

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Beginning this Wednesday, the Cardinals of the Church will begin voting to elect a new pope. This event is called a Papa; Conclave. There are 252 cardinals, of whom 135 are younger than 80 and are eligible to vote. In order to be elected, it is NOT a simple majority. Two-thirds of cardinals will need to vote in a new pope.

How long will it take?

Pope Francis was elected in just two days after five voting sessions. That is rather quick. Pope Benedict XVI was also elected after just two days and four ballots.



A new regulation was put into effect in recent times, and if after 33 votes (which would take 13 days), a runoff between the two leading candidates would be held. So, it probably wouldn't go longer than two weeks at the most.

It probably won't take that long, though, at all. The two longest conclaves in recent history lasted just five days. Pope John Paul II was elected in two days as well.

So, what direction will the Cardinals go?

There are many names that have been mentioned. There are "celebrity" candidates and "dark Horse" candidates. Some may be well-known, and some will be little known. Some will be considered "liberal" or "conservative" by the media.

In any case, don't listen to prognosticators. Everyone who knows the Vatican or the inside-Church world has a favorite. But they don't really have an informed opinion on who will win. There are 135 cardinals, of whom many are new, and are from places far and wide.

Pope Francis made a concerted decision to appoint Cardinals from all over the world, which is awesome, because the Church is world-wide. But it is hard for the Cardinals to know each other that way. In previous times, when most Cardinals were from Italy and Europe, they all knew each other (or about each other). That is not the case now.

In fact, the Cardinals voted to start the conclave later this year because they needed the time to get to know each other better.

You may think that because 80% of the voting-age cardinals have been chosen by Pope Francis, that the next pope will be like

Francis. It is possible, but it is also possible that he is different. In fact, ALL of the cardinals who elected Pope Francis were chosen by either Pope Benedict (67 of them) or Pope JPII (48 of them). Most would consider Francis very different from those two popes. So the makeup of the electorate does not necessarily mean that the next pope will be one way or the other.

Pray, Hope, and Don't Worry

The popular phrase of St. Padre Pio is probably really good here. The Church will be shepherded by a new vicar of Christ in a few days, and we will all pray for him at Mass every day. It will become as familiar as, "Francis, our Pope, and Timothy, our Bishop."

That pope will be OUR pope. He will be our brother. He may test us, he may challenge us (he better!), and he may upset us at times. But he will lead us to Jesus Christ, and that is his only role!

Here is a great prayer for the Conclave:

Heavenly Father, we pray in union with the whole Church for the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Cardinals. May the Princes of the Church listen attentively to Your Spirit during the Conclave. Almighty God, we pray that the conclave brings us a Pope who pleases You by guiding Your Church to grow in faithfulness to You. We pray together with the intercession of our Mother Mary and all the Saints. Please Lord, protect and guide your Church during this time of transition.

We are so grateful for all of those who worked so hard during this Lent and Easter to make all of our Masses and liturgies so awesome.

In addition, thank you to all Altar Servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and all those who helped serve our Masses. We are grateful for your time and service to Jesus and His people! Happy Easter!




