes we find safety in the lack of expectations. If we are honest, we must admit that it is hard work to swim upstream. If no one really expects much from us, we do not have to risk the potential for failure.
