A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the evenings, when I eat dinner, I tend to eat very late. And while I eat, I like to watch a show on TV. By this point, most baseball games are over, so I can't watch my Pirates lose!

So I tend to watch older shows. I grew up watching "Classic TV," like "I Love Lucy," "Columbo," and other shows like that. I still watch them, even though I've seen those episodes several times.

Those TV shows were watched by most of the country at the time they were originally aired. "I Love Lucy," at one point, had 92% of the country tuned in to the show. That's unbelievable! Everyone in the country would watch something, and then talk about it the next day. It brought us together because we had stuff in common.

Today, no TV shows are watched by even a fraction of that number. We, as a people, are so fragmented in our viewing and other interest habits, that we have less and less in common, and less to talk about. In fact, this has led us to separating into small groups of people who agree on politics or sports or something else. We have nothing to bring us together.

When I was on vacation in Rome, though, I felt something I didn't feel in a long time. It was unity.

On the Feast Day of Sts. Peter and Paul, I attended Mass in St. Peter's Basilica with Pope Leo, many cardinals, bishops, and about 15,000 other people. It was glorious. There was the Church, together. Most of Mass was in Latin, because the languages spoken by people in the basilica probably numbered over 200. We were brought together to receive the Body of Christ as the Body of Christ! What a great gift. The Mass always brings us together.

Then, after, we walked outside of the basilica into the square, and Pope Leo prayed the Angelus with us and then spoke for a few minutes, welcoming all of us. He called out about 40 countries who might be present, and the people cheered from those countries when he called out their name.

All those countries, all those people. So many different languages. So many different clothing preferences. So many different backgrounds. All united in Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church. A Church that is worldwide. A Church that is from Jesus himself, and the people in that square were professing the same Faith that Jesus handed to Peter and Paul 2,000 years ago! I got chills thinking about it there in the square.

A woman from London was standing behind me as we waited for the Pope to appear. She was not Catholic, but she and her husband had just come to Rome for the weekend, just to sightsee. They just happened to be in the square, but she asked me what so many people were waiting for.

I told her that we were waiting for the pope. She got so excited. She started to cry, thinking about how lucky she was to be present. When the pope came out, he spoke in Italian. We could hardly see him, he was so far away. Many of us didn't understand a word. Yet all of us felt such a joy, and so connected to each other. We were so lucky to be there, together.

At the end, she thanked me and said she was so blessed to be a part of this. I felt thankful, too. THIS is the Church of Jesus: a unity. This sense of unity is what He desired. It attracts others, even non-Catholics. A unity that is not seen anywhere else in the world is available in the Catholic Church.

We are so blessed to be a part of this Church. Let us live as a unity with our brothers and sisters, so that others don't have to go to Rome to feel this. They can feel it right here in Middletown! That's a great challenge, but also how we are called to live as Catholics!
