We are quickly winding down the "school is out" part of summer, and I'm kind of sad about it. I love when our kids are back in our school, because I get to see them and interact with them much more. But the less crazy days of summer are always nice. I hope your family enjoyed them a bit!

But we are leaving the "less crazy" days behind. We have a ton coming up in our parish these next few weeks and months, and please mark your calendar!

- Sunday-Tuesday, Sept. 14-16: Forty Hours! Adore the Lord in the Eucharist! We'll have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for 40+ hours (including overnight) on these days, starting after our 10:30AM Sunday Mass. Please sign up! In addition, Bishop Gainer will preach our Mass on Sunday night and services on Monday and Tuesday. Please join us for these three awesome days!

He wrote this about why he loves being Catholic:

- 1. Because we're universal: you can go to Mass anywhere in the world and have a sense of what is going on. Not many churches can say this!
- 2. Because we're built on such a solid foundation: we're not just built on the words found in the Bible, but on traditions and church teaching that has been passed on before the Bible was even canonized. I love that we cherish things not just written down, but shared and expressed and lived together over the years. It's like family memories.
- 3. Because of our history: we can trace the roots of our church all the way back to St. Peter, our first Pope. I love that it's stood the test of time! It's not just a fad, it's here to stay forever.
- 4. Because our church fathers and saints are so incredibly smart: I love that everything we believe is so well thought out. So many of the saints and church fathers have thought through so many of the deepest questions about our faith, about how we ought to live, and how we can be good people. If you really get in the weeds of philosophy and theology, there is so much, and it can exhaust you. I love being Catholic because we have so many great thinkers on our side (whose ideas are super formidable when put to the test in a debate!), like St. Thomas Aquinas. Being Catholic can be made simple because our church fathers and saints have deeply explored/investigated the most complex aspects!
