DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS SUNDAY SCHOOL will be held in the

fellowship hall. There will be two video series. The first one will be **“You Are Never Alone; Trust in the Miracle of God’s Presence”** by Max Lacado.

(Dismiss loneliness from your life! Beloved and best-selling author Lucado helps you realize Jesus walks beside you through your storms; recognize you're never without hope or strength; believe the Lord is an ever-present source of help; and dwell in the grace of the cross, the miracle of the empty tomb, and the assurance of restoration power.)

The second video will be **“Seeing God as a Perfect Father”** by Louie Giglio.

(Do we imagine God as a rough ruler demanding obedience, a coach with high expectations, or a virtual assistant ready to help as a last resort? Louie invites us to consider God in a different way: as a perfect Father who wants us to live under the waterfall of his blessing. He points us to a God who is not absent or ambivalent, but available and affectionate, ready to shower us with his approval and love. How is the way that we see God influencing what we feel about his character? How do our perceptions of God’s perfection create our misperceptions of His care for us? Is our relationship with our earthly father creating distance in our relationship with God as our Father? How would our lives be different if we truly were able to see God as a perfect father?)
